

'Art Blitz' Slated For Hertel Avenue



The utility box at the corner of Tonawanda and Austin Streets was part of the recent "Art Blitz" that will be extended onto Hertel Avenue in North Buffalo.

Elmwood Avenue was recently the recipient of an "Art Blitz", courtesy of Community Canvases, by turning utility boxes and other infrastructure into canvases for local artists.

This public art project was a collaboration between Community Canvases and the Elmwood Village Association, and utilized the talents of local artists. Support for this project came from

Delaware District Council Member Michael LoCurto and Niagara District Council Member David Rivera.

"I am thrilled to be able to work with Community Canvases, the Elmwood Village Association, and so many of Buffalo's talented artists on this exciting project. I have always been a strong supporter of public art and I believe this initiative will further enhance the unique and artistic character of the Elmwood Village and the Delaware District", said Council Member Michael LoCurto.

A similar "Art Blitz" took place earlier this summer in Black Rock's Tonawanda Street neighborhood.

Slated for the spring of 2014 is Hertel Avenue, including the "Little Italy" section between Delaware and Colvin Avenues. More details on this will be available as the project grows closer, but it has been suggested that the art will stay inline with the neighborhood's Little Italy theme.

Community Canvases aims to serve as a public art and community development initiative for Western New York. It connects public figures, activists, local artists, volunteers and neighbors in an effort to beautify their community with public art that celebrates their diversity and history. 'A Life in the Theatre'

The secret word is "spent" in "A Life in the Theatre." As the play plays out at Jewish Repertory, old trouper Robert expands the title in reflecting: "A life spent in the theater." Aye, there's the rub. Define "spent" exhausted, as in energy; invested, as in time, or just, well, now in the past tense.

"A Life in the Theatre" casts Robert and John as repertory colleagues. Robert is John's mentor, antagonist, comforter and role model, quite maddening at times. "In our scene," he asks, "could you just do a little less?"

They are played, thoroughly and magnificently, by the nonpareil Saul Elkin and eager-eyed Adam Rath, under the direction

of Greg Natale. It must have been a gas on "Industry Night," when cast and crew from other companies are invited. The appreciation was no less robust for the well-attended show Rocket Man caught Thursday in JRT's cozy Seller Theater.

It opens with a bow. Elkin, keen to an unseen audience off stage, approves another curtain call for the play they've just finished, and fledgling John dashes back out. Robert, on the other hand, warms up and strides out regally, savoring the moment. It reminded Rocket Man of a yarn attributed to the late President Johnson, about the young bull panting "Let's run down the hill and have one of those heifers," and the elder replying, "No, we shall walk down the hill and have them all."

as a youngster himself, and it's intriguing how well, from that perspective, he sized up the semilaments of elder years. ("Who was that 16-year old who decided I wanted to be a dentist?," to coin another ironic lament.) Elkin has this down perfect, a performance with more layers than a good sandwich, corned-beef and in Rath's star a-borning, Rocket Man sensed a great settling-in. By conclusion, each has seen the other in himself.

It's a fine, funny play, and the snippets of scenes from the repertory border on the hysterical, a turgid succession broadly performed, surely the only ham in view at the Jewish Community Center, 2640 North Forest Rd.

Speaking of which, Meyer's Tel Aviv Café, part of the complex, serves superb suppers on certain show nights, particularly Thursdays. Rocket Man noshed on salmon pizza (this is not a misprint), First Mate on mushroom quiche, set up by basil tomato soup, finished with scrumptious chocolate chip cookies fresh from the oven.

In all, an evening exquisitely spent. "Life in the Theatre," every bit as much about the theater of life, closes this weekend. EIGHT ROCKETS (out of 10).

The STREAM & LAKE MAP OF NEW YORK resembles another map—known to Pennsylvania anglers as the "Lost Stream Map." The "Stream Map of Pennsylvania was completed in 1965 after a thirty-year effort by Howard Higbee, a former Penn State Professor.



Emergency Alerts in City of Buffalo

City of Buffalo residents can get emergency alerts via text, phone call, email

Last weekend's power outage served as a reminder to citizens to sign up for Buffalo's citywide emergency alert system - Code Red.

The system uses a variety of methods - text alerts, emails and phone calls - to warn citizens about potentially life-threatening events, including severe weather. Buffalo's CodeRED system informed residents about a major electrical outage that occurred on Saturday, and also warned them to drive with caution at intersections without working traffic signals.

"The Code Red system proved successful this past weekend, getting information to city residents quickly so they could plan accordingly and safely," said Mayor Byron

Brown. "If you were asleep or weren't listening to television or radio during Saturday's power outage, you would have received a phone call or text message from CodeRED with the latest warning."

Citizens who wish to sign up for Code Red alert should go to the city's website www. city-buffalo.com, and follow the link to the "CodeRED Community Notification Enrollment" page. People can choose which types of alerts and which delivery methods they wish to receive. Mayor Brown encouraged citizens to especially sign up for text alerts since they are quick and citizens generally always have their cell phones with them.

Last Saturday, the Code Red system sent more than 70,000 calls, texts and emails to Buffalo residents.
