Remember Our Fallen Soldiers on Memorial]



Ceremonies are held throughout the United States on Memorial Day to honor those who died in service to our country.

The national holiday we now call Memorial Day was first named Decoration Day. Women used flowers

to 'decorate' the graves of the fallen soldiers of the Civil War to honor their service to our country.

Although there is some debate of the location of the first Memorial Day, the holiday was first officially

proclaimed on May 5, 1868 by General John Logan in his 'General Order No. 11.' On May 30, 1868 in Arlington National Cemetery, the first Memorial Day was observed when flowers were placed on the graves of the Union and Confederate soldiers.

The most important thing to remember is that we should honor our soldiers who gave their lives for our country. When planning this years Memorial Day parties or barbeques, remember our fallen soldiers in your plans.

In December of 2000, a National Moment of Remembrance resolution was passed to remind Americans of the meaning of Memorial Day. At 3:00 PM local time, Americans are asked "To voluntarily and informally observe in their

own way a moment of remembrance and respect, pausing from whatever they are doing for a moment of silence or listening to 'Taps." Have a safe and happy Memorial Day while remembering our fallen soldiers who gave it all for our country.

During patriotic holidays such as Memorial Day, it is customary to fly Old Glory. If displaying an American flag on your porch or a wall, be sure to follow flag display guide-

If hung from a staff, the flag should hang at an upward angle from a wall or porch. The blue area should be at the top of the staff with the flag not touching the ground.

Island's Jewish Homeland

Nearly 200 years ago, American visionary Mordecai Noah brainstormed a Jewish homeland, a "refuge," on Grand Island. He would call it "Ararat."

Unlike the Ark, it never got off the ground. Reportedly, Mr. Noah never even visited Grand Island. (Perhaps he got stuck in traffic.) Nevertheless, its cornerstone rests in the Buffalo History Museum. An administrator at the Jewish Center in Getzville told Rocket Man last week that every time she crosses the bridge with her family, she mentions that sliver of historv.

But now Ararat virtually lives. Two educators from Toronto, artist Melissa Shiff and her husband historian Louis Kaplan, visited last weekend, along with a small camera crew, to "augment" its landscape with what-if Ararat sites – a tidy synagogue, a movie theater, a billboard congratulating Ararat athletes on their success in the Sochi Olym-

As Kaplan explained, "Augments are generated

by Melissa and her team using the 3D modelling program Maya. These virtual models are then uploaded to a server and placed on Grand Island using geo locational software."

Last week they invited Rocket Man and his First Mate to eavesdrop in the shadow of the Byblos Resort, itself named for a Lebanese seaside resort city. On their i-pads and business cards, they showed the images of "Mapping Ararat." A few years ago, Rocket Man had shot some covered-bridge reflections through his driver's side mirror. That's exactly what these looked like - Utopia in a rear-view.

A card-carrying cyberdunce, he cannot claim to understand how this works. (That's why God invented grandchildren.) Basically, it's an "app," downloadable, for free, and providing a 24venue (so far) tour of what they envision as Mordecai Noah's dream come true.

Go to mappingararat. com but budget some time, it's addictive, some images solemn, some whimsical -- the Red Jacket Kosher

Casino & Spa ("lose weight, win money"), the Noah's Ark Theme Park (featured attraction: the waterslide) and a new movie musical. "The Wandering Boys," book and lyrics by M. H. Noah.

poles or similar objects, the flag should be displayed flat, with the blue area to the top left of the direction it will be viewed.

If hung in a window, the blue area should be viewable to the top left of the outside of the building.

The remembrance

poppy (a Papaver rhoeas) has been used since 1920 to commemorate soldiers who have died in war. Inspired by the World War I poem "In Flanders Fields", they were first used by the American Legion to commemorate American soldiers who died in that war (1914–1918).




Discount Card Program for Erie County Vets


Eligible veterans will receive a photo I.D. card which can be used at hundreds of participating Erie County businesses for discounts on purchases or services.



Over the Fence!

After a very successful opening day on May 3rd, the Hertel North Park Youth Baseball League is three weeks into what it hopes to be a great season. With the exception of a few rained out games last week, there aren't too many to make up yet.

"We're in good shape so far," said Don Morris, league president. "I'm not sure whether we'll open a week early again next year, but if we can continue to get these games in, we'll end the season exactly as planned, with a lot of summer left over."

That will be good news for many families in North Buffalo, where the league plays all games at Shoshone Park.

Six divisions are going at Shoshone now, making up nearly 40 teams. There are four boys' divisions and two girls' (pony) divisions. Three other divisions, T-Ball and Rookie for boys and girls ages four and five, are also in the Park twice a week.

In Minor Pony, a girls ten and under division, the Giants have won their first three games and lead a division of three other teams. Saturday, they beat the Yankees 4-3 while the Blue Jays defeated the Reds 6-2. Ella Valente had a big hit for the Jays as the team grabbed second place with a 2-1 record.

In the girls' 12 and under division, Hannah Murphy tossed four innings on the mound and helped rally the Athletics to score three runs in the bottom of the seventh for a 13-12 win over the Rockies on Opening Day. Two days later, Amari DeBerry of the Angels struck out ten Rockies over four innings for an 18-13 victory. However, the Cardinals have jumped out to a 3-0 record and may be the team to beat.

In the Major boys' division, the Reds have won their first five games. They stand alone atop their division with seven other teams and look to be an early season favorite. In their first


two victories against the Yankees and Dodgers, two different players blasted homeruns over the fence on the Butler Mitchell diamond. Max Schmarder did it in game one against the defending champ Yanks in the top of the first, a solo shot to put the Reds on the board. A 2-1 victory in extra innings made Opening Day great for this upstart team. Four days later against the Dodgers, teammate Sean Carey hit his first homerun ever at this level over the fence in a 5-4 victory.

In other games, Santino Hernandez led the Cardinals to their first win over the Tigers 8-4. The Cubs won their first two games on the hitting of Paul Humphrey, Jackson Alagna and cousins Eddie and Fred Pagan. Frank Williams of the Twins put the ball over the fence as well, a solo shot to lead the team to its first win over the Tigers. Luke Bailey had three hits to help starting pitcher Ezra LaForme on the mound.

In Second Minors, Dallas and Lincoln have picked up right where they left off last year. Both teams were in the finals last season and players like Jadin Mecklenberg, Isreal Blodgett, Damien Smith and Conor Bar-

num led the way in wins over Nashville and Sacramento. Brendan Parker and Kendall Wood both hit two run homeruns and pitchers Xavier Mann and Michael Cannavo combined to lead the Dodgers over Charleston. Also Saturday, Max Lafontaine got the winning hit for Sacramento in a 3-2 victory over Madison.

The Lil Devils defeated the Shamrocks 2-1 and the Rebels defeated the Angels 3-0 in extra innings. Jayda Perry, Bella Mattison and Emerie Ficcorreli helped lead the Rebels in Rookie Pony. More games next
