The facility's location in Buffalo is ideal for many of the inner-city kids to take a bus for their riding lessons.

Then a fan came in bearing a scrumptious-looking beef-on-weck. "Wow, where did you get that?" Rocket Man drooled. "Over there, by the soccer field," the diner gestured. "It's quite a ways. You'll work up an appetite getting there." Another seatmate actually offered to bring one back; Rocket Man settled for the home-made chips.

The field itself is a beauty, brand-new turf, so that playing the game was never in doubt although it had rained into the early afternoon. It occupies the crest of a disused ski slope and youngsters who'd lost interest in the game amused themselves by rolling down the hill.

Bleachers seat about 150. The sightlines are beautiful, naught but trees beyond the outfield walls, reminding Rocket Man of the Mountaindale home of the late Catskill Cougars,


Not for anything, but after seeing so many dance recitals, I am retiring from that scene. First you have to pay the 20 bucks to get in. Many years ago it was







Let's get right out to Shoshone Park and get you up to date on all the baseball and softball games played in a "cool" Spring thus far for the Hertel North Park Youth League.

In Major Boys, the Reds have their undefeated season end with 10 wins after losing to the Cubs 3-1 Saturday. They have played some awesome ball up until this point led by Christian Torres, Jeremiah Chapman, Elliott Widenor, Martin Espinal and Ian Schillaci. They're in first place with just three games remaining followed by a strong Yankee team at 8-2, who have lost both of their games to the Reds. This past week they topped both the Dodgers and Twins on strong pitching by Connor McKendry and Santino Turello.

The Cubs are led by Javiar Rosa, Jackson Alagna and Fred Pagan. Another Pagan, cousin Ed, has helped the teamto a 7-2 record at this writing and on a five game win streak, including the win over the Reds.

Santino Hernandez hit a solo homerun over the fence in left centerfield in extra innings to tie a game at 3-3 and two batters later, Tim O'Rourke knocked in teammate Zack Bradshaw from third base with the go-ahead run for the Cardinals 4-3, come from behind victory over the Athletics Saturday morning. The Cards have won three of their last four and stand at 6-5. The Dodgers, Twins and Tigers round out the division but on any given day, an upset might happen before the playoffs start.

In Major Pony, the girls were back in action after a two week layoff. The Cardinals are undefeated at 5-0 as they defeated the Athletics. But watch out for the Rockies, led by pitcher McKenna Horne who came in relief for three innings and ended a 16-12 victory over the Angels Saturday. The Rockies are an even 4-4 and have won four of their last five games.


