Flying Nuns

Rocket Mom could not abide aggressive religion. She fired her own denomination as soon as she reached her majority. She abhorred televangelists. A little sign, "Trust in the Lord," hung above her bed. "That's MY religion," she would say.

Nonetheless, Mom loved nuns. She would dispatch small sums to the Dominicans in Elmira, asking prayers for people or causes or both. Eventually, Rocket Man and First Mate picked up that torch, making their own Protestant persuasion clear. "You sure have a lot of Catholic friends," observed Sister Mary Agnes, the convent's correspondent-in-chief.

Most in their 80s, they had not outlived their usefulness, but their aged building had. They would need to move to new quarters in Illinois. All 14 cloistered nuns, whose order required that a small door

separate them from visitors, would meet the mean streets of interstate travel, some by land, some by air. How in heaven's name would they fare?

Two weeks ago, their newsletter told us. Excerpts:

"The four of us who drove had clear sailing until they reached the outskirts of Columbus where they went about 12 miles too far and had to turn back...At the Motherhouse (there) the Sisters WAIT-ED UP UNTIL 9 P.M. (emphasis ours) for our Sisters to arrive...

"About 50 miles before Indianapolis, the air conditioner in the car decided it was time for a rest. We kept going until we were nearly roasted...even with the GPS we got lost in city traffic but finally arrived about 9 p.m."

For the flying nuns:

"In Chicago... they changed the gate to one that seemed miles away... changed the gate again which meant another long walk. After some time they announced that our flight, last one for the day, was cancelled...

"The airline gave us each 3 food vouchers for \$7 and a hotel voucher... We walked what seemed like

miles again because they said we could not use the electric cart because we did not have a request for wheelchairs, which did not make sense since Sr. Mary Agnes and Sister Genevieve were being pushed in wheelchairs. Anyway, we walked...

"We met in the hotel coffee shop for breakfast. The going rate was \$28 per person and we each had our three \$7 vouchers. A nice gentleman at a nearby table offered to pay for all our breakfasts but since we had the vouchers, the head waiter said they would be considered sufficient...

"(At the airport) we were told to go to Gate F4 but... they changed it to Gate 4B which was no where near Gate 4...It was a different style aircraft so the seating had to be adjusted... seasoned travelers said this kind of service is very VERY (emphasis theirs) common...

"Eventually we rolled away for the revised, revised, revised flight plan... When we finally landed in Springfield...the whole airport exploded with clapping and cheering and warm loving hugs and welcomes from about a dozen of the Springfield Sisters who had come to meet us."

There's lots more, a chronicle of enduring the indignities of an impersonal, dysfunctional system, with a smile and perpetual confidence. "Trust in the Lord." Amen.


Snowstorm

Most of the readers of this paper live in North Buffalo or above the so called snow band that dumped up to seven feet of snow. So we only got a few inches and had no trouble digging out or going about our business as usual. Problem was the people who lived in that Snow Belt were in reality, trapped. There was no way they can get out of their homes and even if they did they could not go anywhere. So many businesses like ours either had to shut down or work with a limited staff.

We were lucky and could only imagine what was happening just a few miles away. I have two sons and a daughter that live within the confines of that snow band that passed. One lives in Colden, one lives in Hamburg and one lives in Lancaster. All were stranded for days. My son tried to make it into work the day the storm hit. Now we have had snow storms before and he is very resilient and a macho man. No snow or sleet or hail is going to stop him from driving to work. He was turned around on Transit Road by the police and decided to try an alternate route. Huge mistake! Talking to him on the phone and seeing zero snow out my window, it was kind of hard to envision what was really happening. I told him to return home but he insisted he could make it.

You do not have to be a rocket scientist to figure out what would happen next. A complete white out made him lose the road ahead and he drove into a deep ditch. It was snowing at 5 inches an hour and he, being a tough guy who does not wear a hat or gloves and had on a light jacket. No shovel, nothing to prepare him for this kind of ordeal. What little traffic went by completely ignored him as most had their own problems. He did not even know where he was and even if he did, there was little chance help would arrive. His brother offered to come and help but that was impossible as he was located on the other side of the snow band. As he tried with his bare hands to dig out his vehicle it became apparent that the snow was falling faster than his puny digging. At this point being alone and stranded, freezing cold, with no hope of rescue, he thought he was going to be one of the casualties of the storm. He had bought the farm.






