'The Fox On The Fairway'

If "The Fox on the Fairway" were a golf player, rather than a golf play, it would be John Daly, big, bold, loud, swinging from the back tees. often out of bounds, not always a winner but frequently entertaining, a dubious ambassador for the greatest game ever played.

The proudly randy Pamela, played in a deliciously enthusiastic Jamie Lee Curtis style by Lona Geiser, compares golf to sex, as "something you can enjoy without doing it well," recalling Woody Allen's wry "bad sex is the second best thing in the world."

But playwright Ken Ludwig's par-six farce at Kaleidoscope Theatre has a hitch in its swing. If Ludwig knows much about country-club golf, he hides it well. Therefore, the target audience is asked to suspend disbelief like a Titleist stuck up a tree, while outsiders will have confirmed for them the awful reality of the recent trial involving a high-powered doctor and a

waif on a skateboard.

"Fox" involves a huge wager on an inter-club championship, which seems to start out as team play and winds up as a head-to-head match. Almost all of it takes place off stage while connivers Bingham and Dickie Bell treat the rulebook like a work of fiction. Rings plunge down toilets, land swindlers deal, precious vases fly through the air and characters disclose hidden talents, as if Ludwig deliberately wrote himself into bad lies just to test his recovery shots.

Keith Wharton, directing in the comfortable Medaille College Lecture Hall theater, has a terrific sixsome whom Rocket Man handicapped as having far more talents than the playwright himself, at least in this instance. (His works include the far better "Lend Me a Tenor" and "Moon over Buffalo"). Wharton's exaggerated set, especially the Fuccillo-sized golf clubs, suggests he knows the course.

Geiser is simply a roaring hoot, yet comes closest to creating the plausible character that slamming-door farce demands. Thomas LaChusia – actually, her husband, which excuses some of the touchier clinches - plays the host Quail Valley president with the antic desperation of a serial loser. Geoff Pictor and Kelsey George Mogenson play the hyper-active young lovers, she in particular an eyeful with the contours of a double-dogleg par four.

Monish Bhattacharyya brings the golfiest look to the visitor from Crouching Squirrel, but his game needs a touch of the sinister. Shayna Raichilson-Zadok plays through like a power cart, so vigorously flogging her errant spouse with a newspaper as to simultaneously invoke both the First and Second Amendments.

They take a mulligan for a curtain call, replaying the round in two minutes, mime on steroids. Beth and Sherri Gerardi's daring wardrobe design honors the playwright's description of golf as a game for the unfashionable. SEVEN ROCKETS (out of ten), through Sept. 29, Fridays and Saturdays at 7:30 with a 2 p.m. tee time for this Sunday.



By the time all this went through my mind, I was long past her and would have had to make a U turn on Main to go back. So I went along my merry way, hoping she would be okay. Then I wondered how many people did that and felt a little guilty for not making sure.

Then, to top it off, I read a headline on the internet that a woman in a wheel chair was struck by a car. I quick clicked on it and was relieved to find it was in Jamestown. I was indecisive and did nothing and just let it pass. What would you have done? How many times do you see incidents like this and decide to let someone else worry about it, because I do not want to get involved?

You read stories about last minute decisions that meant life of death. People who stopped for coffee or whatever before going into the Trade Center on 9/11 and ending up being saved. Making the wrong turn, being late or being early, the clothes you wear, simple little decisions that sometimes turn out to be huge.


Read a little story about

my older brother in a B24 in WWII. His plane was so damaged from flack they had to make an emergency landing. They could not see if landing gear had come down with the hand crank as the hydraulics were gone. The crew made the decision to hang my brother out the side window upside down so he could see under the wing if they were deployed. Would have made a huge difference in the landing.

Fortunately, they were down and they landed alright. He was 19 at the time and is now 88 years old. Had five children and many grandchildren, and great grandchildren who would not be here.

Eisenhower had to make the decision to launch D-Day on the sixth of June 1944 in spite of bad weather. We all know how big that was and what happened after that. We might all have been speaking German or Japanese by now.

Guess you could go on and on and on about decisions made through the years. Not only in history, but in our own personal lives. We just have to try to make sure that we make the best one possible with the knowledge we have. Remember that on Election Day.

Hertel North Buffalo Business Association Member Spotlight Sorrento Cheese Italian Heritage Festival



The Sorrento Cheese Italian Heritage Festival celebrated 25 years on Hertel Avenue in 2012.

The Sorrento Cheese Italian Heritage Festival has become not only Hertel Ave's biggest event, but also the second largest Italian street festival in the USA.

There are many other Italian Festivals in the country held in public parks, church grounds and community centers, but to have an outdoor festival on the main thoroughfare in the neigh-

borhood that Little Italy calls home is truly unique.

There have been Italian festivals or religious "feasts" celebrated in Buffalo's Italian communities since the late 1890's starting in "the Hooks" and Dante Place neighborhoods. One of the largest festivals recurred annually on the Lower West Side at St. Anthony's Italian Festival (not con-

nected to the church) where it lasted until the mid 1980's.

In 1988 this festival was brought to Hertel Ave., the predominately Italian-American neighborhood of the day. Here on Hertel it would be sponsored by three organizations for which it continues to be sponsored today. The name of the festival changed to "Sorrento Cheese Italian Heritage Festival" several years ago when Sorrento Cheese purchased the naming rights.

Cultural components have been added throughout the years to the food festival to educate the public about many aspects of Italian culture.

What has made organizers most proud is the fact that this festival has become a major city event. It is a beautiful sight to see people of all ethnic backgrounds coming together and enjoying Italian cuissine and culture. It is not a festival for Italians, but for all who appreciate the Italian way of life and "la bella dolce vita!"

On Saturday, September 29th from 10am-2pm, home tour fanatics will get a rare chance to visit the homes of Prospect Hill, Buffalo's only historic lakefront community. And for the first time ever, surrounding neighborhoods will also participate. More than a dozen interiors will be open for the event--from the Civil War-era Cottage District to colorful Queen Anne homes in the Fargo Neighborhood.

"Every style of residential architecture from the 1860s to the 1960s will be on display," notes Fred Schrock, director of the Buffalo Tours "Only two or program. three of these homes have ever been on a tour before, and there are hidden gems at each turn." One example is the towering Edgar B.
