Key shipping dates for December 25th arrival are as follows: December 8th for Priority Mail Express International[™]; December 15th for Standard Post; December 19th for Global Express Guaranteed® and First-Class Mail®; December 21st for Priority Mail®; and December 23rd for Priority Mail ExpressTM.

Military Mailing Deadlines are as follows: APO/ FPO First-Class Mail® letters and cards as well as APO/FPO Priority Mail® should be mailed by December 10th; APO/FPO Priority Mail ExpressTM

Military Service should be mailed by December 17th. For a full list of domes-



A Bridge Too Famous

In was a mid-summer night, Lewiston photographer Michael B. Stuart decided to drop by to see whether the South Grand Island Bridges were feeling photogenic. He chose the rocky little cliff on the west shore of the Niagara River's east branch, between the bridges, "the crotch shot," as Rocket Man so indelicately puts it.

"I'd never been in that particularly spot before," he said, "and suddenly I was struck with how tiny you feel down there. The massive arch of the bridges, the trucks rumbling by above, it was noisy, it was scary. I began to wonder, 'What if I fall into the river, will anybody even know?" So I didn't stay there more than 10 minutes."

Long enough. The American Society of Civil Engineers, for the second time in three years, has selected a Michael Stuart photo of the Grand Island Bridges for its annual calendar. He's "Miss March." And, all the exotic engi-

neering challenges presented in the calendar, his was the one selected to "sell it," the one photo that appears in advertisements.

"I WAS a little surprised," Stuart conceded. No other bridge, not even one in Switzerland that seems like science-fiction, has repeated in the ASCE calendar. "However, they do have different judges every year, so I did start with a clean plate."

That's more than you can say for his photo subject. Pillars stained with rust, patches and propwash, the bridges look downright grungy. Keen eyes will spot a speed limit sign of 35, seconded by a little orange warning. They're being "worked on," as inconvenienced Islanders mutter.

"I think that helps make it a more successful image," Stuart says. "It has to play on lines, direct the eye. The visible age, the rust, they all help tell a story, create an image. I

have another one I've posted titled: 'Twins, 28 years apart."

While officials argue ad nauseum about the Peace Bridge, Grand Island designers didn't hesitate a moment in deciding, in 1963, to virtually duplicate the single span - the northbound bridge - which had opened the Island in 1935. Detail freaks can spot small differences, mostly geological necessities, but basically, if you've seen one South Bridge, you've seen 'em all.

Stuart's shot also won the HD Range competition, a matter of details and shadows. "That's new this year, a big new thing in photography," said Stuart, whose wife Nicole specializes in flesh-andblood portrait photography. Also, for the second straight time, the bridge shot – his 2013 entry was the broader, southwestto-northeast view favored by political office-seekers - won as Viewers' Choice.







Place wrapped gift boxes inside a plain larger box.

Remove all batteries from electronics.

Remember to place an extra shipping label inside the box, so the item can be returned in case the box or label gets damaged.
