Leaf Recycling Program

The City of Buffalo will collect bagged leaves and yard waste from now until December 1st. City residents can put their bagged leaves at the curb during this time period for composting.

To participate in this collection, city residents are asked to place their leaves in clear plastic bags or brown recyclable bags. These bags are available at local hardware stores, home centers, and other retailers. There is no limit to the number of paper leaf bags residents may place at the curb for pickup. Yard waste in the form of sticks and branches should be

tied in bundles with 'twine' or 'rope' and be no longer than 4 feet in length. Do not rake leaves into the street; leaves should not be placed in garbage totes. Also, residents should be advised that raking leaves into city streets is illegal and punishable by fine.

Residents are also being asked to place their yard waste on the curb. Yard waste and bagged leaves may be picked up on a different day than the garbage day. City residents should not be concerned if they are left behind after garbage removal.

As an alternative to the curbside bagged leaves and yard waste collection, the city opened Shoshone Park parking lot, at foot of Beard Avenue, as a drop-off location where residents can bring their unwanted leaves and yard waste. Drop off hours at the park are from 8:00 am to 3:00 pm, Monday through Saturday until December 1st.

Norman Suarez has been a Buffalo Fire Fighter for 24 years. Fighting fires runs in the family. He has eight family members, including his brother, who


are firefighters as well.

'The Martian'

In this Solar System take on "Home Alone," crewmates skedaddle from the Red Planet leaving astrobotanist Matt Damon behind. At its nearest, Mars orbits 50 million miles away and work on the expressway hasn't even begun.

Damon, speared by a windstorm, awakes with a cracked helmet, which he repairs with duct tape. It's amazing the reach of that stuff. Then, he begins the task of staying alive, for at least as long as four years, ETA of the next mission. "I'm the best botanist on the planet," he will declare, and when technological roadblocks arise, he will "science the stuff out of them," more or less

This is a mostly terrific movie directed by Ridley Scott ("Aliens," among others), inspired by a recent novel of the sort that introduced Rocket Man to the world of science fiction in the '40s. He took his own early-teen Little Booster who spent 2 ½ hours on the edge of his chair, never even referring to his I-device, whatever they call it. No wonder it's still this world's top draw, four weeks after launch.

Eventually, Damon's shipmates tumble to the notion that the boy they left behind is still alive and kicking, although not quite high enough (more on this momentarily). There then arises this interplanetary pull of guilt and duty, eventually solved by the movie's second most memorable character, super-genius smart aleck Parnell, played by Donald Glover (no relation to Danny, Rocket Man researched). He doesn't even know who's in charge of NASA, but his plan ties up every loose end.

The movie is beautifully set, designed and executed, and it's intriguing how much of the Marscape resembles parts of Buffalo's Lowest West Side. Damon never lets up, blowing away any notion that anyone so hopelessly isolated would succumb to psychological trauma. Evidently, when you're reduced to fertilizing your own food source, vou don't bemoan the lack of a partner for racketball or cribbage.

But...

For a movie so keen to the science of it, "The Martian" comes up heavy. Mars has less than half Earth's gravity. Damon and crewmates need to tread a lot more lightly than they do. A somewhat similar novel, "Hammer of God," proposes that the lesser resistance makes the place nearly ideal for honeymooning.

Little Booster suggested that one line about some sort of shoes would duct-tape the flaw in a movie so devoted to precision. Or something. Rocket Man didn't mind the too-far horizons which distracted at least one other viewer, but the gravitational error kept him firmly planted in unreality.

What a grouch.

Veterans can use the Clerk's "Thank-A-Vet" card at over 1,150 participating local businesses who have agreed to honor the card with a discount on purchases or services.

"My office continues our effort to recognize the service and sacrifices made by Erie County veterans through this important program," stated Jacobs.

For the veteran, filing discharge papers is free of charge and certified complimentary copies of recorded discharges are made for veterans or their immediate families whenever needed. Original discharge papers are proof of military service and can be used to establish eligibility for a variety of benefits including property tax exemptions and civil service credits.

from the National Fire Protection Association you can ensure a day of safe fun for your family and trick-or-treaters.

"Halloween has become such a festive time of year and we want people to enjoy decorating their homes, wearing colorful costumes and getting in the fall spirit," said Lorraine Carli, NFPA's vice president of Outreach and Advocacy, "but this holiday can quickly turn hazardous if proper precautions aren't taken." According to Carli, fire risks include candle decorations and billowing costumes with long-trailing fabric.

Improve the safety of your Halloween by following these tips:

Costumes: When choos-

ing a costume, stay away from billowing or longtrailing fabric. If you are making your own costume, choose material that won't easily ignite if it comes into contact with heat or flame.

Visibility: Provide children with flashlights to carry for lighting or glow sticks as part of their costumes. If your child is wearing a mask, make sure the eye holes are large enough so he/she can see clearly out of it.

Flammable decorations: Dried flowers, cornstalks and crepe paper are highly flammable. Keep these and other decorations well away from all open flames and heat sources, including light bulbs and heaters.

Candles/jack-o-lanterns: It is safest to use a glow stick or battery-operated candle in a jacko-lantern. If you use a real candle, use extreme caution. When lighting candles inside jack-o-lanterns, use long fireplacestyle matches or a utility lighter. If you choose to use candle decorations, make sure to keep them well attended at all times. Do not leave them near flammable objects or where trick-or-treaters may walk. Remind your children to avoid open flames. Make sure children are watched at all times when candles are

Exits: Remember to keep exits clear of decorations, so nothing blocks escape routes.


