and education needs of the Catholic faithful throughout the diocese, and determine how those needs can best be met. It is an effort to create parish communities that are much more than a place where Sunday liturgy is celebrated.

Holiday Mailing Tips From your U.S. Postal Service

The holiday season is upon us and local Post Offices and mail processing centers are gearing up for the busiest time of the year. The Postal Service is projecting Monday, December 17th as the busiest mailing day.

The Postal Service anticipates delivering approximately 17.9 billion letters, cards and packages between Thanksgiving and New Year's Day.

The Western New York District will handle, in total, about 85 million letters and cards this holiday season.

Western NY District Manager Kathleen Burns offers this advice to holiday mailers, "Mail early – in the

season and the day for the most shipping choices and shortest lines. And use the Calculate a Price feature at our usps.com website to explore shipping options, es-



timate delivery times and price. It takes the guess work out of shipping."

Here are other tips to make this mailing season easier. Avoid the rush and mail early!

Mailing early in the sea-

son offers customers the most shipping options as well as avoidance of possible delays caused by bad weather that shuts down airports and surface transportation.

There are a number of Forever holiday stamps for customers to choose from, including the Santa & Sleigh, Holy Family, Hanukkah, Eid and Kwanzaa.

Holiday stamps can be delivered to any address when ordered through www.usps.com, by calling 800-STAMP-24 or by completing a Stamps-By-Mail form (available from mail carriers).

Both St. Margaret and Holy Spirit Parishes now share a new common weekday and weekend mass schedule. Several Masses and Services now are celebrated at each Church.

‘Carl Kowalkowski’s Farewell’

Friends bid farewell Sunday to Carl Kowalkowski, one of the finest character actors Buffalo ever has known, struck down at Thanksgiving time, age 68. It just seemed too young, although 40 years had passed since Rocket Man first wondrously beheld him on stage.

Carl was memorialized at St. John’s-Grace Episcopal on Colonial Circle, which was packed to the doors by citizenry of every stripe. A graduate of Canisius High School where he hung with a cluster of dedicated pacifists who ironically dubbed themselves “The Magnificent Seven,” Carl became an eager and loyal worker at St. John’s-Grace.

Retired Rector Philip W. Dougharty recalled his saying, many years ago, “I need a place to be buried from.” Writing from Arizona, the Rev. Dougharty characterized Carl as a “loveable curmudgeon,” a gentle man who would express any opposition at parish meetings “by dozing off.”

Nevertheless, Rocket Man and First Mate left the solemn service wishing there’d been more said from the pulpit about Carl’s remarkable acting career, which made him not rich, but beloved. Rocket Man remembers him as the dreamy immigrant DePinna in “You Can’t Take It With You” and, mostly, as the potted postman in an Irish Classical Theater production of “Child’s Christmas in Wales.” In that, he was directed by Niagara University’s Brother Augustine Towey, CM, who would join him in death on the very same day.

At a sumptuous reception, it seemed as if almost everyone remembered something different, including the dark “Krapp’s Last Tape” and a role in which he was transformed into a rhinoceros. Another spoke of his contributions to the

long-ago Buffalo Comedy Workshop.

One friend described him thus: “Carl just came on, and it seemed as if he had no interest in whether you liked him or not. So... you loved him all the more.”

Carl also mainstayed at the Positively Main Street gift shop on Elmwood Avenue, a clerk of impeccable tastes and knowledges. Here, too, it seemed as if he had no interest in whether you bought something... so you bought all the more. Another attendee described Positively Main Street as “like a well, you just kept throwing money down it.”

And on stage, Carl Kowalkowski made all our dreams come true. He was a marvelous man, worthy of the SRO at his finale. Yet, we felt we hardly knew him. Love an actor today.

"Handguns?"

Recent headlines in the sports news contained the story of a Kansas City football player who shot his girlfriend and then proceeded to kill himself. The tragedy was terrible enough to stimulate comments from all over the sports world and even outside that particular circle. Again it was stimulated by the question of possession of hand guns.

One very prominate and well know sports announcer made a statement that he had to later apologize for. In a discussion he mentioned that if there were no handguns available, two people would still be alive. I am not quoting as I did not hear the

And excuse the pun, have a lot of ammunition with all the mass shootings occurring in this country. A fellow said to me the other day, it seems that in today's civilized society, you almost need to own a handgun. Does that make this a civilized society?

Office, an Automated Postal Center or at one of over 200 Buffalo/Niagara grocery and convenient stores, pharmacies and banks. Call 1-800-ASK-USPS or go to usps.com and click on Find Locations to locate the closest stamp retailer.

The U.S. Postal Service recommends the following mail-by dates so that holiday cheer arrives safely and on time: Dec. 3, Military mail destined for Afghanistan; Dec. 10, Military mail for other overseas bases; December 14, Parcel Post; December 20, First-Class Mail; December 21, Priority Mail; December 22, Express Mail.

A Self Service Kiosk can be found at Northside Station, 725 Hertel Avenue and is available 24/7. Don't wait in line during the busy holiday mailing season! At a Self Service Kiosk, you can mail packages, purchase stamps, and more.

Here is how to properly

address your holiday greeting cards: Write, type, or print legibly the complete address in the middle of the envelope. Always use a complete delivery address, including directionals (North, South, East, West), street designators (is it Street, Avenue, Road, etc.), and apartment, room, or suite numbers, and the correct ZIP Code. Don't guess at a ZIP Code if you don't know it. Call 1-800-ASK-USPS (1-800-275-8777) or go to www.usps.com for the correct ZIP Code of any address in the country. Always use your return address in the upper left corner.

To protect your packages and to allow the USPS to process and deliver them on time and in good condition, here are some simple rules to follow: Select a box that's strong enough for the weight of the contents. Cushion the contents completely, leaving no pockets. Use crumpled up newspaper, bubble wrap, or other cushioning

material. If you shake the sealed container and the contents rattle, you haven't cushioned them enough. Inside the box, enclose a card with a list of the contents and the sender's and recipient's respective addresses. Address the package on one side only using a complete delivery address, and make sure you put your return address in the upper left corner. Seal the box with a filament or mailing tape designed for shipping, and never use string or twine. Remove batteries from toys and other items and pack them separately.

Packages that weigh over 13 oz. with postage paid using stamps cannot be mailed in a collection box and must be taken to a retail counter of a Post Office to follow FAA compliance regulations.
