#### 'Dai (Enough)'

Jewish Repertory Theater's new production will especially rattle those who have begun their evening with a scrumptious nosh at Meyers' Tel Aviv café in the Seller Theater's extended lobby.

"Dai," which translates to "Enough" (as in "let's not do this any more," as opposed to "thanks, but I'm really full") plays out in a fictional Tel Aviv café, named Iris, after the author. Simple tables await a demographic dozen, replicating the "real" world just beyond the entrance.

But at Iris, one visitor will wear explosives beneath his suit, and they will detonate, accompanied by the sounds of tortured bodies, shattered glass and twisting metal. Few, if any, will survive.

Even under ordinary circumstances, this would be an extraordinary play.

However, playwright Iris Bahr dictates that all 11 café patrons be portrayed by one person, in this case, actress Josie DiVincenzo, a North Buffalo expatriate (School 81, Holy Angels) in a single

act of about an hour-45. There is no respite. Even the requisite changes, in full audience view, demand choreography of costumier Ann Emo.

Actress DiVincenzo relayed to Rocket Man that she always felt she was "born to be on stage," but could she ever have contemplated such a task? First: a stereotypical snarly TV reporter. Last: a thoughtful Egyptian professor, a woman waiting to reunite with her son. The choice of characters seems random, but there is a definitive dramatic arc.

DiVincenzo must create not only personalities (and genders) but accents, both national and regional. Playwright Bahr puts two of the more intriguing back-to-back, the deepsouth Evangelist raving about the Rapture, and the Israeli "chick" (playbill's description), rapturing about the Rave. All are equal in the sights of the bomber.

Guided by three dialogue coaches, actress DiVincenzo roots out not only how they speak, but

why, and not always perfectly intelligible. A few are grindingly self-absorbed, but there's a chuckle when Jessica, actress on location, bemoans that in Israel, "all the women are gorgeous."

Then there's Svetlana, pragmatic Russian prostitute with the abundant client list, a skilled negotiator in her own right, and Rebecca, an American citizen volunteering for the Israeli army in search of personal satisfaction.

A boutique furnituremaker from Germany reminisces on a same-sex relationship. A West Bank settler from Brooklyn describes what he sees as Israeli's birthright in no uncertain terms.

Some are angry, some reflexive. Not all seem like good company, but the playwright makes no judgments and, under the direction of Saul Elkin, DiVincenzo vividly interprets their perspective.

Inside the Jewish Community Center, 2640 N. Forest Rd., Getzville, the flexible little Seller Theater ideally houses this slice of life and death although in truth, such horrors have become less frequent in recent years. Somebody get the message? EIGHT ROCKETS (out of 10) through March 3.

## 31 Candidates To **Be Naturalized**

U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) Buffalo Field Office Director, Sheila G. Embry, will present 31 citizenship candidates to the Honorable Leslie G. Foschio, United States Magistrate Judge for the Western District of New York U.S. District Court, at the Theodore Roosevelt Inaugural National Historic Site on Tuesday, February 18th, 2014, at 10:00 am. This year, USCIS will welcome more than 17,750 new citizens during ceremonies held between February 14th and 21st in honor of President's Day.

The Honorable Judge Foschio will preside over this special session of the

United States District Court and will administer the Oath of Allegiance to America's newest citizens. A re-enactment of President Roosevelt's inauguration will be included as part of the ceremony.

The 30 candidates for naturalization represent 21 different countries, including Armenia, Bhutan, Burma, Canada, China, Eritrea, India, Iran, Italy, Jamaica, Jordan, Kenya, Lebanon, Nepal, Pakistan, Sri Lanka, Somalia, Thailand, United Kingdom, Vietnam, and Yemen.

The United States has a long history of welcoming immigrants from all parts of the world. During the last decade, U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) welcomed more than 6.6 million naturalized citizens. USCIS encourages new citizens and guests to share their naturalization ceremony experiences and photos through social media, using the hashtag #newUScitizen on Twitter.


