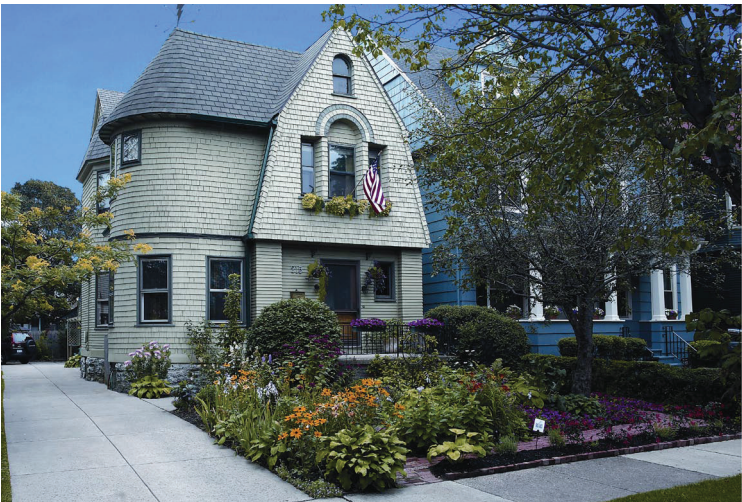




Garden Walk Set For July 27 & 28

Rocket Man choked down his distaste for “The Show” Saturday, helping grandson Clark, 10, to his major-league debut. Fourteen hours later, they decided that even as mediocre a team as the Blue Jays deserves a better city than Toronto.

They crossed the Rainbow Bridge, the agent wondering at Clark’s governmental pedigree – residence, Summerhill; address, Locke; phone number, Sempronius; school, Groton. Actually, they’re all one crossroads location. “Perfect,” said she.

They blasted off for Appleby, around the corner from Hamilton, where GO Trains depart every half-hour, even on weekends. A roundtrip for two cost \$18 for two, but nobody collected them. Rocket Man learned later it’s an honor system, rarely checked. Three hours before game time, it was a rolling nest of Blue Jay fans of every feather.

Toronto Union personnel directed us to the “skywalk,” a plywood maze of construction sites and pipe dreams. Twice we had to reverse field through a “pedestrian detour.” Even for a

kid who gets on base a lot, it was a long hike.

Outside the Rogers Center, a scrumptious hot dog cost a mere \$4 with all trimmings (post-game, \$3) and then we were in, roof open, a new experience for Rocket Man, who has beheld two games under cover there.

The CN Tower loomed like a gigantic croquet stake. Pizza, popcorn and two drinks cost \$20 and an usher rushed in to help ferry it, flatly refusing tip. With R. A. Dickey hurling, prospects for history seemed high.

Those crashed with a first-pitch single and the Twins sautéed the Jays 6-0. Still, the game had its wonders. Jay Jose Reyes was picked off so thoroughly that he almost fell to the ground laughing. Each center fielder doubled a runner off first. Twin center fielder Aaron Hicks made three spectacular catches, none to be mentioned in later accounts.

Post game, we walked to the Spadina trolley line, anticipating a ride to the ferry landing. Construction blocked the rails. A tortuous bus ride took us within “walking distance” of the boat but when we asked for on-ground directions, we were actually laughed at, feeling like Reyes. Later, trudging four blocks back to Union Station, we found not one viable restaurant, instead settling for Tim Horton’s (Clark was thrilled, especially by the “Blue Jays” donut. Don’t ask.)

Homeward bound we fell in with a Hamilton dad piloting three sons, 8, 9 and 11. Rocket Man asked if he’d like to fill his straight with Clark. They all got to playing some hand-slap game while the elders pondered the mindset of gorgeous young thing 22 or so who rode 35 minutes without one hint of any personal happiness.

US Customs asked more questions about Rocket Man’s vessel than about us and we were home. Base Paths said he’d return to Toronto when they finish building it. Clark said he can’t wait that long.

We found a nice cottage in Angola, near the beach with a lot of room. So we would rent that for a week and we began our yearly reunion there. The only problem we faced was it had one bathroom for 18 people. Just a problem in the morning, as the rest of the day offered the outdoors.

Again as we continued to grow the cottage was no longer sufficient. Along with the spouses, too many little ones appeared on the

scene. We needed a bigger boat. We found a place in Pennsylvania called McKeevers which is a kind of outdoor camp with sleeping quarters and the meals supplied. We had as many as 75 attend one year with room for plenty more. Just for the weekend, starting Friday thru Sunday, and that is plenty long enough. Again each year we would welcome the new additions to the family and see the little ones grow.

This was great and had worked for a while until my brother in law was unable to travel. So now we make the yearly reunion where he is. He is another story. He was given two months to live last July as his body was loaded with cancer. This past weekend he took us to dinner and drove his own car, a year later. The doctors feel it is a miracle and he is an in-

spiration and gives hope to the terminally ill.

This year we chose this particular weekend to go down there as it is one of the biggest days of the year in Orville, Ohio. A festival in the park with 60 girl's softball teams playing for the state championship, followed by gigantic fireworks. Now this is real small town Americana. I would guess everyone in Orville and the surrounding small towns were in attendance. Not only was the park full but the traffic after the fireworks was like Rich stadium letting out after a Bill's game. The house we were at was directly across the street from the park so we had easy access to walk there. We watched the fireworks from his front lawn, and then watched with interest the gridlock of traffic following the show. These

small town drivers probably never experience backups like this.

All in all, it was a great weekend, seeing all these nice people again with wonderful hospitality. I say nice and I really mean it. They are so laid back and nothing seems to bother them. Even in the traffic jam, I watched people sit for 20 minutes in the same spot without a whimper. No horns blowing, no tempers flaring, no one cutting anyone off. It was amazing as I have been in Rich stadium traffic after a game. They actually get out and fist fight. Not here in Orville, Ohio. Seems no one gets mad at anyone. I felt so out of place! Wish I could bring some of that small town love back to Buffalo.

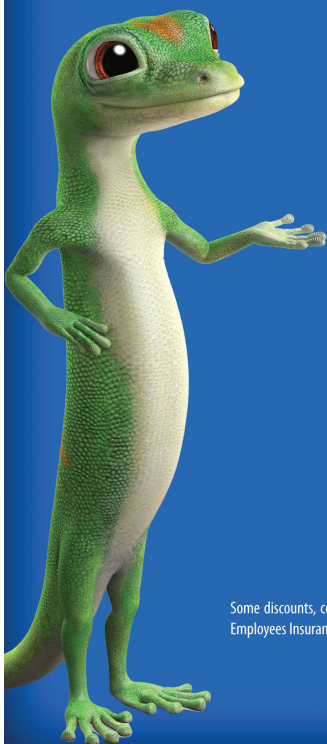

Little Big League!

The City of St. Louis may seem like a great distance for most kids today here in WNY. But for 12 year old Esteben Hernandez, of the Cardinals, in the Major Division of the Hertel North Park Youth Baseball League (HNPY-BL) his shirt tells us that the team is close to his heart.

Monday night, after 8:00 pm, Hernandez tried to rally the Cards to a win over the Cubs. The Cubs!

A team notorious for finishing in last place for years in the Big league NL Central. But in HNP, anything's possible. The Cubs have struggled this year to win games. The

Cards have always been the better team.

But on this night, under four light towers shining down brightly, Hernandez is just an example of how good little league baseball can be, even in North Buffalo. The Cubs built an 11-0 lead after three innings and hung on to defeat the Cardinals, 13-10. Both teams are struggling to finish the regular season strong and with playoff positions on the line, a game under lights makes for great baseball.

"I just try to keep the ball in front of me out there in the field," said Hernandez after the game. "The lights make it harder but you

still have to keep your eyes on the ball." He did, going two for three, scored a run and had two RBI's.

By the time you read this, two more teams will have played under the lights in Shoshone Park. The Dodgers squared off against the Reds Tuesday night and with some make up games left to be played, teams get ready for the playoffs. The Yankees, Tigers, Athletics and Twins round out the division and for a lot of former players, the highlight of their Little League experience has been these games under the lights.

Sunday, the Nine and Under North Buffalo Babe Ruth Travel Team won the Clarence League B Title over the Lewiston Porter Lancers 16-6 in Clarence. Down 4-0 after the first inning, the team battled back and broke a 6-6 tie, scoring ten runs in the third inning to take the championship game. Connor Keifer pitched two solid scoreless innings in relief and was

helped out defensively by shortstop Nathan Sommer, first baseman Liam Myers and outfielder Jeremy Kozak.

"Every kid got on base with a hit and made plays in the field," said associate coach Jim Kozak afterward. "We had faced them earlier in the season in a travel game and they took it to us pretty good. Our guys must have remembered, cause they just exploded, scoring off of big hits and showing people how good a City league from North Buffalo can be."

Congratulations to Hertel North Park Girls who were recently named All-Western New York and named to the first and second teams of the City Thompson Trophy Division. They are pitcher Samantha Ciaco and 3B Brianna Flynn of City Honors, catcher MacKenna Davis and outfielder Jessica Carey of Buffalo Arts on the First Team.

The Second team has Julia Panepinto, Jenna Balducci and Ariana Rodriguez from City Honors and Megan Fitzpatrick from DaVinci. Two other girls were named Honorable Mention. Heather Hastings of Hutch Tech and Caitlin Mudra from City Honors. Also, Brianna Christopher, a stalwart athlete for years here in HNP made third team as a Sophomore for Kenmore West in the Niagara Frontier Division.

According to HNP Girls Division Head Scott Galivan, North Buffalo has much to be proud of as "tons of girls" have made these lists over the years since he's been involved four years ago, and expects to have many more named in years to come.
