The July 4th festivities at Canalside include kids' activities, food and beverage vendors, musical performances, and a spectacular fireworks display.

Erie Canal Harbor Development Corporation announced its schedule for Canalside and the Outer Harbor's Fourth of July Celebrations, which will take place on Saturday, July 4th. These free events will feature some of Buffa-

lo's best talent, children's activities, food and a fabulous fireworks display, over the Buffalo River.

"Buffalo's Official July 4th Celebration is expected to attract more than 20,000 people," said Erie Canal Harbor Development Cor-

poration Chairman Robert Gioia. "Choose Canalside or the Outer Harbor, depending on whether you like action or relaxing; both venues give you a great view of the fireworks."

Leave the Fireworks to the Professionals on July 4th

The Firemen's Association of the State of New York is urging New Yorkers to stay safe and leave the fireworks to the professionals.

Recently, a number of localities in the state have approved the sale of certain fireworks. Although some fireworks may be legal to buy and use, the Firemen's Association is warning that the possibilities of injury and fire are very real and is recommending that

you take in one of the hundreds of public firework

displays instead.

Thousands of people are injured while using consumer fireworks every July 4th holiday. The risk of fireworks injury is two-and-a-half times as high for children ages 10-14 as for the general population.

It's important to remember that the tip of a sparkler burns at a temperature of more than 1,200 degrees Fahrenheit, which is hot enough to cause third-degree burns.

The Adventures of...

Rocket Man

'I'll See You in My Dreams'

You may not cry a river, but you might sniffle a stream in the new movie "I'll See You in My Dreams," advertised as "playing everywhere," although only at the Eastern Hills Mall.

Spoiler alert: The opening scene has a faithful old hound being lovingly dispatched to "where there's nothing but dogs." Already Rocket Man and his Fran-

ciscan First Mate had endured the two biggest people in the little bitty crowd arriving late and plopping down in front of them, then having two even later arrivals of exceptional girth come in and sit down alongside.

Things got better. "Dreams" (the title refers to a newer version of the old standard) features breathtaking Blythe Danner and rumble-throated Sam Elliott, more known now for TV commercials, Danner as an actress with bone malady and Elliott as a touter of trucks.

While Danner wears her years like a silken gown, it was the response to Elliott that evoked wonder. Several young women - much younger - hooted and hollered when he came on fondling an unlit cigar. Later another young woman with whom Rocket Man worked similarly hyperventilated at the very mention of his name. Play it again, Sam!

As for Danner, her character has been long widowed. Probably as a matter of self-discipline, she sets her alarm (8 a.m., at Rocket Man recalls) every night 'though she's no agenda for the following morning. While living alone, fairly well off - she joins other later-life singles regularly at a senior-living center where they spin yarns, tell of frus-

trations and participate in the occasional round of "speed dating." (One particularly chewy character is played by Max Gail, thick-headed detective of yore on "Barney Miller.")

One day this admirably straight foursome decides to experiment with "medical" marijuana. The ensuing scene is hilarious, four Jamaica Golden Girls attracting the attention of the law as they lurch down a side street with a grocery cart full of snacks. Among them - wise-cracking Rhea Perlman and Mary Kay Place, she from another TV oldie, "Mary Hartman Mary Hartman."

New to Danner's life is a pool boy, sensibly played by Martin Starr, author of his own lame take on the title song, pretty much above board except that he lures her into a karaoke bar where she brings down the house with "Cry Me a River." This was the life she lived before marriage. She is clearly talented, and devoted.

Enter, then, Elliott, confident, competent and solvent. He, too, knows loss, a wife who left him, then soon died. "How awful," Danner consoles. "Coulda' been worse," Elliott says. "Coulda' been me." How prophetic.

Gentle and wise, "I'll See You in My Dreams" ultimately provides a primer on living with loss, and runs only a little longer than the previews that preceded it. EIGHT ROCKETS (out of 10).

dren's activities from 12 pm to 6 pm at Canalside, the Saturday Artisan Market at The Canals from 10 am to 5 pm and more than a dozen food trucks and vendors in addition to the Dish and the Blue Line. No outside food, beverage or pets will be allowed. Folding chairs and blankets are welcome.

Canalside isn't your only choice for waterfront celebrating on the Fourth. The Outer Harbor will have a beer and wine gar-

den at Wilkeson Pointe, which is also a relaxing place to enjoy food, music, paddle board demonstrations and kayaking. Visitors are welcome to bring a lawn chair, blanket and their own food and beverage for a picnic and make it a day on the Outer Harbor. It is an amazing place to enjoy the sunset and the fireworks.

Buffalo's best fireworks display, which can be viewed from Canalside or the Outer Harbor, starts at 10 pm and includes half

an hour of the most brilliant explosions of color blasting from 3,400 fireworks shells. The display by Skywriters Fireworks packs an even bigger patriotic punch when you listen to the all American music being played on MIX 96, programmed to sync with fireworks as they fill the night sky. The event's rain date is Sunday, July 5th.

Ever see something and wonder why? Probably hundreds of times and wish you knew the answer as to why it happened. Curiosity is most annoying and sometimes we look to see if we can find the reason behind the event or sighting.

Sunday, on the way back from Erie, Pennsylvania to celebrate my sister's 85th birthday, it was pouring rain. One of those rainstorms that produce poor visibility and the rain seems to come down in sheets. It was difficult to see the vehicle in front of you and those 18 wheelers would leave you in a monsoon. It was on the New York State Thruway of the I-90 and the speed limit is 65 MPH. My usual cruise control setting in that speed zone is 73 as I am under the impression a little cushion is allowed. That is not always true and one time, long ago, I did get stopped at that speed. With the conditions as bad as they were, I slowed it down and set the speed at 70 MPH.

The Thruway was not crowded at 6:50 in the evening on a Sunday so it was easy to spot a State Trooper patrol car speeding up behind me. Like most people I got that empty feeling in my stomach as I thought he may be after me. After all, at 70 I was still speeding. There was no flasher or red lights or siren, just going re-

ally fast at about 85 MPH. It was a sigh of relief when he passed me, I knew I was in the clear. Just then I spotted a car by the side of the road with someone outside the vehicle. Oh, I thought, that is where he was speeding to. As he passed the apparent break down I did see his brake lights go on briefly but the patrol car continued on without stopping.

She was on a cell phone and it looked to me like she was looking at a tire trying to describe the situation. My question is why did the State Trooper just ignore the situation without even stopping to inquire? I was under the impression Troopers are there to help, it is their job. At least park behind the vehicle with the flasher on to avoid a dangerous situation.

I remember in Florida I had a blow out and had to pull off to the side of the road on a thruway that had a speed limit of 70 MPH. It was scary and extremely

dangerous as the shoulder was not that wide. Not only did the Florida State troopers stop and make sure we were safe, they changed the tire as they knew AAA is usually pretty slow and had told us 45 minutes. They did not hesitate.

Where could he have been going in such a hurry to completely ignore this poor individual? It was at mile marker 439 going East on the I-90 at 6:50 so it would probably be easy to get the answer if you knew the right buttons to push. I want to believe that the trooper was on a mission far more important than a woman stranded on the side of the road, standing out in the rain. New York State troopers are better

than that, I know as my nephew happens to be one.
