The December 1-3, 2009 snowstorm left incredible images on all of us. Every time it snows, our minds are filled with images of the hundreds of in, the safer you are. motorists left stranded on the New York Thruway. What if you were among those stranded, would you have been prepared? Would your car have been prepared?

As the representative for WNY motorists, I would like to offer simple steps you can take to

stay safe and keep your vehicle in good working order for winter driving.

- •Get a Checkup the better shape your car is
- Have the ignition, brakes, wiring, hoses and fan belts checked.
- •Change and adjust spark plugs.
- •Change the air, fuel and emission filters and the PCV valve.
 - Check the battery.
- Check the tires for air, sidewall wear and tread

- depth.
- Check the antifreeze level and freeze line.
- Have a tune up to ensure your best gas mileage, a quick start and a fast response.

What to keep in your Trunk:

- •Spare tire, properly inflated, a wheel wrench and jack.
- •Shovel.
- Jumper cables.
- Tow and tire chains.
- Salt or cat litter.
- Tool kit.
- Working flashlight and batteries.
- Brightly colored cloth.
- First aid kit.
- •Ice scraper and snow brush.
- •Mittens, socks, a hat and blankets.
- Wooden stick matches in a waterproof contain-
- •Non-perishable, high energy foods like unsalted canned nuts, dried fruits and hard candy.

•Case of water, which also adds weight to the

•12 volt charger for cell phone or electronic devices.

What to do if you become stranded . . .

- •Stay in your vehicle – walking in a storm can be very dangerous. You can lose you way, wander out of reach, become exhausted, collapse. Your car can be a good shelter.
- overexertion. Avoid

Attempting to push your car, trying to jack it up or shoveling snow takes great effort in storm conditions and can cause injury. Don't work enough to get hot and sweaty. Wet clothing loses insulation making you more susceptible to the effects of hypothermia.

- •Stay calm and think
- •Keep fresh air in your vehicle. It is better to be chilly or cold and awake Continued on Pg. 4

Bill O'Reilly's "Killing Lincoln" topped Rocket Man's Christmas list. He worships the 16th President and, for all his faults

and bluster, admires Fox News' bombastic Factor, who reminds him of Mayor Griffin.

Walmarting mid-afternoon Dec. 24, Rocket Man fondled a "Killing Lincoln" in anticipation. "I was going to get that," said a gentleman bystander, "but they told me it's all lies and inaccuracies."

Rocket Man had heard this song before. "Who's 'they' and what lies?" he asked.

"Well, I don't know, but that's what they all say." The gentleman was decently dressed and well-spoken, not ranting, but firm in his unsubstantiated convictions. He could not name one source, or one criticism, withdrawing into the comfort of vagueness.

Bill O'Reilly is easy to dislike, even by people who share most of his viewpoints. He's condescending, annoying, occasionally fires without aiming and

suffers criticism petulantly. Two Christmases ago he said Irving Berlin had written "Silent Night," a blunder of Billy Fuccillo proportions for a proud and avowed Christian, then belittled those who "called" him on it.

None of this, though, affects or infects "Killing Lincoln," a sometimes breathless account of the final weeks of Lincoln's life, before second-rate actor John Wilkes Booth pumped a single pellet into his head as "Our American Cousin" regaled a throng at Ford's Theatre. As O'Reilly describes it, had Lincoln laughed more loudly, leaning forward, Booth could well have missed.

It is a terrific read. Rocket Man confesses to knowing this stuff cold, including the theory that War Secretary Stanton hatched the plot. O'Reilly, to his credit, tries to snuff this fire, but it rekindles with a vengeance.

"Tell me something I don't know," he would have demanded of O'Reilly in an interview. He does. Nearly 100 lawmen drowned

Maryland swamps searching for Booth. The assassin and Lincoln had two degrees of separation through a comely society lady. Fascinating stuff, overwrought from time to time, but informative and instructive.

So what's wrong with this picture?

One grammarian flogs O'Reilly for saying Lincoln "furled" his brow, rather than "furrowed." He refers twice to "The Oval Office," non-existent until 1909. O'Reilly writes that Generals Grant and Lee never met after Lee's surrender. Evidently they did, to discuss prisoner exchange. And critics claim that convicted conspirator Mary Surratt was not treated as badly in prison as O'Reilly describes.

This seems considerably short of "full of inaccuracies." Even reporters of the time disagree on Mary Surratt. Rocket Man won't airily dismiss these nits but wishes that he, on the whole, were as accurate as O'Reilly, and as compelling. Compared to the likes of Michael Moore, who routinely flips chronology to make a point, O'Reilly is Gospelly true. In two years, Rocket Man will proudly bestow "Killing Lincoln" on his grandson.

Continued from Pg. 1 than to become comfortably warm and slip into unconsciousness. Freezing-wet or wind driven snow can plug your vehicle's exhaust system causing deadly carbon monoxide gas to enter your vehicle.

- •Don't run the engine unless you are certain the exhaust pipe is free of snow or other objects, Keep the radiator free from snow to prevent the engine from overheating. Run the engine at 10-minute intervals each hour for heat.
- Turn on the dome light at night but only when running the engine
- Keep your blood circulating freely. Loosen any tight clothing, change positions, frequently, move your arms and legs. Huddle close to one another. Rub your hands together or put them under your armpits or between your legs. Remove your shoes occasionally and rub your feet.
- •Don't expect to be comfortable. The challenge is to survive until you are found.
- •Make yourself visible to rescuers. Tie a bright cloth to your antenna or door handles.

Winter Driving Tips...

• Get the latest weather

forecast before you leave - check www.weather. gov.buf

- Keep a full tank of gas at all times.
- •Be sure you have fresh antifreeze in your car.
- •Clear snow and ice from windows, lights, hood and roof before driving.
- •Brake early. Brake correctly as it takes more time and distance to stop in wintry conditions.
- •Be aware that exit ramps usually have less anti-icing material than the main line and extra care should be taken when exiting.
- •Don't use "cruise control". The slightest touch of your brakes to deactivate the cruise control can cause you to lose control of your vehicle.
- •Don't get overconfident in a four-wheel drive vehicle which may help you get going quicker but won't help you stop any quicker.
- •Look further ahead in traffic than you normally do as a split second of extra reaction time can make a difference.
- •Leave room for maintenance vehicles and plows and stay back at least 200 feet and don't pass on the right.






