D'Youville's Downtown Stadium

All set for the big doings this weekend at the downtown stadium? Well, maybe it's not EXACTLY downtown, but you can see it from there.

D'Youville College, which within memory practically had to bribe teams to come visit because of its limited athletic facilities, has a gorgeous new ballpark at the foot of Porter Avenue. Perhaps you've seen it and driven right by, Rocket Man spent an anxious half-hour looking for it one chilly Saturday.

While the complex opened last fall for such rectangular sports as soccer, this weekend it comes into its own. By dint of winning the Allegheny Mountain Collegiate Conference championship, softball D'Youville gets to host the tournament, the winner of which moves on to the

NCAA's May Madness.

It's probably just Rocket Man's preference for diamond sports, but softball simply seems like God's intended purpose for the complex, backed largely by a still-anonymous benefactor. It's an eye-catching little field, gleaming green artificial turf with a red-and-black scoreboard looming over a huge fence in right. The height of the "Spartan Screen" creates the illusion of a "short porch," but Athletic Director Brian Cavanaugh testifies that at 195 feet, it's jake with the NCAA.

Bleachers seat maybe 100, beneath a small but efficient pressbox. There's plenty of hanger-on space along fences beyond the dugouts. Buffalo's modest skyline looms beyond left field and Lake Erie provides permanent air-condi-

tioning, not always to the comfort of fans.

This will not be the complex's first invasion. About three weeks ago several teams, including Hamburg's Hilbert, had to concede that their own fields were unplayable. D'Youville played host to them all, including two from Southwestern Pennsylvania.

The AMCC has four big state schools from Pennsylvania, along with six largely Catholic institutions. Its teams frequently make it past the first round in the NCAA's Division III. Against this stellar opposition, the Spartans have won 23 games out of 30, with a roster of players all from within 100 miles of Buffalo. Hot-hitting Lydia Monin, related to one of Buffalo's pioneering women sports writers unless Rocket Man misses his guess, attended the Tapestry Charter. Hotpitching Kalie McHenry -19-4 with 136 strikeouts in 147 innings – went to high school at Sweet Home.

The fun begins Friday morning at 10, a doubleelimination tournament continuing through Sunday. D'Youville plays its first game Friday at 4. Action resumes Saturday at 9, with games on twohour intervals, and if darkness creeps over the Peace Bridge, the lights come on. Beautiful. Parking is easy. The concessions stands will be open, appropriate to the locale, at one time Ted's Hot Dogs.

Let the games begin.

Elmwood-Bidwell Farmers Market to Kick Off 17th Season on May 9th

An enhanced EBT program, three new vendors. talented local entertainers and two Wellness Weekends will highlight the 2015 season at the Elm-**Farmers** wood-Bidwell Market. The selling season kicks off on Saturday, May 9th, and runs through Saturday, Nov. 28th. Hours at the open-air venue in Buffalo's historic Elmwood Village are 8 am to 1 pm, rain or shine.

A program of the Elmwood Village Association, the market features more than 40 vendors selling fruits, vegetables, baked goods, organics, fresh meat, cut flowers, wine, craft beer, eggs, dairy, honey, cheese and much more. Products available at the market are always fresh, seasonal and local. New vendors in 2015 include K&B Farm, Kindred Kreek, and Niagara Distilling Company.

Again this year, the market will act on its mission to provide increased access to fresh, healthy food by offering an EBT program and by participating in the "Double Up Food Bucks" and "Just Say Yes to Fruits and Vegetables!" programs. The market's Electronic Benefit Transfer system allows individuals and families receiving public assistance to purchase products from eligible market vendors.

The "Double Up Food Bucks" program is back for a second season, and will be available at the market from July 4th through the end of October. The program provides low-income individuals who receive Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program benefits with a \$1 for \$1 match to purchase fresh, locally-grown fruits and vegetables.

The Food Bank of Western New York's "Just Say Yes to Fruits and Vegetables!" program, coming to the market from July through September, is a federally funded SNAP-Ed program through New York State. The goal of this obesity prevention nutrition education initiative is to promote fruit and vegetable consumption. A Registered Dietitian will be present at the market each week to conduct nutrition education workshops with the public and provide nutritious recipes involving fruits and vegetables for participants to sample. The weekly recipes will utilize local seasonal produce and give participants "health bucks" which can be exchanged for produce from the farmers at the market. The program is free and open to any customers of the Elmwood-Bidwell Farmers Market.

"The Elmwood-Bidwell Farmers Market is the perfect place to conduct group nutrition education," said Sarah Stimpson, RD, CDN, nutrition resource manager at the Food Bank of WNY. "The 'Just Say Yes' program is fun and interactive and will benefit both the customers and the farmers at the market. The Registered Dietitian will give customers new recipe ideas for the produce available at the market each week, which could also increase sales for the farmers. I am thrilled to be involved with such a great opportunity in Western New York."

This season the market will feature local entertainment every Saturday from 9:30 to 11 am and 11 am to 12:30 pm, weather permitting. Three community groups will also host informational tables each week. Two Wellness Lane events - sponsored by the Wellness Institute of Greater Buffalo - will be held on July 18th and Aug. 15th. Visitors are encouraged to participate in a wide variety of free health-related activities.




