Flag Day Celebration at the Rotary Flagpole will be celebrated on June 14th.

Everyone is invited to join the Buffalo & Erie County Naval & Military Park on June 14th, at 10 am, for a Flag Day Celebration at the Rotary Flagpole (located at the corner of Marine Drive and Erie Street, at Canalside in downtown Buffalo).

This season marks Col. Pat Cunningham's 20th year as Park Executive Director and the first major event for Robert Pecoraro as the Park's new Deputy Director. This year's celebration also commemorates the Bicentennial of the War of 1812 and the resulting 200 years of peace and friendship between the United States and Canada.

Flying high atop the 100foot-tall Rotary Flagpole will be a 25' x 40' replica of an 1812 15-star/15-stripe Star Spangled Banner. The celebration will include A color guard from the U.S. Navy

Operational Support Center, War of 1812 re-enactors from Old Fort Niagara singing of

the U.S. and Canadian national anthems and a Flag Day poem.

The Pledge of Allegiance will be led by area veterans, with the assistance of 1st graders from Lorraine Elementary and 3rd graders from Frederick Law Olmsted schools.

Hand-held 1812 flags and commemorative programs will be handed out to all who attend.

The U.S. Navy's Maritime Pre-positioning Forces Utility Boat will be there as well.

Over recent years Rocket Man always wondered how the North Park survived. Even on a good night or day he and First Mate would count the house, multiply by the modest tariff and not come up with a figure sufficient to finance the bulbs on the marquee. The overhead had to be staggering.

Then last month the Dipson theater chain confirmed the obvious the stately palace on Hertel had been in the red for five years. That seemed a frightunderestimation, like its modest claim on the marquee as "one of Buffalo's finer theaters." Even shopworn and shabby it's been the best, in a league by itself, but there were hints that the end was near. Many nights it had just one screening.

As time went by (great title for a song), we had to occasionally question the North Park's choice of programming. "Best Exotic Marigold Hotel" came there second run. "Quartet"

never got there at all. Both centered on older citizens' struggle to get along. We had to trek all the way to the Eastern Hills Mall for "Quartet," which played for 16 weeks. Both those movies had the scope and grandeur which seemed, along with the subject matter, perfectly suited to the North Park.

On the other hand it did run "Argo," Academy Award winner, seemingly forever.

His and the First Mate's border collie upright at that unique ticket booth, seeking entrance to the dog-featured "Down and Out in Beverly Hills"...

Sharing a stage with Irv Weinstein for an Oscar preview, Weinstein sensing discomfiture in the audience and whispering "They're ready to stone us" into Rocket Man's ear...

Bringing the Firstborn from out of town for the very last screening anywhere of the 1995 John Sayles movie "Lone Star," exiting onto Hertel well aftermidnight

Coming into a nearlyempty theater for "The Taking of Pelham One Two Three" and, moments later, having the seat in front of him taken by Garfield Heard, then center for basketball's Buffalo Braves...

Commenting on the breathtakingly small costume budget for a movie titled "Sirens," especially uninhibited actress Elle MacPherson, and getting a scolding from the manager, whom he admired and always will...

The popcorn, always field fresh, especially if you came at 6:40 for a 7 o'clock show.

There's talk of new ownership, refurbishment, very hopeful. It's not that the show must go on, but at the North Park, it should. To lose the North Park and Holy Angels in a single season? Unthinkable.

North Buffalo Organizations

Although the Hertel-North Buffalo Business Association has been around for some time, it seems recent leadership has made it stronger than ever. That is very good for the area and all concerned. At one time North Buffalo had a number of strong organizations with substantial membership and many worthwhile accomplishments. The "Sample" store was the biggest retailer in the neighborhood and by far the strongest business. To have someone from the Sample was a no brainer to get the organization back on its feet. Worked out well, Mike served for years and being a good speaker formed a solid foundation for the future of the group. I personally followed for the next six years and formed many events to try to spruce business in the area.

One was a very successful art show, the Hertel Happening and the most memorable was the Parade of the Buffalo Bills players before opening day. Almost all of the Bills of that team were in attendance, including OJ Simpson. The players rode in antique convertibles for visibility and there were many,

many marching bands. Ralph Wilson was given a plague at the reviewing stand in front of the then Sample shop. The parade formed on the side streets at Hertel and Delaware and marched down Hertel to Starin. The Bills players gathered inside the car dealer who was then located where Burger King is now. It was a glorious day in North Buffalo and the first parade of its kind. It put Hertel on the map for the first time.

Another accomplishment was the building of four much needed parking lots on Hertel. Small lots but proved to be functional and necessary for the continued growth of the small businessman. Even to this day parking is and issue that should be addressed again in order to stimulate a rebound in the strength of the

With the moving of the Italian Festival from Connecticut Street to Hertel, needless to say, the two North Buffalo organization involved stayed viable and well funded. The North Buffalo Community organization and the Business Association are two of the three that benefited from the proceeds. The proceeds were intended to help the area in any

way the leaderships deems necessary. I am sure a list of expenditures is available to all who are interested to see where the revenue is spent. Off of the top of my head, I know the maintenance of the parking lots and Christmas decorations were on the top of the list at one time.

So again it is good that the Business Association is strong and the meetings are well attended. Any business district needs the people to become involved and contribute some time and effort to make the area a better place to



I don't know about you but all I'm seeing up in the Major boys division of the Hertel North Park Youth Baseball League so far this season is Red. Red as in the color of the Reds team which has gotten off to a great start so far. Currently the team has won their first six games, including a win over the Yankees, last years playoff champion a week ago Saturday.

Reds catcher Max Schmarder is one Major reason. The backstop has been like a watchdog over homeplate, protecting the octagon of infrequent travelers (opponents) crossing the dish. But in the Saturday game against the Yanks, he used his bat to lead the Reds to an 8-5 victory over the pinstrippers, who were coming into the game also undefeated at 4-0. In Major Pony games, Mia Trietly, Rachel Valente and Phoebe Elardo led the Athletics to a 13-6 win over the Rockies, that ended a four game Rockies winning streak. The Cardinals won their first game of the year with a 15-12 victory over the Angels.

In Minor Pony, the Yankees stayed unbeaten with a win over the Blue Jays and the Reds got back on the winning track with a 8-7 win over the Giants.

Senior Boys scores from Opening Day had the Yankees shutting out the Tigers. The Dodgers defeated the DBacks, 5-4. The Red Sox rallied to defeat the Braves, 8-7 and the Orioles defeated the Pirates, all games played on the new "Murphy Field."

The Senior Pony Pirates have won their first two games. They were down 7-2 in their opener with the Braves and battled back to a 9-7 win last Thursday. Saturday, they shut out the Yankees 4-0 and the

Athletics defeated the Angels to get their season started.

Frank Williams singled in teammates Mike Beecher and Ezra Laforme in the top of the eighth inning that broke open an 8-8 tie after six as the Twins rallied to defeat the Tigers, 15-8 for their second win in a row. Left fielder Hakeem Hicks made an excellent catch for the third out to send the game to extra innings.

In other games, Manny McClain went four four at the plate to lead the Athletics to a 16-8 win over the Dodgers Friday and the Reds topped the Cardinals.

PUBLIC NOTICE OF SECTION 106 CONSULTATION PROCESS FOR THE NY GATEWAY CONNECTIONS IMPROVEMENT PROJECT TO THE US PEACE BRIDGE PLAZA

Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966 (NHPA; 36 CFR § 800) requires Federal agencies to consider the effects of their actions on historic properties that are listed or meet the eligibility criteria for listing in the National Register of Historic Places. This Public Notice is part of the Section 106 public involvement component for the NY Gateway Connections Improvement Project to the US Peace Bridge Plaza, which includes providing the public with information about the project and its effects on historic properties, seeking public comment and input, and a consultation process as described below.

The Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), acting as the federal lead agency, and the New York State Department of Transportation (NYSDOT), acting as the sponsoring agency, are preparing an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) for the NY Gateway Connections Improvement Project to the US Peace Bridge Plaza. The EIS will identify alternatives to address the limited direct access between the US Border Port of Entry/Peace Bridge Plaza (Plaza) and Interstate 190 (I-190) and document their potential environmental consequences. The purpose of the project is to reduce the use of the local streets by interstate traffic and provide access to the existing Plaza at its current location. The primary objectives of the project are to address the need for direct access from the Plaza to the northbound lanes of I-190, to redirect through traffic from Front Park, to remove Baird Drive, and to provide alternate access from Porter Avenue to the Plaza.

Section 106 of NHPA requires that FHWA, in cooperation with the New York State Historic Preservation Officer (NYSHPO), identify parties to participate in the Section 106 process ("Consulting Parties"). Consulting Parties may include local governments, federally recognized Native American tribes, and individuals and organizations with a demonstrated interest in the project who may participate due to the nature of their legal or economic relation to the undertaking or affected properties, or their concern with the undertaking's effects on historic properties.
