"Beau Jest"

It's like seder theater, this "Beau Jest" at the Jewish Community Center, a comedy in the style of "Curb Your Enthusiasm" except for its impeccable manners, barely a wink, a word and a surgical procedure beyond a "G" rating.

In playwright Jim Sherwildly-contrived man's plot, kindergarten teacher Sarah (Mother Miriam insists she's smart enough to teach older grades) hires escort Bob in an effort to convince her parents she has a boyfriend as Jewish as they. This plays poorly with her actual squeeze Chris, who hovers like a Blackhawk. Their scenes are hysterically tense, pauses more pregnant than an elephant with triplets.

She's neglected to alert Bob that she's described him as a doctor, and further thinks he's Jewish. ("I'm taken for Jewish all the time," he says in his best Aryan.) Inventive and charming in ways reminiscent of the movie "Dave," his resume includ-

ing "Fiddler" and "Cabaret," he pulls it off. Well. Too well. As they say in the garment district, business is so good, it's bad.

He finds the Jewish rituals new and exciting, a discovery tour, while all the "natives" take it for granted, however devoutly. For Brian Mysliwy, the region's finest comedic actor for 15-plus years, this conventional role stretches his rap sheet of wild improvisations and accents. The nice subtlety results no doubt from his high energy, several decibels above the others. It might be his choice, or that of director Steve Vaughan, a master of stage combat.

Matt Snyder portrays Chris with extreme snark; watch him present his lady love with what looks like jewelry but is actually the latest (in 1990) dialing device. Adam Yellen oozes skepticism as the brother of the house. Mother Darlene Pickering Hummert is the six-pointed star of the show, her finest moments when she low-level flirts with the actor. Coo coo cachoo, Mrs. Robinstein.

The real-life parentchild duo of Saul Elkin and Rebecca Elkin-Young bring their own personal magic. Elkin and Pickering Hummert close the show with what seems like the last scene of "Sunshine Boys." Elkin-Young fully invests her Sarah with just the right ratio of disdain and respect for her parents.

A seatmate asked, "Do you find her convincing." Her, yes. The play, not so much. But...

A dossier of elsewhere reviews speaks almost as one voice - familiar material elevated by superb performance. Consistently, "Beau Jest" brings out the best in casts coast to coast. This can not be a coincidence. It continues through March 1 in the Seller Theatre, 2640 North Forest Rd., Getzville, and Thursday night patrons have the option of sensational supper at the center's Tel Aviv Café. Bon appetit - "Jest" deserves desserts.

Gronkowski

Many of us watched the last Super Bowl and some are happy and some are not so happy with the results. Before the game the afternoon was filled with pre-game hype and information. The one that hit home with me was the skit that was done on the Gronkowski family. For those not so into the game, Ron Gronkowski is one of the super star players for the New England Patriots and a major contributor to the success of the team. He is from this area and went to Williamsville High School before going off to Arizona for College.

The skit was about his family life in Amherst as he was one of five boys. Imagine five boys that size as he is 6'6 and 265 lbs. His brothers are not quite that big but good size boys. I can relate to the story as I also had five good size sons. All over six feet and none were fat but not thin. In the skit they told about growing up and how the five brothers would sometimes got into heated discussions. It is inevitable that the testosterone among males flares and the only way to settle it is to win a physical battle. A fight would break out. Yes that happened with my boys at times. Usually just between two of them and almost always in the house. The mother of the Gronkowski family was quoted as saying "that's why we can't have anything nice in this house!" What I would do was to tell my boys to go out on the lawn and have it out. I would referee to make sure no one got hurt. Never once did they do that and the fight was quickly settled.

There are nice things to remember about having that many boys. Only one played organized football but the rest had other interest, some in sports and some in music. Just that it had been a long time

since I had recollections of the boys when they were young and this stirred the memory. I do recall one thing that to me is now very touching.

Years ago there was a movie called "The Sullivans". It was also about five brothers growing up back in the "good old days". All five joined the Navy in World War II and were assigned to the same ship. Tragically the ship was torpedoed and all five died together. Since then, family members can no longer serve in the same area. The ship in our Naval Park "The Sullivan" is named after them. In the movie, like I stated, it was about them as young boys and the trial and tribulations of five brothers. It was also fitting as I had four brothers, so there were five boys in our family.

There was one scene in the movie and was one of the highlights to me as I had a similar occurrence. The Sullivan father was a railroad man and when his train would pass the local water tower, the five boys would climb up and wave to him as he went by. In the last scene it shows Mr. Sullivan saluting the empty water tower as his train passed it.

What my boys would do was wait at the corner of our street for me to come home from work. We lived on 15th street on the West Side, a one way street. It ended at Hampshire so you could only turn right from the direction I came from. I worked on Niagara street and not that far from home. As I turned the corner onto Hampshire I could see my kids standing on this corner in anticipation of seeing my station wagon come into sight. As soon as they spotted the maroon family car they would immediately start jumping up and down in delight. Not iust the boys but the girls also (I have three daughters). When I made the turn onto my street it was a race to our house which was located about two thirds of the way down the street. I would always go slow in the beginning and the race was equal. But the nasty streak in me would gun the car so I never lost.

I recall those times with emotion and when I pass that corner I still can envision my children standing there dancing and waiting for me. I was always under the impression they were happy to see me. Found out later it was because they were hungry and could not eat until I came home. I still think it was the former and even if it wasn't, I could pretend.






