Rocket Man by Doug Smith

Fink Newton

You'll never get rich on Rocket Man's picks but for the Super Bowl, he was nearly right before the game and on the money afterwards.

Prediction: Denver 18, Carolina 16, figuring that Peyton Manning hadn't the stuff to get it over the goal line, but that the defense would get close enough for six field goals. He inscribed this on a Super Saturday postcard to Rockin' Rod, Lord of Liverpool, who received it Monday, after the Broncos had mustered two touchdown drives totaling three yards and four 3's from Scott Norwood range.

The post-game show: Moments after the game ended, he e-mailed Niagara Gazette sports editor Mike Meiler: "In three days, the stuff will start hitting the fan on Cam Newton's chickening out on that fumble."

By Wednesday, it was all over the papers, including fine pieces by Bucky Gleason and Tyler Dunne.

The replay: With about 3½ minutes remaining, Denver ahead by 6, Carolina quarterback Newton, hailed pre-game as the new face of the NFL, took a hit and relinquished the ball deep in his own territory. It lay wriggling, like a brown ostrich egg ready to hatch. Newton gazed at it, sized up the number of other players (most of them Broncos) heading toward it and backed shifted into reverse.

Later, he would claim he was "contorted."

That's French for scared witless.

In the military, he'd have been tried as a deserter. (Then the President would have traded five free agents to get him back, but that's another matter...)

Denver quickly scored, sealing the game.

Rocket Man can envision Jim Kelly or Tyrod Taylor breaking a few arms to retrieve that ball. It's not a totally fair comparison, but how about Don Beebe's legendary chasedown vs. – the Redskins, was it? – to save honor in a long-lost game? (On the other hand, there was Kyle Orton's half-hearted slide a yard short of a first down in 2014.)

Rocket Man does NOT mind if an athlete takes a "play off." At a ballgame in Pittsburgh eight years ago, he watched a Giant outfielder dive into the stands and onto the disabled list chasing a foul ball with a 9-1 lead in the eighth inning and a two-strike count on the eighth batter. And Bison catcher Einar Diaz pounding down the line on a ground ball with an 8-1 lead in the eighth after he'd caught five games in four days, two of them extra innings. It's OK, guys,

But to turn up your nose at the name of the game in the Super Bowl?

Unless he demonstrates corrective surgery, i.e. a spine transplant, Cam Newton will ever be remembered as the Panther without an anther.
