In "Oklahoma!," Rodgers and Hammerstein declared that "Everything's Up to Date in Kansas City." This, then, with apologies:

"Everything's up to date in Skaneateles

"Although the date is 1842

"They went and decked the whole place out in Charlie Dickens' time

"As far back as they could likely go...

Skaneateles lies about 120 miles to the east and, at this time of year, about 170 years in the past. The waterside community's Chamber of Commerce some years back decided to raise the Dickens during the holiday season, building from the charming arrangement of shops along a four-block business district atop the easternmost major Finger Lake.

Already in the area, Rocket Man buckled up his Little Booster and lifted off last Thanksgiving Saturday. If it was even half what it promised, that would be plenty.

It turned out as joyous as Scrooge on Christmas

morn. First, he reported to the Chamber office itself, where, he had heard, 19th Century costumes were loaned out at no charge. It seemed too good to be true, but moments later he was "pouring forth" (another "Carol" line) in a frock coat and top hat. They wouldn't even take a deposit, although he did leave his own winter jacket as collateral. Little Booster, less extroverted, declined.

Immediately they encountered others similarly garbed. They ducked as a ghostly Marley howled out from between buildings. They paused to listen to a fully-costumed choir from a local congregation singing all five verses of "Good King Wenceslas."

They checked the "interactive" trunk show on the Masonic Hall lawn, a thrice-daily event staging "Carol" snippets as staged by Scarlett Rat productions. Within moments he and Little Booster were conscripted into the "rat race" to play a scene, Rocket Man as Scrooge himself, a dream come true, while the Booster demanded he contribute to the less affluent. "Are there no workhouses!," Rocket Man roared, with a wink and a nod to the ladies in the crowd.

Continued from page 1 and more time to spend at happy hour. People are also traveling back into town for the holiday, allowing for more planned and spontaneous get-togethers. Many of those reunions take place in a bar where large amounts of alcohol are consumed. Throw in some poor planning - such as not having a designated driver - and a fun evening out now has the potential for a disastrous outcome."

The following tips can

help prevent a tragedy from occurring:

• Plan ahead and be sure to designate a sober driver before the party begins.

• If you will be drinking, do not plan on driving. Even one drink can increase the risk of a crash while driving a motor vehicle.


Remember • that buzzed driving is the same as drunk driving.

• If you're impaired, find another way home. Call a taxi or a sober friend or family member, or use public transportation.

• Be responsible. If someone you know is drinking, do not let that person get behind the wheel.

• If you see an impaired driver on the road, contact law enforcement. Your actions may save someone's life, while inaction could cost a life.


