asked to investigate paranormal activities near the Black Rock Canal, Scajaquada Creek area, and the Foot of Ferrv Street. His research and investigations have found activity, he feels, that are energies left behind from events during the war of 1812 along the Scajaquada Creek where battles between

the British and the militia were frequent.

The militia were trying to protect the Village of Buffalo, at that time, to prevent the same burning and massacre that occurred in the Village of Lewiston by the

British. So, the Scajaquada Creek was the line the militia wanted to hold. Many unmarked graves and cemeteries were made on both sides of the creek and may still be there today.

His investigations have led him to investigate places like The Polish Cadet Hall on Grant Street. The Historical Society, Delaware Park and Forest Lawn Cemetery, all areas of battles and skirmishes along the Scaiaguada Creek area.

Tony says that he uses different techniques and tools during his investigations to monitor and record various paranormal activities. He uses old tools like dousing rods, pendulums and compasses to record some activities and K-2 meters, digital photography and motion

sensors on others. He says that it depends on the spirits on how they react or want to communicate to the tools he chooses. He may even throw salt or flour on the floor to record footprints.

He recalls getting a call to investigate an apartment complex on Englewood Avenue that was built on the grounds of a former church. The residents there report that they have found artifacts of crosses and statues in the basement as well as dead birds in the attic. They claim the door to the attic opens and shuts and have witnessed a filmy apparition in the living room.

When asked about Ouija boards, Tony said that they are "very dangerous" and should not be used to inves-

'The Whipping Man'

The Civil War seems an unlikely backdrop for a family drama concentrating on Judaism and Jewish Repertory Theatre's "The Whipping Man" is exceptionally instructional.

And it's a hard lesson. As the curtain rises on the ruins of his one-time plantation, a Confederate soldier comes staggering in, severely wounded. His one-time servant, whom he must now treat as equal, tells him that the gangrene-infected leg must be amputated, under an anesthetic of rotgut whiskey.

As actor Dee LaMonte Perry detailed the diagnosis and procedure, a nearly full house shuddered. To endure this twice in one day must tax even as accomplished an actor as Stan Klimecko, the defeated Confederate in his third consecutive south-of-the-border role.

"The hardest thing I've ever done," he said between shows on opening weekend last Saturday.

"Whipping Man" is set at

Passover, 1865 on the Christian calendar. A President will die during its duration. (Director Saul Elkin credits Bill O'Reilly's "Killing Lincoln" among his inspirational resources.) Amid the chaos, a seder breaks out, cobbled together with items provided by the frisky and liberated John. "Found it, stole it, what's the difference?" asks actor Greg Howze, whose animated performance seems at least slightly inspired by the late Nipsy Russell.

Although many Jewish people served on both sides (notably Judah Benjamin of the Confederate cabinet), their faith goes largely unrecognized in most recollections of that awful time. "Whipping Man," though, strongly defines the parallels between the escape from Egypt and the defeat of the cause of slavery. Much of this is gloriously expounded by Perry as the older, wiser servant – the actor is actually a Protestant minister, with a robust delivery that well serves this cause.

Greg Howze – if the name sounds a little familiar, he's a nephew of the legendary "Earl of Bud" suds vendor – lights up the stage as the younger, more rebellious servant John.

As for Klimecko, he completes a south-of-the-border trifecta: Boolie in Atlanta-set "Driving Miss Daisy" in May, Stanley in New Orleans-set "Streetcar Named Desire" in September.

And when he begins to quote the holy Torah in a soft drawl, it sounds almost natural.

In just under two hours, secrets and spiritual skepticism emerge. "I was at Petersburg," Caleb declares. "He (pointing skyward) was not." Although leavened with humor ("you been chewin' that horse for longer than he was alive") and a conclusion of universal brotherhood, "The Whipping Man" is serious business. The setting is one of deprivation, the special effects frightenly authentic, particularly in the timing of the flashes and bangs of thunder and lightning and






