Left Behind

Rocket Man wasn't there for the hard landing, but he sure felt the shock

"He won't stop crying," the mother said. "I'm done with baseball."

What had happened was, after a very successful spring season the distraught youngster had missed the cut for the 12and-under summer travel team. However, the roster had three players who lived outside the district, one more than 300 miles away, blatantly contradicting the rules to displace three who deserved to play, including the first baseman with Rocket Man's DNA.

Recent events in Williamsport and Chicago reawakened those memories. After winning the Little League World Series' American championship, unprecedented for an inner-city team, its Chicago-based organization was found to have tinkered with the boundary lines in order to acquire more talented players to which it was not entitled.

"Black Team Stripped of Little League Title," the Buffalo News irresponsibly headlined. Few others were this insensitive. The Niagara Gazette, with much slimmer resources, headlined "Chicago Team," which is all that matters.

Rocket Man cringes at the thought of this becoming the latest racial flashpoint, although Williamsport's history in these matters is hardly pristine. In 1957, an impoverished Mexican team encountered financial, logistical and procedural obstacles at every turn, many of them racial, notably in Alabama. It was a movie in 2009, "The Perfect Game."

Last summer, though, Chicago's champions were universally heralded as evidence that the game has refound its place in the inner city. For the grim realities, read "Hard Ball: A Season in the Projects" by Daniel Coyle. Skip the movie, though, it totally warps the motivations.

Now the other spike has

fallen. One player's mother insisted it had to be racial. Rocket Man doesn't agree, but if he were in her shoes, feels fairly sure he'd be saying the same thing, only louder. What did her son do wrong, she demands. Nothing, absolutely nothing. Like too many kids playing "organized" ball today, he's just the victim of some adult's fantasy. He played the game and his team won and nothing should diminish the pride of that moment.

But for every "ringer" added to the Chicago roster, one deserving kid, who'd worked years for the opportunity, missed out on the trip, the pageantry and the festivities of the greatest little baseball show on earth. Might his lesser skills still been enough for the team to win the title? He'll never know, will he? Chicagoans may cry prejudice or pickiness but it's the lads who were cheated out of the trip by their own officers who were "stripped" of their opportunity from the start. Who speaks for them?

We hope they're still playing. Revitalized by a Niagara Power Youth Camp, the kid with Rocket Man's DNA still is. Wait 'til next year.
