Oscar Smukler Closes Law Office on Hertel Avenue

graduation from SUNY at Buffalo's law school, and being one of the Buffalo Rocket's longest continuous advertiser, attorney Oscar Smukler will be closing his

Sixty-two years after law office at 1438 Hertel Avenue.

"This is the biggest decision I've ever had to make," Oscar said. "I love not just the practice of law but also all of my clients and my

many friends in North Buffalo."

For the past twenty years, Smukler could be seen in his office from 5:00 in the morning until after 5:00 in the afternoon. He would always smile and say, "I just work half a day."

Oscar Smukler, a graduate of School 45 and Lafayette High School, was recently honored by being selected for a spot on the high school's prestigious Wall of Fame.

After graduating from Lafayette, Oscar attended Purdue University where he earned a degree in Civil engineering. After thirty-three months in the Navy during World War II, he returned to Buffalo and went to work for the Corps of Engineers. While there, he worked on

some big name projects including the design of the Mt. Morris Dam, the Niagara Power Project and the Lancaster Flood Control Project.

In 1946, Oscar used his G.I. bill to attend law school where he earned his J.D. degree. Because jobs for recent law school graduates were not in high demand at the time, he returned to his original field of engineering. He was hired as a project engineer during the construction of the Ford Stamping Plant in Woodlawn. Upon completion of the construction, he opened his own law office and began the next phase of his career.

In 1952, Smukler was asked to teach a surveying course at what in now Erie Community college, which

was located in the Pierce Plant on Elmwood Avenue. For the next thirty-eight years, he practiced both teaching and law. Toward the end of his tenure at Erie Community College, he took a leave from law to assume administrative duties, first as chair of the department, then as vice-president of the city campus and finally as acting president of the college.

Oscar said that it was always a treat to be stopped by a former student. "I took your class in Structural Design," they would remind him. "Do you remember me?" Oscar always replied, "Only if I passed you."

With a long-held interest in college athletics, Smukler officiated basketball games

'Last Train To Oakville'

Cue the Monkees. The last train to Oakville has left the station. No more reservations. Actually, there never

One of the Niagara Frontier's best-kept travel secrets, Via Rail's commuter train to Toronto from the statuesque Niagara Falls Whirlpool Station on the Canadian side, has gone the way of the buggy and the easy airport check-in.

In its later years, Via named it The General Brock. It departed just after reveille and reported to Toronto Union in time for 9-to-5ers to start their workday. After a photogenic crossing of Twenty Creek, an eye-popping swing around Hamilton Bay, and a last pause at Oakville, its rolling panorama offered the guilty pleasure of cruising past jammed traffic on

the Gardiner and the "Q" 90 kilometers per, with Lake Ontario glimmering in the background.

Three years ago Rocket Man treated his golf clubs to a ride on The Brock, playing two Toronto courses using only bus and subway and returning at twilight, seatmating a physical trainer from Burlington.

Another time his excursioning railroad club transferred from The Brock to Canada's Northlander on an adjacent track. Clambering down and out of one car and up and into the other, we looked like a squadron of ants changing jelly doughnuts.

The same club made an annual Christmas-shopping daytrip to Toronto. While the exchange was more favorable then, the best gift of all was the companion-

ship, particularly during the sleepy satisfaction of the return trip, the train clanging and hooting past Peninsula grade crossings. One evening young hooligans pelted us with rocks. Rocket Man hoped it wound up in their stockings.

One train remains on the Route of the Brock, the lateafternoon Maple Leaf from New York, undependable because of the lengthy Customs check, and with a less convenient schedule even when it's on time.

Green and white accordion-shaped GO (Government of Ontario) Trains run there in the summer on a schedule designed to accommodate daytripping Torontonians.

And for the carless or the cautious, there's still commuter service to Toronto - via GO Bus, which transports travelers to Burlington, to board GO Train from there. Somehow we just can't imagine "Last Bus to Burlington" much inspiring Mickey Dolenz.

The General Brock, old soldier of Peninsula rails, has faded away.

"Father Joe Moreno"

Why? I wondered as I read with interest the article in the Sunday Buffalo News, why a reporter would spend time writing a lengthy negative article about our beloved Father Joe. The reporter,

with assistance of another reporter, was able to find enough "anonymous" sources to attempt to put a stain on the past of this man who did so much for so many. If you subscribe to the News, and happened to have read the article, you will notice that the people who made positive comments were all properly

named. Just so happens these News reporters found it necessary to dig into his history and find quotes from un-named people that had negative things to say. At one time if someone chose not to identify themselves in an interview with a reporter, their story was not published and considered hearsay. Even if these embellished accusations were all true, why bring them up? The man is gone and has left a legacy few men could achieve in such a short life. What he did was obvious by the outpouring of humanity at his services last week. What point are they trying to make? That in spite of all the good he did, he was still human?

I have personally known Father Joe Moreno since he was a boy. I believe he even delivered the Rocket at one time. I know for sure we covered the ceremony when he achieved Eagle Scout ranking in the Boy Scouts of America. He has a great family and his father was often in the Rocket office when it was on Tacoma. I recall a very shy young Joe Moreno coming into the office with his father to sell some kind of ticket for a Boy Scout fund raiser. He could barely get the words out he was so nervous. The prepared speech was finally delivered with the help of his dad. I did my best to make

him feel comfortable and of course bought what he was selling. I was shocked when I found out a few years later, that this shy young man was going into the priesthood. How in the world would he

be able to give homilies and address religious problems? Let me tell you he did a great job. Our paths crossed often as he was familiar face in North Buffalo, both at St Margaret's and at the District five police station.

I recall a decade ago, when the Kiwanis Club of Toronto was funding a marching band to participate in Drums Along the Waterfront. They had asked our Kiwanis club if they could possibly arrange to provide lunch for this huge group of kids. I do not recall the number, but it was huge, like over 100. Knowing Father Joe was well known at LaNova pizzeria, I asked if he could possibly get us a good deal. The deal was the best you could ask for. Enough pizza and wings to feed these young teenagers and at no cost to us. I use this as an example of the way Father Joe worked. Over the years he helped our Kiwanis club help the needy, over and over again. He was always there when we needed him, not only for donations, but spiritual guidance.

No doubt he was unorthodox, I even heard he had Buffalo Bills patches sewn on his vestments during Sunday mass. He was a huge Bills fan and made no bones about it. Maybe this is another unorthodox overlooked thing he did as a priest. Wonder why our reporters did not find another anonymous donor with that story. I accidentally met him in Los Angeles at the Super Bowl game between Buffalo and Dallas walking around outside before the game. He told me he was there to pray for divine intervention to help the Bills win. Maybe he was too unorthodox to get that kind of help as we got bombed. Dallas took us to the cleaners and it was the worst of the four Super Bowl losses we had.

Not too long ago he stopped by to present the

Rocket with a certificate from Jay Leno, thanking the publication for all it does for the community. He presented me and my wife with mugs depicting Father Joe and Jay Leno sitting together, drinking tea I suppose. We now cherish those mugs and will no longer drink our coffee out of them.

The last time we ran into Father Joe was

at Ted's on Niagara Falls Boulevard this summer. He was alone and having a small snack before doing a 5:30 mass at a church down the street on the boulevard. He told us he often does masses at other churches and LOVES doing them. In fact the pastor of St Mary's church on Transit, who also was at St. Margaret's, said Father Joe recently called to see if he needed him to fill in on any masses. Funny how the story in the News said he did not show for masses. Again it was from one of those "anonymous" sources based on hearsay but published anyway. Perhaps in 25 years it did happen and again was embellished in the article to make it a negative. Poor reporting?

At this last meeting at Ted's, Father Joe went on about the 25th anniversary of his ordination. He expressed his disappointment we were not there as he looked for us, but at the time I had a very sick wife. He said he was so pleased and proud as there were over 1,000 people in attendance. Now does this sound like a person with anything but an overwhelming positive past? Yikes, you reporters, give me a break!


I could not even get down Hertel to get to his wake and it was impossible to get to his funeral. It was likened to the passing of a very prominent dignitary. I only hope he realizes now how much he meant to so many people. Let me ask you News reporters, was it necessary to defame him at this time just to sell a few papers? Was that the intention of the editor when he gave you the assignment? Find something bad about this man even if you cannot back it with names? I know in my mind I will al-

ways remember our Father Joe as smiling and jovial in a soft spoken way. Always, always, there to help those who needed help or guidance. Perhaps, maybe sometimes, at his own expense. I always regarded him as North Buffalo's angel in priest's clothing. I offer my condolences, to his dad and sister and may he now, Rest In Peace.

for thirty years. During that time, he even officiated overseas in Eastern Europe in countries including Russia and the former Yugosla-

Along the way, his budding interest in real estate development led him and four of his friends to build Fantasy Island in the early 1960's. He also developed the strip plaza on Hertel Avenue near Delaware Avenue and helped to convert the empty School 22 on Huntington Avenue into thirty residential apartments.

Asked what his fondest and most enjoyable memory is, he replied, "the voters of North Buffalo having enough confidence to elect me on five different occasions as their representative on the Buffalo Board of Education."

As he prepared to leave his office, for what may be one of the last times in a long and highly successful career, Oscar Smukler reflected, "It's been a good ride, and I give thanks to God, to my family and to my many good friends"


