The Canisius College Zoo Biology Program announces the opening of its ninth mini-zoo, "Amazoo: The Rainforest Connection." Located in Room 102 of the college's Health Science Building, at the corner of Jefferson and Delavan Avenues, Amazoo is free and open to the public. It runs Monday through Friday, November 11th - November 21st, from 9:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m.

Naturalistic exhibits

constructed by Canisius College students display 13 species on loan from The Buffalo Zoo and other sources, including the red-legged tarantula, giant Brazilian cockroach, freshwater stingray, red-tailed boa constrictor, green-cheeked conures, green and black poison dart frog, blue poison dart frog, amazon milk frog, red-footed tortoise, South American river turtle, fulvous duck, prehensile-tailed porcupine and the agouti.

The mini-zoo group project began in September. Students studied the principles of exhibitry and husbandry in class, at The Buffalo Zoo, and at ten outof-town zoos, which they traveled to throughout the semester. Based on their studies, students then converted a first-floor storage room and adjoining plantgrowth room into a simulated rainforest habitat.

'The Dudzick Retrospective'

The leaves are falling, the days are shortening and it's Dudzick season in the theaters of Western New York.

No less than four productions of plays by the Buffalo-born playwright will hit widely varying showplaces between this weekend and mid-February.

They represent virtually every "period" of the wise-cracking, theological skeptic, who in the 70s wrote the likes of "Make Your Moves with Confidence" for the Showboat at the foot of Hertel Avenue.

"It's amazing," said Dudzick from his home in Nyack, about 30 miles north of New York. "I don't think there's been this much of me all at once since Cimasi-Dudzick productions had five dinnertheaters going on at once."

It all begins Friday at the Alden Christian The-

ater, a fixture in a cozy schoolhouse alongside Route 20 for 24 years, with "King o' the Moon" for a two-weekend run. "Our founder, Kathleen Sutter, did 'Over the Tavern' two years ago and just loves the play," says "Moon" director Dylan Brozyna.

"Over the Tavern" took Buffalo by storm some 20 years ago, more performances at the late, lamented Studio Arena than any other play. Somewhat biographical, it depicted young Rudy Pazinski's struggle with the dictates of his faith, against his personal view that we were put on earth "to have fun."

"Moon" took the same characters further down the road, seemingly a challenge for a self-described "Christian Theater." Brozyna says that his troupe deals with the occasional "damn" ("the word is in the Bible," he notes) and that the characters all represent lives well intended, honoring the concept of family.

Then comes Dudzick's most recent work, "Miracle on South Division Street," which he will direct with a cast including Ellen Horst for the Kavinoky Theater Nov. 15-Dec. 8. Again, the plot revolves around an old-world East Buffalo family, the Nowaks this time, and what happens when the family patron's shrine evolves into the supernatural.

This marks "Miracle's" Buffalo debut, although it's a nationwide hit, with bookings as widespread as Florida and Wisconsin.

Shortly after Thanksgiving, Desiderio's Dinner-Theater in Lancaster stages Dudzick's first widely-produced play, "Greetings!" Rocket Man had the honor of appearing in its local premiere at the Amherst Players some 20 years ago, even before it found its way to the Studio Arena. Again somewhat autobiographical, it has an ad-writer returning to his hometown - Pittsburgh - to introduce his non-Catholic fiancée to an again, skeptical, family.

Two acts, five characters, high drama, comedy and redemption - it's a natural, and a favorite now of regional theaters all over the country.

Then, in case anybody missed it the first time, "Moon" rises again, Feb. 28-March 9 at the Lancaster Opera House.

Dudzickology - it all started on Hertel Avenue and now it's the biggest show in town.



Forest Lawn announces plans to plant approximately 300 bare root deciduous trees throughout its historic 269 acres on Friday, November 1 and Saturday, November 2 as part of its Landscape Renewal Plan.

Two hundred fifty of the trees to be planted were funded through a grant from the Community Foundation for Greater Buffalo; the balance have been donated by Re-Tree WNY, a volunteer program of Keep Western New York Beautiful. Re-Tree WNY is partnering with Forest Lawn in the tree-planting event, which begins at 8:30 a.m. both days in the meadow next to Forest Lawn's chapel.

During the 2006 storm, Forest Lawn sustained more than \$1.2 million in damage to its historic landscape: approximately 700 of the cemetery's trees were downed or removed; 90 percent were damaged and in need of professional care. Forest Lawn announced in March 2011 it had commissioned Heritage Landscapes, Preservation Landscape Architects & Planners, to create a comprehensive Landscape Renewal Plan aimed at "returning the forest to Forest Lawn."

As part of the Plan, approximately 4,000 trees will be planted throughout Forest Lawn over a 12-year period, eventually bringing the total number of trees to 6,200. Last October, Forest Lawn and

Re-Tree planted 200 trees along the inside perimeter of Forest Lawn, with the assistance of approximately 160 Re-Tree WNY and public volunteers.

The public is invited again this year to assist with the tree-planting project taking place on November 1 & 2. No prior planting experience is necessary; a brief training session will take place on each day. Tools and refreshments will be provided; however, volunteers are welcome to bring their own tools if they prefer. Participants are asked to wear appropriate work clothing and closed-toe shoes or boots. This event will be held rain or shine. Volunteers are invited to participate on one or both days, depending on availability. While registration is not required, it is appreciated. 




Buffalo Bisons Announced 2013 Recipient of Community Award

Ms. Fraser received a research fellowship this summer from Riverrun to study the Library's Little Harlem archival files which include both family and business photographs and program books. Located at 496 Michigan Avenue, the nightclub was started in 1934 by businesswoman Ann Montgomery Woodson to showcase aspiring stars. In its later years,

the Little Harlem was a meeting ground for politicians and community leaders. It was later destroyed by a fire in the 1990s.


