Now that the weather is starting to break from eight weeks of constant sub freezing temperatures, the dreaded potholes have begun to appear. The city and county crews have been making every effort to address

the numerous amount of complaints about the problem.

Just about every street has some issues with potholes, some bad and some not as bad. Plowing and keeping the roads open during the many weeks of snow took a large toll on the roads. Also, with the ground frost level being so deep, ice has pushed up large areas of roads causing plows to remove chunks of pavement.

John Buscaglia, Actor

How popular was actor John Buscaglia?

Someone looking for love in all the right places once posted a personal "seeking" ad in Artvoice, hoping to hook up with a date, specifying several preferences, concluding with "...must like plays with John Buscaglia."

"He was the consummate professional and creative genius," said dinner-theater proprietor Jay Desiderio. "The timing, the phrasing the ad-libbing – those are the things you just can't teach."

Rocket Man calculates he'd seen John Buscaglia 50 times before his lights dimmed last Friday, a mere 71. He didn't command the stage in the style of, say, Vincent O'Neill or Saul Elkin, oh, no. Rather, he owned it.

Said Playhouse of American Classics founder and retired Buffalo State professor Terry MacDonald, now living in New England: "Few people made me laugh out loud when they were onstage as John did. He was an incredibly funny man. He never disappointed."

Well, perhaps his family, a little, when by his own account he "lasted about 15 minutes" in a downstate seminary. Decades later,

the Diocese would honor him with an Outstanding Teacher Award.

Said Darlene Pickering-Hummert, founder of Buffalo's ground-breaking Theatre for Change and a fellow student in the time of Fallon and O'Hern High Schools: "It was my distinct pleasure to know John and work with this comic genius. There will never be another one like him."

She cited the breath-taking comedy "Noises Off" as among her favorite Buscaglia memories, but Rocket Man's First Mate remembers him more seriously in the drama "Tribute" in Williamsville, as a terminally-ill actor racked with regrets. It was a striking stretch for a man who had made his mark mostly for observing wryly, or being wryly overlooked, evoking hysteria either way.

Richard Lambert of the

New Phoenix Theater on Johnson Park calls him "The funniest man I've ever met... loved by all who knew him because of his great quick wit, his delivery similar to Maggie Smith, staying just long enough to get two laughs instead of one...

"I was finally able to work with him on stage and try to copy, literally, his movements and his deliveries. When I got a chance to introduce him I would always end with, 'Ladies and gentlemen my hero, John Buscaglia."

Raiders of Niagara founder-director Randy Rumley recalls sharing banter and bread with him on two-show days of "Witness for the Prosecution" at the Kavinoky. "He was kind to everybody and as funny over dinner as he was on stage."

And Ellen Horst, whose credits include "Law & Order," remembered this: "John was most fun when he would crack himself up onstage. We wouldn't be able to look at each other."

He was Jack Lemmon without the angst, Noel Coward without the privilege, Michael Caine with two more years' schooling. Once you saw John Buscaglia in a role, you never saw that role quite the same way again. Only in death does he seem miscast. Services Saturday at St. Joseph University Catholic Church, 3269 Main St. Curtain rises at 10 a.m.

Resource Training Center Urges Sober Driving

St. Patrick's Day brings to mind shamrocks, leprechauns, pots of gold and good luck. But no amount of luck can save you from a drunk-driving crash.

Unfortunately, March 17th has become a deadly day in the United States with a dramatic spike in drunk-driving fatalities, according to Monica Farrar, program director of The Resource Training Center in Amherst.

"...All in all, during the St. Paddy's Day period from 2009 to 2013, there have been 276 drunk-driving fatalities," said Farrar. "Every one of those lives was lost because of bad decisions. Therefore, I urge everyone to get ahead of the decision this year. If you know you're going to celebrate St. Patrick's Day with alcohol, figure out a plan ahead of time for how you'll get home. Don't wait until you're too buzzed to decide, and don't let your friends drive drunk. Count on a sober friend, taxi or public transportation to drive you home safely."

Before you take your first sip of green beer this year, leave your keys at home or give them to a friend. If you're the designated driver, don't drink! Enjoy non-alcoholic beverages and brag about your VIP (very important partygoer) status online using the hashtag #designateddriver.

"Drunk driving has fatal consequences," added Farrar. "If you see a drunk driver on the road, contact local police immediately. You could save a life!"



Rethink Extinct will take guests on a journey through time, starting in the Paleozoic Era 542 million years ago, to explore the past – and the future – of life on Earth. Ever since the most basic of organisms began populating our planet, Earth has experienced at least five mass extinctions that have driven more than half of all life to extinction in relatively short periods of time.




