For several years after it closed, the fate of the North Park Library site at the corner of Hertel and Delaware Avenues remained uncertain while the City of Buffalo considered their options. A year ago, the city's real estate

department selected a proposal from Benderson Development in a competitive bidding process for redeveloping the site. The city's Office of Strategic Planning will evaluate the plan once the community has the opportunity to provide input on the project.

The meeting will be facilitated by North Buffalo.org and will feature Delaware District Council member Joel Feroleto and representatives from Benderson Development. A question and answer period will follow if time permits.

Forgive Us Our Excesses

Back in the day, this column occasionally ran under a headline, "Between the Lines."

Such writings intended to help readers through the media slog, mostly as represented by the Buffalo News, and the code words that betrayed political bias.

This was, for the record, long before the ascendancy of Fox News, which, also for the record, we now very seldom watch.

Rocket Man beheld "The Lines" again last week. There, as the population of detainees shrank at the Guantanamo Inn, a writer described the Caribbean crib as representative of "the excesses of America's response to 9/11."

Pardon? Excesses? We lose 2,500 civilians to a well-orchestrated attack in the name of a particular

faith, and to send a couple hundred serious suspects to a warm climate where they can't do it again is an EXCESS? In the Middle East one government beheads three dozen people for singing too loudly in church, and we're guilty of an EXCESS? Please.

The thing is, this outrageous editorial comment was slipped stealthily into a news story as if it were a matter of fact. You could argue the point, but she didn't. If we read it in an editorial or an analysis column, we'd disagree, but that's discussion. This was presented as news, over the wires from an out-oftown source, the Washington Post, Rocket Man believes, but it might have been the New York Times. So we can't specifically lay the blame on the Buffalo News, although some editor there might have been able to right the wrong with at least a qualifying "what some feel are the excesses, etc. etc."

The News seems to have pulled back a little from its affection for all things liberal and for a while, at least, it seemed as if the editor whose only task was to get Hillary Clinton's picture into the paper was granted early retirement.

But it's still there. Not quite to excess, but Rocket Man will re-activate his scanner.
