Parks in and around the city were filled with people looking for a way to enjoy being outdoors and in the snow.




Free Help with Tax Preparation for **Income Eligible Residents**

Eight Tips for Safe Snow Shoveling

A study published in the Clinical Research in Cardiology revealed that shoveling snow actually does increase the risk of a having a heart attack. The study looked at 500 people and found that 7% started experiencing symptoms of heart problems while shoveling snow. The cardiologists conducting the Canadian study felt that while 7% is significant, there could be as many as double that number given the fact problems with snow shov-

Today, the Snow & Ice Management Association (SIMA), the national nonprofit organization representing the snow removal industry, is suggesting seven tips for safe snow shoveling.

"While heart attacks may be the most serious consequence of shoveling snow, there are other even more common health risks including dehydration, back injuries, pulled muscles, that the patients may not broken bones and frostbite. have connected their heart But the good news is there (con't on page 6)

'Mr. Benny'

Here's a penny Valentine for "Mister Benny," resuming tonight at the Jewish Center in Getzville. Rocket Man, a Bennyphile since boyhood, was blessed to attend last Thursday's opening when Tim Newell, as another commentator admired, simply "disappeared" into the character of this universally cherished comedian who reluctantly ruled the airwaves through the middle of the 20th Century.

Full disclosure: In January, the Center invited Rocket Man to relate his own Jack Benny experiences. He noted then, that while he can't remember one episode of "The Lone Ranger" or "Jack Armstrong, All-American Boy," he knows where he was (screened porch, Montclair, NJ) when Benny complained to chauffeur Rochester, "It's so slow behind this trolley car," to which Rochester responded, "OK, boss, you want me to cast off and hitch onto a bus?"

Rocket Man has reached the realization that his Cheap Gourmet adventures in the Courier-Express and on Ch. 4 were inspired by Benny's formula. "I owe him," Rocket Man told the throng, "And when I meet him, I'm sure he'll try to collect."

So clearly, he has a sharp bias toward Benny, but this would militate against Newell were he in any way to exploit or disrespect him. There's more to reincarnating Jack Benny than putting your hand to your chin and exhaling "Whellll!" In that regard, some patrons may at times think they don't quite recognize this occasionally halting, self-effacing, slightly stage-frightened man speaking from his dressing room before his first, and then final, TV appearances.

But the porridge was proven later when Rocket Man recounted for his First Mate - she'd stayed behind, indisposed - the evening's events. At Thursday's talkback, he could not differentiate what had been said by Actor Newell and what had been said by Comedian Benny.

Unlike the other commentator (this may generational), Rocket Man felt the best came after intermission, when Mark Humphrev's script explored the science of comedy, the specialists in "footsteps and doors," as he writes, who gave radio its cachet. The audience hung on every silence.

More than 10 years have passed since Newell and playwright Humphrey first dared dedicate their energies to a man, however beloved, who was beginning to fade from memory even then. In the interim, "Mister Benny" has been tightened (no pun intended) and toned. It seemed funnier the first time; this time, wiser.

For the record, the tightwad Benny was a façade. As either Newell or Benny said, "He made a LOT of money, and it meant nothing to him, writing a check was like giving away paper." So were the vanity and the violineptitude. What WAS true about "The Jack Benny Show" was that his friends loved him, and by final curtain March 3 at 2640 North Forest Rd., may their numbers multiply. Eight Tips for Safe Snow Shoveling

are ways to safely shovel snow," said Martin B. Tirado, CAE, Executive Director, SIMA.

Here are safe snow shoveling tips:

TIP #1: Stay on top of the snow. No we aren't suggesting that you make snow angels but when there's a heavy snow, the best advice is to stay ahead of the storm. SIMA recommends that to prevent snow and ice from adhering to the

sidewalk or street, clear the snow every few inches instead of waiting for the snow to stop falling before you head outdoors.

TIP #2: Wear breathable layers. Layering is typical cold winter weather advice. Wear layers of loose clothing so you can peal a layer off if you get hot. Avoid wearing heavy wools, man made materials or other materials that don't allow perspiration to evaporate.

Better choices are cotton and silk.

TIP #3: Watch your feet. No you aren't on Dancing with the Stars, but nonetheless, you need to pay attention to what's on your feet when heading outdoors to shovel snow. Wear quality outdoor winter wear such as waterproof boots with good traction. Good traction is critical to ensuring that you don't slip and fall.

TIP #4: Take a few minutes to stretch. Shoveling snow is a workout so you need to stretch to warm up your muscles particularly because you are shoveling

snow in the cold weather. Stretching before you start shoveling will help prevent injury and fatigue.

TIP #5: Push don't lift. Sounds like something a high school wrestling coach may say but if you push the snow to the side rather than trying to lift the snow to remove it, you exert less energy thereby placing less stress on your body.

TIP #6: Drink up! Water that is. Take frequent breaks and stay hydrated. You should drink water as if you were enduring a tough workout at the gym or running five miles.

TIP #7: Don't play in

traffic. Sometimes people get so focused on the task at hand they don't pay attention to their surroundings. When shoveling snow near streets, pay attention to the traffic since vehicles may not have good traction in the snow and ice.

TIP #8: Call and text. We're not suggesting that you make calls and text while shoveling snow, but it is important to have your cell phone on you so you can make a call in the event of an emergency.

Following these tips will help ensure that you survive and thrive through winter 2012-2013.
