Rocketman Shines in "The Sunshine Boys"

In one of Neil Simon's best plays, "The Sunshine Boys," the creaky, cranky ex-Vaudeville stars (played by Rocketman Doug Smith as Willie Clark and Bob Lohr as Al Lewis) are teaming up for a TV comedy special.

The problem is they haven't even SEEN each other in over a decade. Full of zippy one liners and inside showbiz jokes, this story flies along with a steady stream of humor. Good work also by Jay Wollin as the harried nephew, Alley Griffin as the nurses, Bob Putman as the TV commercial director and Rob Zahm as the floor director.

A hilarious Neil Simon comedy, directed by Jay Desiderio, evokes laughs from beginning to end. Doug Smith is the grouchy ex-comedian who is persuaded to join together with his expartner (Lohr) for a final reunion show, in the staging at Desiderio's Dinner Theatre, 5827 Broadway, Lancaster, NY.

Jay Wollin is Smith's agent and nephew, and the two have just as much chemistry as Smith and Lohr. I loved Doug Smith's grumpy character--he's just the same as he always is, and yet also very different. The meal and the show are outstanding and it is an evening well spent.

Alley Griffin's work has a lot of dimensions, literally. First she's avaudeville prop that the baggy-pants comedians used to call a "silentwoman," 66 inches of female in a 33-inch dress. Moments later shere-enters as a home nurse, a "visiting angel" whom Willie keeps telling to go to hell. It is an astonishing transforma-



dents the ability to - quite literally - print out their design solutions in a form of bio-degradable plastic.

After a design is created in a 3D modeling program such as AutoCad or SolidWorks, students can send the specifications to the rapid prototyping machine, and through computer control – plastic will be melted and placed on a platform (just like a desktop printer places ink

on paper) until the solid model is complete.

The Makerbot Replica-



tors, have the capacity to produce an article roughly half a cubic foot in volume, and will be shipped with multiple colors of plastic from which students can choose to print from.

The plan, at this point, is to use the machines in tandem with the seniorlevel CADD class, where students use computer modeling to solve engineering design problems. These additions will supplement the existing CNC mill and lathe, to produce physical models of the students' projects completed in class.
















The death of Buffalo Bills owner Ralph Wilson recentlly at the age of 95 is still being felt here in Western New York and in the cities of 31 other clubs across the United States. NFL Commissioner Roger Goodell said as much during the league meetings last week in Orlando, Florida. A moment of silence in a room full of owners, turned thestructured talks into a state of such emotion that one might have collapsed like someone has just thrown a flag.

Here in Buffalo, fans gave their thoughts about Mr. Wilson to anyone who might listen to their first experience with the AFL patriarch and gentle soul, who's kindness towards this City has been a lifelong mission since he bought the team in 1959 for just \$25,000 bills. Even though the team has been struggling to compete in the tough AFC East division in recent years, even the national media has expressed its condolences to a grieving city. "No one circles the wagons like the Buffalo Bills!"

That 's been the opinion of ESPN broadcaster Chris Berman for years now, ever since he watched our team go to four straight Super Bowls. He holds up a specially made red, white and blue Bills jersey with a circle on its back and the word "wagon" above it in a locally made film called "Almost A Dynasty: A Fan Story."

Berman is just one of the many local and national celebrities appearing in the 68 minute Buffalo film about the teams' four year run from 1991-94. Also included in the feature are such notables as former G.M. Bill Polian and Hall of Fame coach Marv Levy. Former players like Steve Tasker, Andre Reed, Scott Norwood, Steve Christie and Jim Kelly are just a few of the many Super Bowl team members who sat down and spoke to three local men, who decided to undertake such an ambitious project.

"We wanted to show the higher ups of Buffalo just what this team has meant to us, the die-hard Bills fan here in WNY," said Phil Gangi, one of the films' Executive Producers. He along with longtime friend Peter Tasca and Steve Butler began their quest in the fall of 2010 and in the span of two years, wrote, edited and distributed this awesome look at "the 12th man," a visual history of the team since 1960, and how this team was built for its Super Bowl run with the

blessings of owner Ralph C. Wilson.

Gangi, a Buffalo school teacher and baseball coach, found work upon graduation from Canisius College in Charlotte, North Carolina. While there, he was told by new friends exactly the way things looked from afar. He explains:

"They would say, You guys (in Buffalo) lost four Super Bowls in a row! Your team stunk! Between that and your weather, who would want to live there "?"

"So after hearing this, it's on your subconscious then, and on a trip home one year at a friend's wedding reception at a restaurant on the waterfront in July, you look out at a beautiful City and you say, 'It's time to come home."

Gangi, Tasca and Butler had no difficulty finding friends and family members who wanted to speak their minds about the Bills in front of a camera. The film is filled with local celebrities who also added their opinions like Van Miller, John Murphy, Jerry Sullivan, Mike Schopp, "Bulldog" Parker as well as former Bills players like Paul Maguire, Ed Rutkowski and Booker Eggerson.

"These guys graciously gave us their time once they heard what we were doing," said Gangi. "Lackawanna native Ron Jaworski remembered the seats his family sat in in the old Rockpile as a kid. Danny Gare gave us a perspective


