'1776'

Students from many levels of learning looked history in the face last Thursday morning at the Ellicott Creek Playhouse and some two dozen actors, when not arguing with each other, looked back.

"Was it really that way?" one asked after a rousing presentation of the "1776" by Niagara Regional Theater Guild.

"Well, they didn't sing," admitted Director Dawn Marcolini Newton, but even the most fastidious historians concede that this remarkable musical is more accurate than the average musket. The Adams family letters, the minutes of the confrontational construction of the Declaration of Independence, they're all a matter of record.

And for the final word, there's the Declaration of Independence itself.

Somehow mustering two

dozen men who can speak for themselves, not to mention such ladies as Judy Rodriguez, exquisite as Abigail Adams, Niagara Regional Theatre fancifully re-creates the pain and the strain by which our national was birthed 236 years ago. And when the air resounds with complaints of a do-nothing Congress, and an inept New York delegation ("New York abstains - courteously"), it conveys the notion that, less than a month away from another election, things haven't changed all that much.

Like voters in Dickens' unfinished "Edwin Drood," the teen-age throng rallied 'round the skills of Fran Newton as "Obnoxious John" Adams, for whom the opening number, "Sit Down, John," sets the tone. They wondered if Jon May, as Carolinian Rutledge, "was always that

happy," and roared as Tom Turici and henchmen worked up the formula for converting molasses into rum. Then there was Paul Bene, a Guild honoree, conveying a randy old Benjamin Franklin, father of invention, and Randy Rumley as Delaware's Cesar Rodney, coming back from death's door to literally save the day.

How on earth, we can still wonder, could these good men and true set their seal of approval on the institution of slavery. The answer is here, in all its dissatisfaction, to stand another 86 years.

Les Bailey was particularly convincing as Pennsylvanian John Dickinson, firmest opponent of rebellion. One wonders whether had it been Bailey, and not John Dickinson, making the case for the crown, we might all today be talking out of the other sides of our mouths. But "1776" will continue to make its mark, for more adult audiences, through Oct. 14 at the Guild's Ellicott Creek Playhouse, 350 Ellicott Creek Rd.. Tonawanda, with level parking and easy access. (EIGHT ROCKETS, out of 10.)

I met the two brothers, Bob and John Hazelet, even before they bought the La-Hacienda way back in the early 70's. I had just started the Buffalo Rocket and used to cover Shoshone Little League Football on Saturdays. In those days I was the chief cook and bottle washer at the Rocket. I did it all, took the pictures, wrote the stories, and actually laid out the paper for printing. So being as I was at Shoshone Park every Saturday, I got to meet a lot of the parents. The Hazelet sons played football in this league. At that time the brothers owned a wig company on Hertel. So when they bought the pizzeria I was there to sell them an ad in the Rocket. They took the ad and have been in the Rocket every week for the last forty years. I like to think that it contributed to the success of the business. They agreed to give away three free pizzas a week in the Rocket and have done so ever since. I would believe that they must have given out more than a thousand pizzas over the years. Hope some of our readers have won, as the names are picked at random out of the phone book.

I recall those first days when they first opened. Bob and John made the pizza and the two wives waited on tables. Back then chicken wings were not a big thing, and still relatively new to the area, and unheard of in the rest of the country. Needless to say, being one of the first to serve them helped the business to grow. The Hazelet children all were recruited and had specific tasks to perform. Like

breaking the chicken wings into two parts, the flats and the drumstick. Remember Bob telling me the secret to a pizza success is to not try to cut expenses by using cheaper cheeses. He said that was the demise of some of the other pizzerias. Less expensive ingredients lead to a not as good product. He

around the establishment and had lunch there often, almost every day. Got to be friends with both Bob and John. The people at the party were a little older, and a little heavier, but so am I. It was nice having people I have not seen in many, many years, come over to say hello. Some I would recognize right away and other, sorry to say, had to explain who they were. All the siblings were there and them I

knew well as I went to a lot

of their weddings.

So congratulation, to who I believe is now the longest running restaurant on Hertel. Good luck to Tom and Kim who now run the organization. Thanks for forty years of good memories and being an asset to the community. Hope I am still here for the fiftieth. That should be a hum dinger!



Fall Care for Healthy Lawns

Summer can be hard on our lawns. With much of the country suffering from extreme heat and drought conditions this past summer, many lawns took a beating.

Fall is the perfect time

to help your lawn recover from the stressors of summer and prepare for winter. The warm soil and cooler temperatures promote root growth and thickening of the lawn.

Continue to mow the lawn as long as it keeps growing. Mow high to encourage deep roots and leave clippings on the lawn. They add nutrients and organic matter to the soil and do not cause thatch. There's no need to cut the lawn shorter for winter unless you are in an area subject to winter diseases.

Mow don't rake those fall leaves. This will save you time and improve your lawn. The leaves add organic matter and nutrients to the soil. As long as you can see the grass leaves through the shredded leaves your lawn will be fine. Or shred and collect the leaves in your bagger and add them to your compost, dig into annual gardens to improve the soil, or use as mulch around perennials in the garden.

Consider core aeration if your lawn is suffering from compacted soil and thatch. Core aeration machines remove plugs of soil in the

lawn, allowing air and water to reach and nourish the grass roots while promoting the breakdown of the thatch. Overseed thin lawns after core aerating. This will enable you to get good seed to soil contact and ultimately enjoy a thicker more lush lawn.

And be sure to fertil-

ize. Fall fertilization helps lawns recover from summer stress, encourages root growth, thickens your grass stand, and prepares the lawn for winter. Use a low nitrogen fertilizer like Milorganite to encourage slow steady growth and prevent damage to already

stressed lawns. Plus, research has found when microorganisms work on the Milorganite to release the nutrients they also make some of the phosphorous and potassium bound to the soil available to the plants. The phosphorous is good for root growth and potassium boosts hardiness and disease resistance.

Gardeners growing cool season grasses like Kentucky bluegrass, fescue and rvegrass should make one application in early fall

and their last application sometime between Halloween and Thanksgiving before the ground freezes.

And always sweep any clippings, fertilizer and other debris off walks and drives to prevent them from entering our waterways and eventually our drinking water.





LOST STREAM MAP

The STREAM & LAKE MAP OF NEW YORK resembles another map-known to Pennsylvania

anglers as the "Lost Stream Map." The "Stream Map of Pennsylvania" was completed in 1965 after a thirty-year effort by Howard Higbee, a former Penn State Professor.
