Rocket Man

Pastime Gets a New Look

Rocket Man's rap sheet includes a two-year stretch as a Cubmaster. One of his charges was blind, totally. His name was John and he fancied himself an athlete, vigorously encouraged by parents who lovingly cut him very little slack.

The den had a swim team and John did quite well, his fellow Cubs hollering directions from the side. But his real forte was the obstacle course, which everyone had to run blindfolded. At Southaven camp, he'd barrel along, bouncing off trees and underbrush, thrashing his sighted packmates fearfully groping their way along.

"Doesn't bother me," he'd boast as leaders applied ointment and bandages. "I spend my whole life bumping into things."

Rocket Man thought of John last week when a pen pal sent clippings herald-

ing the arrival of Beep-Ball to Western New York. It is baseball designed for the blind, introduced to Rochester-area media in advance of its World Series, scheduled near Rochester two weekends hence.

Rochester Democrat & Chronicle columnist Leo Roth detailed the game after what he describes as an embarrassingly hapless afternoon floundering around in unaccustomed darkness. All players wear them, as degrees of actual vision vary among the legally blind. This levels the playing field, so to speak.

The ball is somewhat larger than a conventional softball, implanted with a beeping device. Also wired for sound are the bases, first and third (no second), five-foot foam rubber stanchions looking like the offspring of a tackling dummy and a highway road cone.

Fair ground between those cones, is divided into six segments, each defended by a single player.

A sighted pitcher - sometimes a volunteer, sometimes a "token" member of the team at bat - cries "ready," activates the ball and lets it fly. The batter swings at the sound. If the batter connects, another official activates the signal in either first of third, and the batter tries to run toward it. (This terrified Roth, by his own account, but the "Johns" in his team charged out as if rocket-fueled.)

A "spotter" calls out by number the area into which the batted ball has fallen. If the fielder in that area locates and picks up the ball before the batter finds first, it's an out. If the batter reaches base safely, it's a run. No rundowns, that's a mercy.

Rocket Man couldn't help recalling the games devised to accommodate the cobblestone streets of his single-digit youth in Youngstown, OH, just two bases, first and third, and a rule for short-handed games called "pitcher's hands." If the ball could be relayed to the pitcher, anywhere on the field, before the batter reached first, "out!" Ah, what arguments THAT provoked.

Final score: Anyone can play baseball, anywhere. And if you'd like to help at the Blind World Series, about 60 miles to the east, e-mail mcsportsco@gmail.com.

Additionally, the market's “Double Up Food Bucks” returned on July 4th and is available through the end of October. The program provides low-income individu-

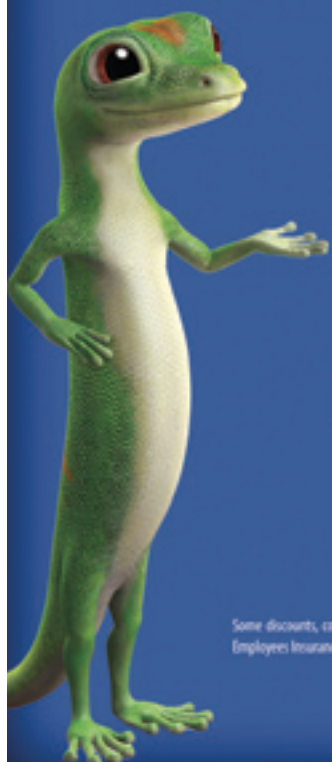

While Major League Baseball takes a break in their schedule with its All-Star game, the Hertel North Park Youth League continues on. Whether they host tournaments, play in other Parks or just continue to help bring Championships to North Buffalo boys and girls in its house league schedule, baseball and Pony softball go on.

Congratulations are in order for seven teams who have clinched first place in their divisions and are ready for playoffs with the best records. The teams are the Major Boys Cardinals, First Minor Tigers, Second Minor Pirates, Rookie Boys Yankees, Major Pony Cardinals, Minor Pony Blue Jays and Rookie Pony Rebels.

The Major Boys Cardinals, Tigers, Pirates and Minor Pony Blue Jays all receive a bye in their division in the first round. They await the winners of games that began Monday night. The Minor Pony Giants also await the winner of a Reds/ Yankee game before they can begin play. The First Minor Athletics shared the same record as the Tigers at the end of the regular season but lost in a coin flip to the Tigers for the first cede.

For the second year in a row, teams are placed in both a winners and or losers bracket for playoffs. Up

until two years ago, cries from the League community had made their displeasure known towards board members on teams being eliminated from playoffs after losing their first game. A single game elimination, just like the fourth and fifth wild card in MLB, was not fair in the eyes of most parents who brought their kids to Shoshone Park twice a week.

Once the calendar says July and school is out for the Summer, Hertel North Park helps most boys and girls with a great baseball experience that is not mentioned every year back in February or March, when the league holds its annual registration. It is the league's "secret pitch" to all batters who can come up with an amazing play either at the plate or in the outfield that clinches their teams Championship victory.

Unfortunately it can only happen on just two diamonds, either #1 or #2 but one is for boys and the other is for girls, so both have a chance to turn a youth league championship into a memory that could last a lifetime.

Both diamonds can be lit up before 9 pm so that by the time a six or seven inning game is complete, Joseph or Mary can be at the plate in the bottom of the sixth or seventh inning to drive in the win-

ning run or strike out the other teams' best hitter. It happens every year and a child of baseball or softball who learns the game from a mother or father or a volunteer from the community, leaves Shoshone Park not far from home to remember the five sided plate on the diamonds in North Buffalo.

Under the lights, the Dodgers defeated the Nationals 8-4 in the first round of the playoffs for the Major boys division. In other games the Cardinals defeated the Dodgers in Major Pony, the Blue Jays beat the White Sox and First Minor and the Yankees won in Rookie Boys over the Athletics.
