Weston Invited To Largest Math Conference In World

Anthony Weston, PhD, a West Side resident, gave an invited talk in the geometry session at the 2014 Joint Mathematics Meetings in Baltimore, MD, on Saturday, January 18th. The joint meeting is one of the largest and most influential mathematics conferences in the world.

Weston is a professor of mathematics and statistics at Canisius College. Weston's talk was entitled "Negative Type Properties of Finite Ultrametric Spaces."

In his address, he discussed joint research that he has been conducting with Ian Doust and Ste-



'Prescription: Columbo'

With Columbo, you never had to wonder whodunit. You witnessed the crime, usually an act of passion and/or greed. Then this shuffling, unkempt, confused little man showed up, encased in a Stone Age trenchcoat, concerned by that "one more little thing that puzzles me."

Just as Ann Landers was "The Lady with All the Answers," as Mary Kate O'Connell has so deliciously demonstrated, Columbo was "the man with all the questions," ranging from marital misbehavior to the intricacies of fishing a mud-bottomed

Columbo's on the case again, in Desiderio's Dinner-Theater in Lancaster, through the end of March, in "Prescription: Murder," the original stageplay, which starred the likes of Agnes Moorhead, Joseph Cotten and relative unknown Tom Mitchell as the cunningly clueless gumshoe. When Mitchell died, young, Bing Crosby was offered the TV series role, but it interfered with his golf.

The rest is history, spelled P-e-t-e-r F-a-l-k.

The task of tacking Falk falls to Guy Wagner, a seasoned Buffalo-area actor with a resume like a lifer's rap sheet. With his tics, squints and stoops, not to mention his left-handedness, he evokes Falk without replicating him, adding just a hint of Jimmy Durante, as well. One time, his cigar made an entrance before he did. Wagner's head tilts reminded Rocket Man a little of "Criminal Intent's" Vincent Donofrio, whose tilt was feloniously cocky. Not Wagner's Columbo, who seems to have been born puzzled and got perplexed.

The case concerns a conniving psychiatrist who shrinks his shopaholic wife with the aid of a fluttery actress squeeze. David Marciniak is terrific, analytically leading his character down a spiral of intensifying despicability. Although Sunday's satisfied matinee throng rose to cheer him, Rocket Man, fresh from church, was inspired to boo this poster child for the death penalty.

On an intriguing set that seems to make three dimensions out of two, director Desiderio has Alley Griffin as the doomed wife, haughtily wary of "destructive intelligence"; Hillary Rose as the actressy and reluctant accomplice; Katherine Ventresca as the efficient receptionist and Jay Wollin, particularly effective in a short, well-spoken role of a prosecutor and family friend.

This is such a period piece, director Jay Desiderio could install rabbit ears as table decorations. Phones are dialed and Columbo might be stymied in the field if he "runs out of dimes," as the doctor disparagingly declares. Everything's played at about 110 per cent and the six scene breaks make it seem almost like episodic TV.

No TV dinners, though. The sustenance is super, served from an abundant menu. At least two dozen performances remain, mostly Thursdays, Saturdays and Sundays at 5827 Broadway, before it gives way to "Sunshine Boys." And just one more little thing. It's situated next to the lowest-price non-reservation gas station in the area, so Rocket Man left with his tank full in more ways than one.

Protect and Serve

"Protect and Serve" was, and still may be the motto of those who wear the police uniform. When I was a youngster, policemen used to walk the beat and were always visible, friendly and highly respected. The respect was well deserved as these were the men chosen to protect us from the bad guys. The people we could count on to come to our aid in the event of a tragedy, problem or as a victim of a crime. What would life be like without law enforcement and the ability to dial 911 and have help arrive in the form of a police officer? How many times have you had to call, for one reason or another, and the joy to see that blue uniform and the relief to know help has arrived? Situation well in hand as we know these individuals are well trained to handle anything. In most cases.

Unfortunately now we have surveillance cameras and dash cams and all kinds of cameras telling us things we did not know before. Not here in Buffalo but in some other cities and states, there are people who abuse the uniform. To put it bluntly should never have been accepted into the police academy. I recall some years back in North Buffalo there was an officer who fit into that category. He just enjoyed beating on people and used his authority to do just that. He was eventually suspended. Now this is not saying these people are bad, as most of them are really good at what they

do. Being a police officer is a tough, tough job and in some cases life threatening. We have experienced fatalities in our local areas. State troopers, policemen, and other people trying to enforce the laws of the land.

Even with that, it is still a much desired position and should be filled with qualified individuals. My grandson went to college for law enforcement and could not even get on the list here in Western New York. So he is in North Carolina and still looking and waiting. I say that as if this is the case, the individual who wears the uniform should be the one who best fits the position. This does not happen for a number of reasons.

I mentioned before the use of cameras to record videos of incidents that before would have never been seen. We now observe people who are allowed to wear this respected uniform, but do nothing but shame it. We should all remember the Rodney King affair where someone videoed a vicious beating of police officers beating on him. Now with cameras all over the

place we are able to see the good, the bad and the ugly. We see heroic deeds performed by the men in blue, the danger they have to face, and of course now the scenes of not so flattering events by those who abuse the uniform.

I recently saw a video of a policeman who pulled over an emergency ambulance as he thought the driver gave him the finger. What transpired was unbelievable. He asked the driver to get out of the vehicle. The ambulance had a person who was having a heart attack in the back and was on the way to the hospital with the sirens blaring and lights flashing. When the vehicle stopped, the paramedic in the back got out to see why. He was ordered to return to the back as it was none of his business. His problem was with the driver. He tried to explain he needed to get going as the patient was dying. The officer went ballistic








The North Park Theatre recently announced that it will reopen on March 7th.




