Celebrate Easter

Easter is a Christian festival and holiday celebrating the resurrection of Jesus Christ on the third day after his crucifixion at Calvary as described in the New Testament.

Easter is the culmination of the Passion of Christ, preceded by Lent, a

forty-day period of fasting, prayer, and penance.

The last week of Lent is called Holy Week, and it contains the days of the Easter Triduum, including Maundy Thursday (also known as Holy Thursday), commemorating the Last Supper and its preceding

foot washing, as well as Good Friday, commemorating the crucifixion and death of Jesus.

Easter is followed by a fifty-day period called Eastertide, or the Easter Season, ending with Pentecost Sunday.

The following is a list of area Churches and the services they are offering during Holy Week.

Assumption Church on Amherst Street will have mass at 7 pm on Holy Thursday. Good Friday services will be at 3 pm. The Easter Vigil will be at 8 pm on Saturday, April 19th. Easter Sunday mass will be at 9 am & 11 am.

St. Mark Church will have Mass of the Last Supper at 7 pm on Holy Thursday. The Easter Vigil will be at 8 pm on Saturday, April 19th.

Easter Sunday mass will be celebrated at 9:00 am and 12:00 pm.

Postal Service Tax Advice:

Mail Your Forms Early!

With the deadline for filing tax returns rapidly approaching, the United States Postal Service reminds last-minute filers to pay special attention to collection box pick-up times and Post Office retail hours on April 15th.

Most Post Offices close at 5 pm and many collection box pick-up times are earlier. Post Office, Self Service Kiosks and collection box location, hours, and pick-up time information is available at 1-800-ASK-USPS or online at usps.com.

Offices with later hours include:

• Buffalo Cayuga Branch Post Office, 285 Cayuga Rd, Cheektowaga - full retail service and April 15th postmark available until 9 pm (Please note the Cayuga Branch is no longer open until midnight.)

• Buffalo Main Office Windows, 1200 William St, Buffalo - full retail service until 6 pm

• Amherst Branch, 5500 N. Bailey Ave, Amherst - full retail service until 5:30 pm

• Ellicott Station, 701 Washington St, Buffalo - full retail service until 5:30 pm

• Williams-ville Branch, 5325 Sheridan Dr, Williams-ville - full retail service until 5:30 pm

Here are some other tax tips:

• On April 15th, mail early in the day at any Post Office, station, branch or collection box.

• If depositing returns in a collection box on Tuesday, April 15th, double-check the pick-up schedule on the label. To ensure getting the April 15th postmark,

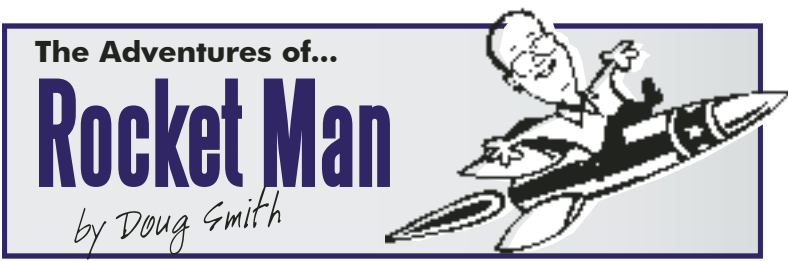

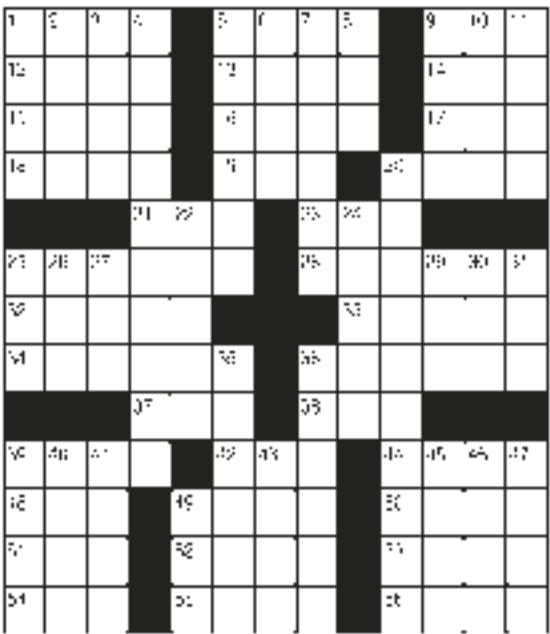

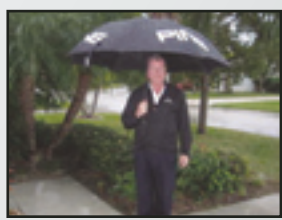

For the more serious readers, a season is a division of the year, marked by changes in weather, ecology, and hours of daylight. In temperate and Polar Regions, the seasons are marked by changes in the intensity of sunlight that reaches the Earth's surface, variations of which may cause animals to go into hibernation or to migrate, and plants to be dormant. During May, June, and July, the northern hemisphere is exposed to more direct sunlight because the hemisphere faces the sun. It is the tilt of the Earth that causes the Sun to be higher in the sky during the summer months which increases the solar flux. 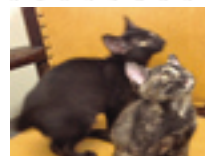

deposit returns before the last scheduled pick-up time.
• Stamped packages weighing more than 13 ounces must be presented in person to a Post Office clerk to comply with FAA regulations.
• Make sure your return is signed and dated and all schedules and supporting documents are enclosed.
• Affix the appropriate postage, especially since the item may weigh more than an ounce. Have a postal sales and service associate weigh and rate the item for you. Tax agencies will not pay postage due and your short-paid return will be returned to sender - and you may miss

the deadline (tip: 5 pages equals approximately one ounce).
• Furthermore, it is very important that your envelope has a return address. Short-paid items without a return address will be sent to the postal mail recovery office for determination of the sender, delaying its return.
• The USPS highly recommends getting the security of proof of mailing and proof of delivery of your tax returns -- use certified mail service with a return receipt, plus the applicable postage.
• Tax forms are no longer available at Post Offices. Check at local libraries or online at <http://www.irs.gov/> (Federal forms) or

<http://www.tax.state.ny.us/forms/> (NYS forms).
Please remember that mail must be deposited before the last collection time at the post office or collection box on April 15th to receive an April 15th postmark.
