Buffalo Teens Share Concerns in Summit

Members of the Northtowns Boys & Girls Clubs' Teen Program participated in a round table discussion on the challenges associated with being a teenager growing up in the Buffalo area. Chief Professional Officer Robert O'Brocta and Councilman Joe Golombek opened up the conversation by asking the youth what some of their concerns were. The idea is for the teens to structure a well-thought out, genuine discussion with the end goal of bringing their valid concerns to the eyes and ears of some of Buffalo's strongest community leaders.

Using data obtained through the 2014 National Youth Outcomes Initiative survey for Boys & Girls Club members, the group was able to look at safety concerns facing many of the members. Surprisingly, it was found that 60% of club members felt unsafe in some aspect. With that

astounding number in mind, teen members surveyed their peers focusing on safety in three key areas: club, community, and schools. They found that although many teens feel safe inside the Club, youth from across our community felt unsafe on their commute - to/from school, their homes, and/ or afterschool programs. As a result of the lack of transportation or a safe alternative for getting home, many youth opt out of attending afterschool programs.

Many points arose were centered around education. The group was also able to look at the statistics of youth who attend afterschool programs, such as the Northtowns Boys & Girls Clubs' Teen Program, compared to those who do not. In addition, the group looked at the educational opportunities available to teens from the public schools, Continued on page 4

Big Day for the Bisons

Although the 2015 Buffalo Bisons remain largely a gleam in manager Gary Allenson's eye, another local product has made the Opening Day lineup.

That would be Pizza Logs, which first rolled out a quarter-century ago through the innovation and marketing skills of Niagara Falls' Cordova family. They've stacked up with the best of game-day snacks, recently gaining contracts with the Bills and Sabres and figuring prominently in a recent article on the subject of commercial jingles.

Produced and distributed right across Route 62 from International Airport, the Logs - kind of a cross between calzones and Tootsie Rolls -- got their day in the sun, so to speak, when introduced last Wednesday to the cream of Niagara Frontier media on "What's New at the Ballpark Day" at Coca-Cola Field. A sub-

stantial sampling disappeared like a one-run lead in a windstorm.

If that sounds like a slow news day, it was, in more ways than one. Much concerned conversation the new game-speed rules. Among other things, they limit inning breaks to 2 ½ minutes.

Asked what might happen if perennial mascotrace loser Celery failed to meet even this modest pace, General Manager Mike Buczkowski assured the vegetable's fans, "There'll never be a clock on Celery."

Buczkowski noted that baseball, with its frequent breaks in play, stands alone in its capacity for whetting appetites. "We challenge ourselves in this field every year," he said. For, example, the Herd's culinary crew also rolled out Oreo churros and turkey nachos, as well as Big Ditch craft beers and a Buffalo Wing Popcorn spicy enough to

serve as a drying agent on the playing surface behind.

Buczkowski said that the new draining system installed two years ago eased the pain of de-wintering from snow piles beyond the scope of yardsticks. He acknowledged the club's appreciation of public funding in assisting such projects, which also include the gleaming new green chairs in the lower grandstand.

Measuring three inches wider than those they replaced, they give the ballpark a distinctive new look, while reducing capacity to 17,600. The Buffalo News' Milt Northrop, who as it happened arrived here the same 1967 week as Rocket Man, observed that with all the new food items, few of which qualify as lo-cal, the space will be put to good use.

With a new park in the works to replace McCoy Stadium in Rhode Island, Coca-Cola Field stands to soon inherit the title of eldest statesmen among International League's elder statesmen of playgrounds. "Hard to believe in 28 years we would go from newest to oldest," Buczkowski said. "We intend to age gracefully."

Now, as this hits the porches of North Buffalo, Opening Day looms exactly a week away, April 9, 2 p.m. vs. the Rochester Red Wings. Pizza Logs come to bat an hour earlier. The forecast is warm enough, but a bit damp. Have another Pizza Log and hope.

M&T Bank Internet Survey

As some readers of my column know, I had a problem with M&T Bank. They were in some way able to extract over \$5,100 in unnecessary overdraft fees from our account in a little over a month. I filed a complaint with the BBB and M&T immediately decided that they no longer wanted to do business with us. Not that we would want to. We are extremely happy with Lakeshore Savings now.

In their response to the complaint we filed with the BBB they stated they placed a phone call to us every day. Not to say this is completely false, but it is strange that when I found

out about the exuberant overdraft fees, I asked the manager why he did not at least place a phone call to me as a courtesy. His reply and I quote, "I have over 400 customers, do you think I have time to call them when they have an overdraft?" Hello, you are talking over \$5,100 and what I feel was not warranted. And why, oh why, would you respond to the BBB that you called every day? We will find out the answer in small claims

Now to the survey. I wondered if M&T requested this online survey as I would believe they are not happy with the results.

Perhaps they do not realize what people really think of them. Unless things have changed since I first saw it on the internet, these were the results.

First, 31% never heard them. Understandable as the internet is far reaching.

Second 24.2% said they would NOT consider doing business with them. Probably former customers who have seen the light.

Third, 14.2% were favorable to them. These are most likely people who have not dealt with a customer caring bank.

The rest were smaller percentages that did not really matter.

I took the survey and of course was one of the 24.2%. I was pleased with the results and have not seen it online again. It made me smile and I wondered who was responsible for doing it in the first place. Wonder how other banks would fare in a similar survey. I would be willing to bet there is not another bank out there with that many people disliking them. Way to go, M&T.

Each LPA works within a specific geographic area – usually a county or municipality. The Program provides funds to acquire, rehabilitate or construct housing or to provide assistance to low- and moderate-income home-buyers and renters. Funds must be distributed in accordance with needs and priorities identified in the State's Consolidated Plan.

The proposed activities that are the subject of this Notice are Categorically Excluded under HUD regulations at 24 CFR Part 58 from National Environmental Policy Act requirements. The specific LPA Programs that are the subject of this Notice do not constitute every LPA Program that is proposed for inclusion within the 2013 New York State HOME LPA Program. This is the first tier of review in a 2-tiered process. The specific addresses of homes are not known at this time because the participating property owner identification process is ongoing. Therefore, under 24 CFR Part 58.15 (Tiering) and 24 CFR Part 58.32 (Project Aggregation), HTFC will use a tiered approach and once specific sites are determined, each site will be reviewed in compliance with the instructions established in the Tier 1 Review. No physical work will begin on properties until all levels of environmental review are complete and found to be in compliance. Tier 1 review addresses specific environmental factors for which compliance has been documented, regardless of specific site locations. It prevents repeating the same compliance factors on a Tier 2 site-specific basis, once all participating homeowners are known.

The following 2013 HOME LPA Program will be undertaken in this publishing area. An Environmental Review Record (ERR) that documents the environmental determinations for **this** Program is on file at http://www.nyshcr.org/Programs/NYSHome/ and the following location:

West Side Rehabilitation Initiative 2014, for purposes of the funds will be used to bring homes up to NYS Building Code, federal Housing Quality Standards (HQS) and to meet all other applicable state and local codes; funds will also be available to make modifications necessary for accessibility and mobility. Furthermore, special emphasis will be placed on making homes more energy efficient, and addressing Lead-based paint hazards.
