
This event gives inner

## **Obituary**

**Bonifacio Pratts 1912-2012**

Bonifacio Pratts, former West Side resident passed away at home 25 days after he reached is 100th Birthday.

He died June 30, 2012. Born in Arecibo, Puerto Rico June 5 1912. Was self employed as a mason, carpenter and agriculturist in his life time.

He is survived by his wife Juana, one daughter Maria Antonia and three granddaughters Edmarie. Anned and MarvEd, three great-grandchildren Chelsea, Christina and Owen. One brother Andres and one sister, Rosa.

`During WWII he entered the workforce at age 10, working in the sugar cane fields in Puerto Rico to help feed and support his mother and siblings. He didn't pass the medical examination to serve in the Army, but worked as a supervisor building roads in Puerto Rico for military vehicle travel and supplies as part of the war effort, then worked in a military supplies factory during the war in Philadelphia, Pa.

During the war years, he met his future wife, Juana and after three months of courting married her on April 23, 1944. He was 32 and she was 23. Only child, a daughter named Maria Antonia was born in 1950.

He passed away in the house on Dart Street that he bought in 1986. This was his only home in Buffalo, and his daughter lived just a few blocks away.

Until a heat stroke in 2007, he lived an amazingly healthy life, gardening, up keeping of his home and working on small projects of interest to him.



# 'His Girl Friday'

Hold the presses for "His Girl Friday," the Shaw Festival's gritty and hysterical lookback at print journalism's golden days.

Fool's gold is more like it, a pressroom full of reprobates, con men and agendas, all awaiting the fall of a gallows snuffing out a man convicted of murder. For many a Buffalonian, the comedy will be muted by memories of the competitive journalism which ended with the closing of the Courier-Express 30 years ago this September.

With its pell-mell patter, refried romances and portents of doom, it blends the best of "Guys & Dolls," "Private Lives" and "The Valiant," last spring's Theatre in the Mist hit, with just a dash of "Benny Hill." Jim Mezon directs in a slightly exaggerated style, so

that when the rival reporters begin matching mandates, it sounds like one of those parlor games challenging players to finish each others' sentences. While to the civilian ear, it sounds contrived, take it from Rocket Man, who's been there, this is how newsmen sharpen their wits - on each other.

But the gold medal for linquistic gymnastics goes to Wendy Thatcher's rant on women writers, downfall of society as she sees it, so afraid of Virginia Woolf that she'd put her before a firing squad.

The object of her disaffection is her daughter-in-lawnot-to-be Hildy, gleefully wrought with Niagaran energy by Nicole Underhay. Hildy has returned to rub her improved status in the faces of her former colleagues, including Walter Hill (Benedict Campbell) to whom she was once wed.

But the urge to report dies hard, take it again from one who's been there (and still is). Partly swindled, partly addicted (to the truth, that is), Hildy is dragged right into it again, especially since the upcoming execution seems driven by politics. ("If there wasn't an election next week, I'd have this on my conscience.")

"Girl Friday" is delicious staffed in every role, particularly the plodding go-fer Woodenshoes (Peter Mallard), the door-slammed Rev. Pickett (Kelly Wong) and Krista Colosimo as the tragic Mollie Malloy.

Therein lies the single rub of "His Girl Friday," that barely a minute after a sympathetic character takes her own life, the laughs resume at full volume. It's rather like putting the comics next to the obits, but like Hildy, we can't resist. Extra, extra, "Girl Friday" runs through Oct. 5, a Friday, as it happens. NINE ROCKETS (out of 10).

UB Archaeologists
Digging Up Buffalo's Canalside - For several years,
teams of University at Buffalo archaeologists from
the Buffalo Archaeological
Survey have conducted digs
in downtown Buffalo along
what was the Erie Canal.
The artifacts they've found,
when considered together,
help describe how Buffalonians lived and worked from
the early 1800s onward.

This summer, they're conducting a "public outreach dig" under the Skyway and invite the community to come down on Aug. 18 and 22, from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m., to visit the dig site, observe its operation and speak with the archaeologists and historians working there.

The site is bounded by Main Street and Hanover Street, east of the Skyway Pier. Hanover Street runs between Marine Drive and Prime Street. (See map here: http://www.buffalo.edu/news/13594.)

During much of the 19th and 20th centuries, Buffalo was a major international industrial and grain transport city, largely because of its waterfront and the Erie Canal, which cut a swath through what are now downtown streets.



## "Garage Heaven"

As I have mentioned before in this column, I was born and raised on the West Side of Buffalo. Born on 14th Street, grew up, (I use the term loosely) on Fargo Avenue and raised my family on 15th Street. So the early part of my life was spent in houses less than a mile from each other. Loved the West Side and thought I would die living there. But things change, people change and the need for other things change. If anyone has lived on the good old West Side they would know of what I speak. Lots of these homes are two familv. built back in the mid to late 1800's. It was sometimes necessary to go home and get a wagon to bring to the car to get your groceries. Now how would you like that? One of the things my dad would worry about whenever he left the house was where would he park when he came home. If my mother would take the car, he would pace up and down and look out the window checking out the parking. His biggest desire was to someday own a garage. That never happened.

Now, I had gone all these years without a garage and thought nothing of it. Well, I thought about it but thought it was far fetched. Then one day with the help of a friend and my daughter, I was able to buy a place with a garage. Not ever having one before I thought is was a place to store your car out of the weather. So that is what I used it for. Not evervone does that. Some cannot even fit there car into their garage, it is so full of "storage". The problem with my first garage is it was way back in the yard to its furthest point. No problem in the summer, but what a lot of shoveling in the winter just to get the car out.

We had owned an inexpensive cottage in Evans and spent the hot summers out there. In order to move into this home we needed to sell the cottage. To make the summer more bearable, we decided to put in an in ground pool. With the pool, the garage needed to go. So here I am again without a garage.

I called around to find out what it would cost for a new garage. I was surprised at the price. Fellow named Al at Atlantic garages. Their ad is still in this paper. In less than one day after the concrete was ready, the garage went up. Completely done and ready to use hours after they started. This time it was next to the house with very little driveway to shovel. This was like moving into a new house, clean and empty.

I now own seven garages altogether. My dad would be proud. Atlantic built three and refurbished another. Al the builder was old when I built my first one and was still around when they did my last one. He is no longer here but his crew is still intact. I am working on having them build another. Seems I now have a fetish for garages, AND they are all full.
