Fees Waived for Veterans


To celebrate the men and women of the armed services this Veterans Day, the SPCA Serving Erie County is waiving animal adoption fees for individuals on active duty, reserves, service-disabled veterans, or those retired from military services (a \$30 administrative fee will still be required).

The program runs through Saturday, November 14th. Military ID or DD214 will need to be presented.

Animals can be adopted from any SPCA location, including the 205 Ensminger Rd., Tonawanda shelter; the Eastern Hills Mall adoption site (in the back of the mall, across from Dipson Theatres); or one of several other offsite adoption locations. Photos of adoptable animals and a list of



'My Name is Asher Lev'

The name was "all sold out" Sunday afternoon at Jewish Repertory Theatre. "My Name is Asher Lev" packed 'em to the Seller Theater ceiling, the throng including an appreciatively curious quorum from the North Park Presbyterian Church.

They sure didn't come for the comedy in director Saul Elkin's most serious work since Josie DiVincenzo blew herself to bits 13 times in "Dai" two springs ago. There is a little levity, but very little, as an artistic prodigy tries to connect the dots between his Hasidic home and the integrity of the canvas. As a mentor asks, "Are you a scream trying to get out?"

Aaron Posner's 95minute one-act play from Chaim Potok's novel melds real-life characters, including Potok, into young Lev, drawn to artistic expression almost from diaperhood. Many of his inspirations spring from what devout Jews see as sitra achra, the dark side. His father Aryeh, attacks him on moral grounds, then dismisses the work as "playing with crayons."

Spoiler alert: Asher's art is a smash, surviving even an encounter with a figure model. When Dad demands an explanation of the difference between naked and nude, Asher nails it. Still, he can not shake the notion of dishonoring both family and faith. Citing public opinion, the lawyer declares "Better you should be a

laborer...or a lawyer."

Three actors portray eight characters, as the playwright insists. Tom Zindle plays father Aryeh, as well as a jolly uncle straight out of Dickens, a rebbe (dispenser of Hebrew wisdom), and the mentor who urges loyalty to his own truth. His work as Aryeh oft reminded Rocket Man of JRT rebbein-chief Elkin.

Adam Yellen convincingly conveys the details of Lev's life at various ages and states of awareness. Yeoman work. Having pulled herself together after "Dai," DiVencenzo excels in three widely varied assignments, from the breathtakingly authentic mother (complete with authentic pronunciation of her "g's") to the stylish and commanding patron of the arts. Pardon our New Testament, but she is a revelation, even before to pose.

"Asher Lev" bears comparison to Tom Dudzick's "Over the Tavern," which fought the fight of faith on far funnier terms. Pardon the profile, but Jewish people seem to take this far more seriously. Twenty centuries of seniority will do that. "Asher " closes the curtain Nov. 15. NINE ROCKETS (out of 10).



Buffalo Police Launch Program

Recently, Mayor Byron Brown and Police Commissioner Dan Derenda, joined by many local officials, gathered at Mt. Olive Baptist Church unveiled 'Buffalo Police Department: 21st Century' (BPD21C).

BPD21C is an innovative, 'first of its kind' in the nation, police pre-employment scholarship program designed to provide scholarship opportunities for city residents who want to pursue a career in law enforcement. Up to 50 successful City of Buffalo residents may receive full scholarships to the Erie County-Erie Community College Central Police Services Law Enforcement Training Academy for the spring semester, beginning on January 18th, 2016.

Buffalo Police Commissioner Dan Derenda stated, "We believe the BPD21C initiative will allow us to make the Buffalo Police Department more reflective of the community and look forward to the opportunity it will provide

to our city residents."

This announcement came less than a year after Mayor Brown and the City of Buffalo hosted an important forum on community-police relations at Mt. Olive Baptist Church.



BPD21C incorporates recommendations from that discussion as well as recommendations for best practices.

To apply for a BPD21C scholarship, City of Buffalo residents must complete and submit applications to the City's Department of Human Resources by November 13th, 2015. Upon the successful completion of all three of these components, and the verification that all of the qualifications have been met, up

to 50 city of Buffalo residents will be selected for a full scholarship to the Erie County-Erie Community College Central Police Services Law Enforcement Training Academy, which will commence on January 18th, 2016. This is a full-time, 20 week commitment that requires candidates to attend the training academy at ECC North Campus. Scholarships will include: full cost of tuition, uniforms and books.

Candidates who successfully complete the program will receive 30 College Credits and a Certificate that deems them eligible for appointment as an officer in any peace or police department in New York State within two years from the date of graduation. Additionally, graduates will have acquired invaluable leadership training, life skills and readiness for careers in public safety and public service.
