

#### 'Inherit The Wind'

When Niagara Regional Theatre Guild decided more than a year ago to stage "Inherit the Wind" this weekend and next, the fates bequeathed it little something extra:

A mirror image of current events.

"Inherit the Wind" dramatizes the 1925 "Monkey Trial," in which a Tennessee teacher – John T. Scopes – was indicted for the crime of referencing Charles Darwin's evolution theories in his classroom.

And as the play opens a two-week run Friday night, a teacher in Cheektowaga goes to court in defense of what she maintains is her right to refer to Jesus Christ.

That the playdates bracket the beginning of Lent completes a trinity of topicality.

In fact another local theater group takes the "separation of church and state" so seriously that it has prohibited any religious-based organization from advertising in its program. (That would be a real dilemma for the Shaw Festival, which this summer is staging two plays based on

the Salvation Army.)

"We pick these a year or more ahead," said board member Gary Gaffney after a weekend rehearsal. "We just wanted a good, solid drama that someone specifically wanted to direct." He described the choice as "a crapshoot," surely a word not in the vocabulary of the Biblebelting pastor he so vividly – almost frighteningly -- portrays.

Of the current Cheektowaga case – Joelle Silver was threatened with dismissal for posting Biblical verses in her classroom, and is claiming infringement of speech – "Wind" Director Fran Newton says, "It's the same thing, just from the other side."

He and his lead actors – St. Joe's teacher Steve Jakiel as defense attorney Drummond, Niagara Falls comicbook czar Paul Benes as fiery prosecutor Brady and Michael Breen as the cynical big-city reporter Hornbeck – sit around discussing who'd answer roll call in "Inherit's" courtroom today.

One suggested lineup:

Alan Dershowitz vs. Michele Bachmann, mediated by Bill O'Reilly.

Written in the mid-50s as a rebuttal to McCarthyism, "Wind" takes considerable license with the Scopes case, adding a love interest, the preacher's daughter with a passion for a defendant. Niagara University grad Maria Nicole Held, a disciple of the late Brother Augustine, has brought breathtaking charm to the character in rehearsals. Andrew Polino emanates a heartfelt pragmatism as the teacher, branded as a heathen but claiming to believe in "a larger miracle."

Also prominent - Randy Rumley as the illiterate but outspoken Elijah, Eric Bloom as a justice who knows which side his gown is gilded on, Tom Durham as the benevolent bailiff, Brendan Cunningham as the self-important mayor, Rich LaBend as the voice of radio, an innovation in the time period, Alex Robinson has the homegrown district attorney and Dawn Marcolini Newton as the worried wife whom Brady affectionately calls "mother."

(Rocket Man walks on as a haberdasher; the scenery has more lines than he has.)





listener. Even if you don't understand why your kids are upset, be empathetic. Put yourself in their shoes. Imagine how they must feel. Respond with empathy.

9. Show love through communication. Ask how they are doing, what kind of day they had, how was school? Ask questions that involve more than a yes or no answer and be a great active, empathetic listener when communicating with children.

10. Teach kids to remain their authentic self and share their inner joy and light. We need to teach kids to hold onto their lightness.

11. Teach kids to be compassionate with ran-

dom acts of kindness. Get kids involved in volunteering at an early age. When kids perform random acts of kindness they feel more respect for themselves and get a boost of happiness.

12. Teach your kids to love healthy foods by eating meals together. Let your kids be involved in the process. They can help make the menu, help with food shopping and even cooking. The more involved they are, the more likely they are to eat healthy and enjoy it. Teach kids to respect their body which is their true home.

13. Teach kids that mistakes are good. Mistakes are teachable moments that move us forward into a better path.




