Meet the Buffalo 14216ers

Rocket Man braved an icy forecast two Saturdays ago to catch a game involving the Buffalo 716ers, a minor-league basketball team named for its area code.

The 716ers thrashed a team from Virginia by 141-80, scoring more than 30 points in each quarter, the Premier League's greatest margin of victory this year. The team takes a 3-and-4 record into this Saturday's 2 p.m. matchup with the Carolina Pee Dees, named for that region's mightiest river, as if the Buffalo team was known as the Buffalo Niagaras.

Rocket Man came away greatly impressed with the hospitality evident in the Tapestry School gym, which is almost ideal for basketball of this sort, even if the three-point line is a bit difficult to make out. When first he beheld Tapestry a couple years ago, he felt it nearly ideal for minor-league basketball, commodious, yet cozy, and handy to public transportation on Great Arrow just west of Delaware Ave. Afterwards several fans happily volunteered to walk him through the icv grease back to his car.

Surely the price is right, \$7. Rocket Man prefers the backrest of the rear rows but courtsides, the Spike Lee and Jack Nicholson seats, go for the same. Lunch cost him \$3, right at his seat.

Buffalo's minor-league basketball history is beyond checkered. It goes back about nine years, to an American Association team coached by the redoubtable Richard Jacobs of Medaille College. The team, the Rapids, opened before a turnaway crowd at Erie Community College, losing by a couple of points. Within a month, ECC had ejected the team in some sort of personality clash, and a month later the owner, ironically named Nice, retreated to Arizona amid a trail of unpaid bills.

Since then there've been at least six different ownerships, three leagues and, by Rocket Man's count, 10 different homes. The Premier is a relatively stable league and it's the first time ever that a Buffalo team has played in the same locale under the same owner.

That would be Tawan Slaughter, who averaged close to 40 points per game through a breathtaking high school career. She's also the coach and owns a franchise in Erie, PA. The players seem to revere her. She certainly knows how to distribute floor time vs. Lynchburg, ten 716ers scored eight points or more according to Rocket Man's scoresheet which was often at odds with that official tally.

She can't be in it for the money. Rocket Man estimated the gate at \$1,500, at most. That can barely cover the officiating, mostly winks and nods, resulting in a game fairly described as vertical rugby. Nobody, though, got out of control and Rocket Man has no idea what provoked three technical fouls.

Ms. Slaughter can be proud of her skilled and unselfish charges. North Buffalo, too. As the team seems so well settled in, why not go the rest of the way and give 'em the local ZIP code? (Or, dare we hope, Buffalo Rockets!)

Professionals and ThoseThat Are Not So True

In our daily lives we come in contact with a lot of professional people. Doctors, lawyers, bankers, and even professional athletes. We find that some are very good and some just do not care. Take doctors, there is one that I owe my life to. Then there are the ones I met in Florida when my wife was sick and in the hospital that were completely worthless and do not deserve to wear the white jacket. If you have ever had to use a number of doctors, you know of what I speak. Same for lawyers, some are passionate in their beliefs of right and wrong and then there are the non-compassionate, ambulance chasers looking for the quick buck. Professional athletes, some play for the love of the game and some play just for the money. You can just tell by the way they carry themselves and react to different situations.

Now we come to banks and bankers. We all need them and we all use them. In my fifty years in business I have used a lot of the local banks. Started with Marine Midland, if anyone can remember them. Moved to North Buffalo and banked at M&T on the corner of Hertel and Parkside. Stayed with them when Clayt Gerlach was the manager. Good man and I remember that Bill Swan, the founder of First Niagara, worked there as an assistant. Banking was different back then. You were able to trust the people that worked there to be honest and caring. I left M&T many years ago as I found Key bank easier to work with. HSBC made an offer I could not refuse so I was with them until they switched to First Niagara. Went with Evans, a more local bank, for over four years, until last year when for some unexplained reason we went back to M&T.

As the manager stated when we signed up, "a real bank". That is the joke of the year.

In the over four years

with Evans we never paid

an overdraft fee. In the

first six months with M&T,

no overdraft fees. Sudden-

ly, with out warning or explanation, in a little over a month they withdrew over \$5,100 in overdraft fees. I protested vigorously as there was no reason for any overdrafts. The money was always there but they had a way of making sure it was too late. I recall having a conversation with a bank manager, he stated that overdraft fees are easy money for the banks. They love customers who overdraft. In our case it was not necessary. When I asked the manager why he did not call to at least stop it before it got out of hand he said, "I am too busy to call customers who have overdrafts". Now do you think that a caring professional would answer that way and sit and watch it climb to over \$5,000? Naturally, I feel I was wronged and wrote to the Better Business Bureau, the Attorney General and the New York State Financial Service. Have gotten a response from the BBB but not the others. Below is the letter M&T sent in reply to the BBB. Like I would continue to bank with them? Now this is real class from the 17th largest bank in the country.

Dear Sir:

Your recent correspondence to the Better Business Bureau dated December 17, 2014, has been brought to my attention for my review and response.

It has been determined after thorough review of

your business accounts, \$4,992.39 in fees have been assessed correctly. It was discovered a total of \$160 in fees between both accounts were assessed incorrectly, and these fees were reversed. In addition, and as a goodwill gesture, \$500 in fees were reversed.

Further, I regret to inform you that M&T Bank will no longer be able to conduct business with you. This decision will have a significant impact on your accounts.

M&T Bank will close the accounts on February 16, 2015, as permitted under the terms of the agreement governing those accounts.

Please make sure you have sufficient money in each account to cover any outstanding checks and fees with respect to that account. DO NOT write any additional checks — any checks drawn on these accounts and presented to us for payment after the close of business on February 16, 2015 will be returned unpaid.

Any business debit or business ATM cards you use to access these accounts will be canceled as of February 9, 2015.

merchant/tenant. As per Buffalo City ordinance §413-50, snow must be removed from sidewalks by 9 am following an overnight snowfall. People who have a fire hydrant or bus stop adjacent to their property are asked to clear that as well.

As a reminder, the Post-

al Service is asking customers to assist their letter carriers by clearing snow around on their mailboxes and to provide salt and/or sand to any areas that may be slippery from ice.

Customers are asked to: Clear walkways of snow and ice and allow enough traction to avoid slips, trips or falls; keep steps clear of ice and snow and in good repair so as not to cause injury to the letter carriers or others who visit; and make sure overhangs are clear and free of snow and ice to avoid injury.

Please make sure the mailbox itself is visible and free of snow and ice, and make sure it is safely accessible for your letter carrier.
