

## **Premature Ejection**

If timing is everything, Rocket Man's nothing. A 67-year veteran of the journalism wars oughta' know better than to get scooped on his own retirement.

But it happened. In an article that left Rocket Man gasping, the Buffalo News' Colin Dabkowski outted his flight plan last Sunday. ArtVoice's Javier Bustillos picked up anyone Colin didn't reach. Rocket Man and First Mate are stowing their gear and lifting off for the remote colony of Cortland, NY, gravitating toward a daughter and family, notably a grandson who's a full-fledged member of this crew.

Dabkowski's article, more lengthy than reports that day on the departures of Peyton Manning and Nancy Reagan, was too pleasant by half. The last person Rocket Man so glowingly hailed was the late Irish Classical actor Chris O'Neill. Quoting his idol Jack Benny, Rocket Man would say, "I don't deserve this - but I have arthritis, and I don't deserve that, either."

Colin visited Rocket Man's quarters for an hour, and got to say less than a guest of Bill O'Reilly. That he could condense this into any less than "War & Peace" qualifies as a miracle of mental editing. Further, he captured the role of the First Mate with astronomical precision, and for anyone who did happen to miss the point, there was photographer and life coach Sharon Cantillon (rhymes with "villain"), who actually coaxed the uptight Rocket Man into a civil countenance.

Of the First Mate she declared, "You're a natural."

One element seems to demand a little clarification. Colin was justly skeptical of Rocket Man's "claim" to have written 57 stories one night for a newspaper in Pennsylvania. In print, it looked funny even to Rocket Man. Well, the number is actually 53. In the flurry of one-sided conversation, thinking of his next anni-

versary, Rocket Man may have fruedianly flubbed the figure.

As sports editor of the brand-new Warren Observer in 1962, Rocket Man gathered, wrote, produced and laid out the entire sports section. The paper did not publish Sundays and holidays and so, probably on Memorial Day or The Fourth, had three days' events to catch up on. Usually the sports section ran to four tabloid (ArtVoicesized) pages but Rocket Man remembers distinctly asking the publisher for two more to handle the long-weekend load.

So the 53 stories, many only two or three sentences long, piled up over the weekend for assemblage Monday night and it wasn't until he re-read the section, probably over lunch on Tuesday, that he calculated the enormity of the task. He vividly remembers the count as a prime number (which "57" is not). So it is possible that he did not exactly "write 57 stories in one night," but he did have 53 stories in one day's sports section, and 53 headlines, as well.

But all of them put together did not hold a control-panel light to Colin's Sunday essay. Rocket Man says thanking a reporter is like tipping a cardiologist, but he, we, will be eternally grateful. The rest of you don't get rid of us this easily. We've got a few left. For the record, this column took 32 minutes.




Debra Lane - Complainant reports that \$1,000 cash was stolen from her home. There are no signs of forced entry, could have happened when she had guests over.
