"Making Decisions"

In last week's Rocket I did an article on the fortieth anniversary of Bob and John's restaurant on Hertel Avenue. I knew that over the span of 40 years there were many pictures and articles written about the operation and the two men. So I went about the task of looking through all of the thousands of old photos in the archives searching for just the right touch and that special picture.

Needless to say, I spent many hours doing this. It made me smile at some, and very sad, looking at others. This was forty three years of seeing people, places and things caught on camera and sadly, some no longer with us. It was nice to see the many merchants, politicians, children and just plain people who looked through the lenses of our many different photographers. Some of them are still around but have changed considerably, others who have left us, but their smiles remain.

Due to the move we made from 2507 Delaware, the photos were not filed in any order. I wanted to make sure the photos survived so I packed them in boxes. Sorry to say not in any way sorted by year, subject, or project. So it was a mish-mash and hard to separate, except to look at each and every picture. I didn't recognize some of the people in the photos, but most I did. I saved the photos that I thought may have been of interest to the people in them, or perhaps, their families.

Like the one of a twenty year old Tommy Lombardo laughing with his father who is no longer with us. Was not sure if Tommy had one like it, but I brought it over to him just in case. Picture had to be taken over 30 years ago. Frank's Sunny Italy's St. Joseph day celebration, maybe 15 years ago. Sardinia's restaurant on Delaware, maybe 20 years ago. Found some of the merchants who are still around but have changed considerably.

Many snapshot pictures of former Mayor Griffin, Bill Hoyt, Mayor Masiello, Sam

Hoyt, former councilmen and other politicians who were a part of North Buffalo.

Talk about a walk down memory lane! In the first years of the Rocket I use to take the pictures myself. Shoshone football, events, people, schools, buildings. Etc. Mostly done with a Polaroid camera, so I had the pictures immediately. Then we were able to have the people who wrote the articles also take the pictures. There was even one time that we had a professional photographer, a very young George Campos taking our photos. I can tell by the quality of the photographs who did the picture taking.

Then of course many of the photos were submitted by someone looking for a little PR. Most of those I tossed as I am sure there is more than one. Seems even though I did not know who the person was in the picture, I still hesitated to throw it out. Probably would never be seen by that individual or the family, but I saved them anyway.

Maybe saving them is not going to work as I did publish some old unidentified groups, looking for clues as to who they were but received no response. One had about 20 people in it and a North Buffalo location, but still no one wrote me to tell me they were the third from the left in the top row and who the group was.

I did find some older pictures of Bob and John's and I did publish them with the article. But I know there are more as I do recall the subject matter. Unfortunately, time ran out and I wanted to do the column. I am still looking through the old photos, but not with the urgency I was. I will probably send Sam Hoyt the collection I have of him and those of his father. Same with Tony Masiello and some of the other politicians who no longer serve.
