Protect Your Property from Halloween Vandalism

Halloween is a time for ghosts and ghouls and scary things, and sometimes the occasional vandal. To protect your property from being vandalized, Buffalo residents are encouraged to hang signs at their homes to promote the City of Buffalo's recommended Halloween trick-or-treating cut-off policy. Neighborhoods that have used the following recommended actions have reported a drastic decline in incidents of mischief and vandalism:

 Halloween is for children in costumes. To minimize the safety risks that occur when older kids go door-to-door until late at night, a cut-off time of 8:00 pm for trickor-treating is mended.

- Do not turn off your lights and pretend you are not home. This is an open invitation for vandalism and mischief. Instead, keep your house well lit and post a sign that you are out of candy.
- A strong adult presence will serve as a deterrent to potential mischief. Work with your block club or neighbors to have some adults patrol your neighborhood with flashlights in "strolling neighborhood watch teams," while other adults sit outside on their porches.

Should you see any suspicious activity, call 911. Do not attempt to handle the situation yourself.

"Old Jokes"

As Rocket Man's beloved Aunt Mollie's awaited her Final Promotion, she beckoned his ear to her pillow. He anticipated words of farewell or perhaps some advice on life as she had lived it so well.

Instead, she told him a raunchy joke about an Episcopal clergyman.

In the four decades he had known this remarkable spinster, successful businesswoman and feminist for her times, he had never heard an unprintable word, nor did he here, now, it was all about circumstances. With a bit of eye leakage he replayed this moment Thursday night as "Old Jews Telling Jokes" left 'em giggling in the aisles at the Jewish Center.

Five of the area's finest, some decidedly outside

the ethnic demographic (DiVincenzo, anyone?) took their turns unearthing comic spiels, some dating back to the original burning-bush campfire. Rocket Man traced one about a vegetable to the Reagan administration, another to Kelli Bocock-Natale's take on Sophie Tucker.

Some were new, at least to him. About a third could not be repeated in the Rocket, and a few wouldn't even pass the taste test at Hustler. About half drew on stereotypical guilt, angst, inter-generational strife and a preference for suffering peculiar to the subset of "Jewish humor." The rest could fit almost anybody.

A significant percentage unfolded on desert islands. Some personified pithy (lisp optional), others rambled on like dogs as shaggy as Sasquatch. Ingredients ran the gamut: D batteries, tax, ketchup bottles, sheep, teddy bears, feminine hygiene products, parachutes and a liberal sprinkling of bodily fluids. Rocket Man recycled a few at the hairdressers' the following day and was crowned a comic genius. They ain't brain surgery.

But the construction is. There is a theme, way

below the surface, about the capacity of humor to trump misery. This lesson is fervently taught by agile, mismatched jokesters - the avuncular everyman Saul Elkin, the scraggy and impish Robert Rutland, the inventive Todd Benzin, the beautifully aged-up earth mother Christina Rausa and, especially, the defiantly flat-accented Josie DiVincenzo, who in her last show here brought down the house 13 times in a very different way.

On the other hand, don't pack the knee pads, it's seldom slappingly funny. Rocket Man diagnoses a tendency to postscript the punch line with a shrug, a mumble, or some other concession that comedy has been committed. Rocket Man holds that the secret ingredient of comedy is brevity, total denial that a joke has been told.

Directors Elkin and Tom Loughlin may have encouraged this style, as a way of emphasizing the vitality of laughter in all our lives – and deaths. Aunt Mollie sure knew.

Rocket Man and First Mate fueled their funny-bones with another nosh at the Tel Aviv Café, stuffed acorn squash and salmon paella. Life is more than bagels and lox. "Telling Jokes" continues through November 16th at the Seller Theater, 2640 North Forest Rd., Getzville. SEVEN ROCKETS (out of 10).



Mashed Butter Babies with Parmesan

Ingredients

1-1/2 pounds Butter BabiesTM potatoes, halved lengthwise

2 garlic cloves, peeled and sliced thinly

1 tbsp fresh sage, chopped (optional)

2 cups chicken stock 1/2 to 1 tsp kosher salt 2 pinches pepper 1/4 cup grated Parmesan

Steps

Place Butter Babies potatoes, garlic, sage, chicken stock, salt, and pepper in sauce pan with lid. Bring to a boil, then reduce heat to simmer until potatoes

are very tender and fall apart-about 20 minutes. Drain vegetables and reserve cooking liquid (about 1/2 cup). Place vegetables in serving bowl and mash with fork or potato masher until smooth. Add in cooking liquid until desired consistency. Fold in Parmesan and serve warm with extra Parmesan cheese, if desired.
