'Crowns'

It turned out that Rocket Man hadn't skipped church after all. A Sunday matinee of the musical "Crowns" at the Paul Robeson Theatre filled him with a spirit worthy of his home congregation. and besides they'd taken the collection up front.

"Crowns," a jewel staged at the Studio Arena some six years ago, shines its light on the affection of African-American women for hats, particularly at worship: "I'm gonna' meet my king and I've got to look good."

But so far as young visitor Yolanda is concerned, the king had better be a Yankee fan. Her "crown" is a blackand-white NY cap, sidesaddle. The streets have been mean to Yolanda, wrought with more frown than crown by Falisha Young. She has little use for what she sees as the unjustified optimism of these southern ladies who now shelter her.

One by one or two by two, they bring her up to speed while speaking and singing of troubles and triumphs. Gospel music rocks the Robeson, which seats fewer than a hundred. When Denise Smith sang "His Eye Is on the Sparrow," her eyes filled up with tears, so close that Rocket Man covered his notes lest they run. It was memorable for a lifetime.

In a telling scene, a woman shops in a recently-desegregated millinery, thoroughly dissed by the clerk (Smith again) who assumes that she can't afford it. Out comes the cash, a proud moment vividly staged. Also riveting as oral history is Mary Craig's recollection of the iron discipline of her blind mother.

These hats are not for talking through, but the concept of "hattitude" is not above a little fun-poking - the sidesaddle hug that leaves the headpieces untouched, the hat hoarders, the role of a really fine hat for visual foreplay.

But it's just as much about the music: "Saints Go Marchin' In," "That's All Right" and "On the Battlefield," all adding up to about a 95-minute show free of intermission.

Director Thomas W. Jones II's cast also features Annette Christian, Beverly Crowell and Vallana M. Harris, as well as Terry Wideman, deftly portraying a wide variety of menfolk. The playbill suggests that his family provided many of the queenly props. Harlan Penn's set employs cathedral windows and scrims to successful effect.

Rocket Man wishes more had joined him and the First Mate Sunday. Among those who did, a nice percentage was properly crowned. "Crowns" continues through Oct. 7 at 350 Masten Ave. NINE ROCKETS (out of 10).



Buffalo's Italian Festival Is The Second Largest In The Nation


Cheese The Sorrento Italian Heritage Festival has become not only Hertel Ave's biggest event; but also the second largest Italian street festival in the USA. There are many other Italian festivals in the country held in public parks, church grounds and community centers, but to have an outdoor festival on the main thoroughfare in the neighborhood that Little Italy calls home is truly unique. Only the San Gennaro Festival in lower Manhattan is larger.

There have been Italian festivals or religious "feasts" celebrated in Buffalo's Italian communities since the late 1890s starting in "the Hooks" and Dante Place neighborhoods. One of the largest festivals occurred annually on the lower West Side at St Anthony's church where it thrived for decades. Eventually in 1976 Connecticut St. (also on the West Side) was home to the St. Anthony's Italian Festival (not connected to the church) where it lasted until the mid 1980's.

In 1988 this festival was brought to Hertel Ave., the predominately Italian-American neighborhood of the day by a group headed by the Hon. Judge Thomas Amodeo. Here on Hertel it would be sponsored by three organizations for which it continues to be sponsored today: the Hertel North Buffalo Business Association, the North Buffalo Community Center and the West Side Business and Taxpayers Association. The proceeds of the festival are divided annually among the three groups and given back to the groups to support their respective organizations. The name of the festival changed to the "Sorrento Cheese Italian Heritage Festival" several years ago when Sorrento Cheese purchased the naming rights.

Cultural components have been added through the years to the predominately food festival to educate the public about many aspects of Italian culture. There is an Italian Mass every year, along with Bocce Tournaments, St. Anthony processions, and over the years grape stomping, Italian flag throwers from Buffalo's Sister City, computers for genealogical research, replicas of the Trevi Fountain, Mt. Vesuvius, and the Leaning Tower of Pisa and of course Italian singers and dancers. Cultural displays such as the inventions of Leonardo da Vinci and the Journey of Hope documenting the Italian Immigrant experience in Buffalo have been just some of the cultural highlights.

What has made organizers most proud is the fact that this festival has become a major city event. It is a beautiful sight to see people of all ethnic backgrounds coming together and enjoying Italian cuisine and culture. It is not just a festival for Italians, but for all who appreciate the Italian way of life and "la bella dolce vita!"




