The St. Patrick's Day Parade begins at 2pm at the McKinley Monument and travels north on Delaware Avenue to North Street.

The Annual St. Patrick's Day Parade will be held this Sunday, March 16th at 2pm on Delaware Avenue.

Mass will be celebrated by Bishop Richard J. Malone at Saint Joseph's Cathedral at 10:30 am, before the line up for the Parade begins.

The Parade route is north on Delaware Avenue

from the McKinlev Monument to North Street. The United Irish American Association of Erie County (UIAA) has elected Chris Laffler of Tonawanda, NY to be the Grand Marshal of the 2014 Saint Patrick's Day Parade.

This once in a lifetime honor will be a family walk up Delaware Avenue for Mr. Laffler, he has named his wife Christine and their two sons Brendan and Connor to be his deputy marshals along with his longtime friend Garry Johnson, President of UIAA. Chris donated countless hours to the work of the Saint Patrick's Day Parade before being elected to serve on the Executive Committee.

He started working as a route and division marshal for many years, helping in the lineup and crowd control tasks; currently he serves as Sergeant at Arms for the Executive Committee meetings.

In recent years he has taken on an increasingly larger role in the disbursement of the parade participants and bus traffic at North Street.

"Doing Doonesbury"

Rocket Man's rap sheet includes a glorious gig as comics-page editor of the Courier-Express. Early in his tenure, the boss came in and demanded "Doonesbury" be withheld from the following morning's Courier. It would be Rocket Man's task to explain, in print.

"Doonesbury," the most politically-charged comic strip since Walt Kelly's "Pogo," had been quite a catch for the Courier, but many traditionalist subscribers hated it, perceiving it, rightly, as leaning left. Rocket Man had lowered the volume by placing it at a distance from such homier entries as "Dennis the Menace" and "Bringing Up Father," (a/k/a "Maggie & Jiggs," R.I.P.

Now, artist Garry Trudeau had gone too far in the eyes of the ubereditor. There were unsubstantiated charges at the time that a son of President Ford was using marijuana (those were, indeed, different times), and in the strip in question, Trudeau

depicted them as fact, naming names.

That was libel, and the editor wasn't having any of it. Rocket Man, feeling quite out of his orbit, sat down at his 40-pound Royal and pounded out:

"Nothing in the First Amendment grants any newspaper the right to call the President's son a pothead." He vowed that this one-time deletion had nothing to do with political preference. The switchboard ignited that morning and Rocket Man spent a couple of days fending off charges of censorship. "Doonesbury" devotees quickly bought out of town papers, young Mr. Ford would eventually own up to his activities (can't recall whether he ever admitted inhaling) and life went on.

It went on, that is, until two weeks ago, when cartoonist Trudeau laid down his pen, announcing that he was writing "finis" to his daily strip, leaving several story lines hanging. One of them had layabout professional tanner Zonker plotting to raise marijuana, legally, in Colorado. His spokesman, Zipper, goes to a town meeting to ask permission, so stoned that he winds up arguing against it.

That was Trudeau to a "t." He could be dreadfully unfair - depicting Vice President Quayle as a feather, for example - but he could see both sides and he was achingly funny. Powerful, too. He specified the size in which it would run. Not even "Blondie" got away with that.

There's a right-wing strip called "Mallard Fillmore," boringly shrill and whiney. The News doesn't carry it, but it does have "Prickly City," irritatingly drawn and ear-splittingly loud.

Rocket Man and his Firstborn encountered Trudeau in New York once, through Buffalonian Elizabeth Swados, who had helped produce a "Doonesbury" musical. He was humbly gracious. The lad remembers Trudeau's tolerance of what he now looks back at as almost fawning. It was a wonderful moment, complementing every grin, grimace and argument Trudeau's art had inspired.

"Doonesbury" still runs Sundays. Last week's railed against smoking but none of the familiar characters appeared. If lighting up our lives daily is a habit, Trudeau has kicked it.

Get Ready To Run!

Tips for runners and walkers after the L-O-N-G winter. After this long, harsh winter, even the most devoted couch potatoes are ready for the great outdoors. Whether strolling, speed-walking or taking a run, there are steps to take to avoid pain and injury. In order to avoid common foot problems there are warnings that should be heeded and preventative steps that can be taken to avoid serious injuries. A good running shoe is essential.

Fit and function are key, and shoe construction and sizing varies among manufacturers. Shoes that are ill fitted or too tight can lead to black toenails and neuromas (enlarged nerves). To test if your shoes are too tight, remove the insert or lining of your running shoe (if it is not attached) and stand on it.

If any portion of the foot is hanging over the insert, the shoes are too small. Remember to wear socks that are a poly-cotton blend, which pulls moisture away from the skin and fit comfortably within the running shoe. Stretch and warm-up for 5- 10 minutes before hitting the track or treadmill. Start by focusing on lower leg muscles.

Beginning runners should start with short distances, increasing the run over time to help prevent injury. Try to keep both the feet and entire body relaxed, avoiding

tensing and cramping of the toes. Stop running or walking if you are in pain. At the end of a workout or run, cool down and rest.

"After running, in addition to drinking something like Gatorade to rehydrate and replenish essential minerals, gently massage the bottom part of your foot, especially the heel and arch," reminds Dr. Robert Russo, President of the New York State Podiatric Medical Association and a practicing podiatrist.

"A tennis ball or frozen bottle of water rolled under your foot is a good way to massage and stretch following a run," he added.


