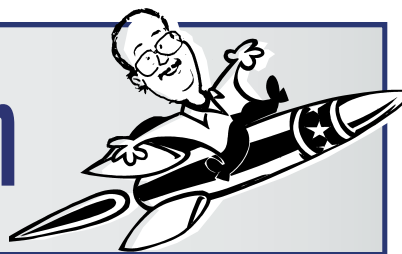

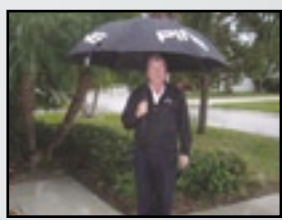

Northwest Buffalo Beat

The major news this past week has been the horrific automobile crash that killed famous actor Paul Walker. Someone that young, and at the height of his career, has made the story headlines across the country every day. Well known celebrities, mourning his passing, offering words to sooth his fans and family. With the big question of, why? How could something like this happen to two young men who, for all intent and purposes, knew what they were doing? The driver was experienced, knew the car and the road. Was this just one of those things that happens?

Yes there were two men killed in the crash. The other, who was driving, happens to be married to my brother's granddaughter. At all of the California

family reunions, Rodger Rogas was there. We often made it out to California for these family get-togethers. Met him a few times and we have talked, but I can not say I really knew him.

Seemed like a very nice fellow and very much in love with his wife, Chris-sie, who of course, is related to us. He leaves behind his wife and two beautiful children. Needless to say, my brother's entire family, and they are close, is devastated. To them, he is also a superstar.

The way that this accident happened kind of made me think of past experiences I have had as a passenger with the driver speeding. When you enter the vehicle do you ask the driver, do you speed? Almost always you know the driver and his or her capabilities. I know in some

instances I have chosen to drive myself instead of placing my life in the hands of someone who's driving capabilities I am not sure of. An accident is just that, usually an incident of which most times you have no control.

Recently not too far from my home, a tractor trailer crossed lanes and hit a van head on, that was going in the other direction. Taking the lives of the unfortunate couple in the van, instantly. The driver of the van was more than likely a very safe, cautious driver. How he was driving had absolutely nothing to do with what happened. The driver of the truck fell asleep. Often you hear of people losing their lives, not because of their driving, but because someone had crossed the line or ran a light or stop sign. So the point is, it is not always the driver and how he or she drives, but that sometimes you just happen to be in the wrong place at the wrong time.

Recall another incident where some people were killed on the I-190 some years back. They were passing a truck with steel rolls on it. As they passed, one of the rolls broke loose and fell onto their vehicle, killing them both. Talk about fluke accidents and being in the wrong place. Now how in the world would you even think that could happen in a million years? I know it made me accelerate past trucks with steel rolls.

Then there are times when you are trapped in a dangerous situation.

Remembered when we were in the Nation-

al Guard years ago. We would go to Wethersfield to an Army firing range to learn how to shoot our M1 rifles, carbines, and 45 pistols. It was somewhere out in the countryside and we would usually travel back and forth in a convoy of army trucks. That is 10 men sitting on a bench in the back of a troop carrying vehicle. If you had your own automobile they would allow you to drive yourself. As long as you arrived on time when you were supposed to it was okay. Went to the location in the back of one of those trucks and it was uncomfortable as you can imagine. So when a friend offered me a ride back in his vehicle I accepted. Little did I know what was about to happen.

There were four of us and I was in the back

seat. Now this was out in who knows where and the roads were not the best. It was a pretty normal ride for a while with us chatting man talk. As we slowly picked up speed, I noticed the driver was exceeding the speed limit. Then he stated "let's see what this baby can do"? He reached 102 miles an hour before he decided to slow down. Needless to say, that was the scariest ride I ever had. But what can you do? You want to slow down, but you are at his mercy. You can't get out, as that would kill you. So you sit there and pray, hoping nothing happens to end your young life.

After that when Andy offered me a ride, I always said no, I would rather walk. That taught me to be wary of who is driving and in control of my life.

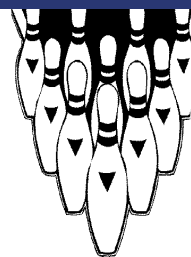
