The Beloved Yogi

When at last it was over for Yogi Berra last week, Rocket Man felt as if the whole nation should send itself a condolence card. He was, we believe, the most universally beloved of all Americans. You may disagree. Nominations are open.

In 2005 we were privileged to see, in Syracuse, a newly-touring play titled "Nobody Don't Like Yogi," the most accurate title since "Gone with the Wind." It had one actor, Ben Gazzarra, and one act, which lasted about 80 minutes. Later Gazzarra told us how much he had admired Yogi even before

he got the script into his hands, and how much he loved him after it all came together. Yogi approved, but didn't make much a fuss over it.

Rocket Man got to meet him once, about a dozen years ago in the Bisons' stadium, when an All-Star Old Timers team engaged a team from Wal-Mart in a free, almost anonymous exhibition.

National Wal-Mart had run a competition as to which outlet could sell the most of some product. The winner got to play the Old-Timers. A Cheektowaga Wal-Mart won the prize, sharing the field with the

likes of Brooks Robinson, Frank Robinson, Mike Schmitt and several other A-listers. Yogi managed. As we recall, Wal-Mart fielded like 13 players, many of them women, and gave the vets quite a go for several innings before losing something like 21-6.

And there was Yogi, sitting atop the bench like some kid 50 years his junior. We spoke briefly, if unmemorably. He was gracious almost to a fault, with no sense of privilege. Even his museum in a Division III college in Montclair, NJ, bespeaks little grandeur. The minor league there typifies guys trying, crying, for a dream that in all likelihood will never come true.

Yogi epitomized the ordinary in us all. His achievements seemed beyond his physical grasp. It was never about him. His signature photograph, leaping into pitcher Don Larsen's arms after a World Series perfect game, depicts not achievement, but congratulations.

His way with words was both unique and wise. When he said, "Nobody goes there anymore, it's too crowded," he condensed the fleeting allure of fame into seven words. Others, including us, would employ 100, and not define it so well.

We cherish that we had him so long.
