## The Muckdogs Survive

The future is clear for Batavia baseball. Not bright, but clear. The Muckdogs opened at home last week certain it wasn't the first notes of their swan song. Presence through 2014 seems assured.

Thereafter, the road may well take them home to West Virginia. The New York-Pennsylvania League itself has announced that it will place a franchise in Morgantown, home of West Virginia University just south of Pittsburgh, in 2015. It's a done deal. The league says it selected the franchise for the move. They've got a secret.

Batavia, last in the league in attendance, likeliest seems the candidate. Some say Jamestown. Conspiracy theorists suggest that the Jammers' new affiliation with Pittsburgh sets that franchise up for a move into Pirateinfested waters, and Rich Baseball, which operates Jamestown, did move its Class AA operation from Wichita to Arkansas some years ago. This year those Arkansas "Naturals" will play host to the Texas

League All-Star Game.

Speaking of Class AA, there's the matter of the Class AA Eastern League, on the verge of granting a franchise to Ottawa for 2015, with either Erie or Binghamton moving in. Both cities lie well within the NY-P's sasquatch-sized footprint and it's generally felt that one of its less robust franchises would move there. Both cities have NY-P histories.

But for now, all is secure at Batavia, which rolled out the red carpet, however muddy, for the Niagara Power last Monday. In a week when virtually every other New York State Collegiate League game suffered a ppd., Muckdog management took off the tarp and bade the game so on. "What we had there," said Power President Cal Kern, "was a crew determined

to see that the game was played. They just plain made it happen."

In the pressbox, Base Paths heard one Hornell team official tell a cell caller from elsewhere in the league, "You won't believe it, but we're playing."

For the Power, a semihome game at Dwyer Stadium Monday was necessitated because Sal Maglie had a semicommitment as a high school "rain date." Kern decided months ago to forego all risk and simply book Dwyer.

"We'd play here again in an instant," he said, and in fact considered trying a last-second rebook as the June deluge continued. Look for Batavia to not miss a beat in sliding over to the NYCBL when professional ball departs. That's "when," not "if." But the present is now and the 'dogs offer 38 chances to reconnect with this most fundamental and joyous sort of play-for-pay.

#### **Old Photos**

If you are a regular reader of this column, you are aware of my recent project. Sorting out thousands of photos taken and that have appeared in Rocket publications over the last 44 years. These photos were in some sort of order when we started in the 1970's. Then we moved from 277 Tacoma to 2507 Delaware. The photos were neatly placed in a box for the move. During our stay on Delaware from 1980 till 2010, the accumulated photos were moved from one spot to another. At one point in the basement, which experienced water damage back before the new sewer systems were added to North Buffalo. With each move they became more and more disorganized and less and less important as the years passed.

The move from 2507 Delaware to across the street to 2522 Delaware was done in somewhat of a hurry as the building was coming down. Needless to say the now thousands of photos are in disarray. So now into our move from 2522 Delaware to 1249 Hertel, we had to decide to either keep or discard these many boxes of old photos. It was my wish to try to salvage

them at least for the time being. One of the reasons was that I was able to spot some merchants or residents that I knew and who are no longer with us. So without much fanfare I brought them to the families of the pictured people. They seemed overjoyed as in some case they had never seen the actual photo. One descendent was overwhelmed to tears as she had few pictures of her dad in his establishment.

With this I decided not to destroy these shots as to some these images would be priceless. Now it is impossible to do what I did with this first handful of photos. I could not bring them to each decedent's resident or place of business, as I said there are thousands. So what do I do with them? With the new location on Hertel, right in the middle of where most of the photos

were taken, it would be a perfect place to have them on display for people to see. So I started the task of sorting and framing these old outdated photographs thinking someone might enjoy seeing them. The new location is in the midst of the Italian Festival and my thought was to fill the walls with these images. During the Festival we would open the door to the neighborhood visitors, who either appeared or had someone they knew, appear in the Rocket over the years. Sounded good anyway.


The task has been overwhelming and time consuming. Not only that but there are so many memories of days gone by, friends who have passed away, it is sometimes very sad. I am beginning to wonder if it is worth it. Not only the time involved but the mess it has created as I try to sort them into piles of categories. Instead of individual pictures I am trying to make them into collages of individual schools or merchants or politicians, etc. At first I thought it was neat to see some of the people as they looked 30 or 40 years ago. Some of the shots of kindergarten kids taken back in the 70's are now grown adults. Some are just great shots and it would be a shame to destroy them.

So the dilemma is this. I am the only one that can do this as most of the pictures do not have captions or anything written on the back. So I have to go by

memory and cannot put any kind of identification other than perhaps the school or group. Like Holy Spirit or Mt. St. Joes for instance or pizza places, bankers, etc. Again many of the people are no longer with us as I know this for a fact. So who would find these shots of any interest? The families of most of these people probably do not live in the neighborhood anymore.

As I stop at garage sales looking for cheap frames, or sit glaring at these ancient photos of my friends and customers who are no longer with us, I have to wonder, why am I doing this? Is this a gigantic waste of my valuable time or is someone going to be glad I took the time to do it. From the limited response we have had so far with the pictures in the window at 1249 Hertel, it is enough to keep me motivated. Just hope what I want to accomplish, is done by the Italian Festival. 44 years of the history in North Buffalo, West Side and Riverside in photos, many of them on display. If you have ever appeared in any of these publications, you may just be on this wall of fame. Stop in and see if there is anyone you can identify. Would make me feel better about what I am doing and why I am doing it. Otherwise our next move may find these photographs nothing but land fill.

# **Fireworks Handling Tips**

- 1. Use fireworks outdoors only.
- 2. Obey local laws. If fireworks are not legal where you live, do not use them.
- 3. Always have water handy. (A hose or bucket).
- 5. Only use fireworks as intended. Don't try to alter them or
- 6. Never relight a "dud" firework. Wait 20 minutes and then soak it in a bucket of water.
- 7. Use common sense. Spectators should keep a safe distance from the shooter and the shooter should wear safety glasses. 8. Alcohol and fireworks do not mix. Have a "designated
- shooter." 9. Only persons over the age of 12 should be allowed to handle sparklers of any type.
- 10. Do not ever use homemade fireworks or illegal explosives: They can kill you! Report illegal explosives to the fire or police department in your community.

# Fireworks Safety Advisory

Recently, the Consumer Product Safety Commission held its annual firework safety demonstration in Washington, DC.

Consumer fireworks even sparklers are illegal in New York State, but everyone should be aware of the hazards.

"Fireworks are mesmerizing displays that we all gather to watch each summer, but are first and fore-

most explosives," said Cynthia Quarterman from the Department of Transportation.

If you do plan to use consumer fireworks, keep these tips in mind: Always set them on a dry, flat surface. Never bend over devices while lighting them. Don't ever pick up a dud. Always have water on hand.

Illegally manufactured explosives are typically sold at

the same locations as consumer fireworks.

"The differences, again, will be there will likely be a fuse or waxy type item that leads towards the device itself. There will be less likely any type of manufacturing directions and consumers should avoid those," said an explosive expert with the US Consumer Product Safety Commission.
