





Amanda Lynn's Law Passes Legislature

Amanda Lynn Wienckowski died in the winter of 2008 at the age of 20, and her body was found in a garbage tote on the City of Buffalo's east side. Her cause of death has long been disputed by her family and friends because of conflicting autopsy reports.

A.4085-A/S.2957-A has been passed by both houses of the Legislature. The legislation makes it a class E felony to conceal, alter or destroy a human corpse with the intent to prevent its production, use or discovery. A person would be guilty of this crime when there is a reasonable expectation that a human corpse would be used as physical evidence in an official proceeding, that an autopsy would be performed as part of a criminal investigation, or an examination made by law enforcement personnel as part of a criminal investigation. The bill will be sent to the Governor for final approval.

Amanda's mother, Leslie Brill-Meserole, has been pushing for stronger penalties for the crime since her daughter's death.

"I'm so ecstatic this bill has finally passed in both houses," said Brill-Meserole, of Tonawanda. "I can't bring Amanda Lynn back, but I feel that her loss can save the next victim. Now that this is a felony and not just a misdemeanor, a person will have more to worry about and may think twice about moving or disposing a body. I pray to God that there aren't any more Amandas after this legislation is signed into law."

The act would take effect 60 days after it is signed into law.


