and some even wish they could re-play those years, watching their kids grow up, learning the game and jumping off the ground after a victory. Several former players in the league from as far back as 30 years can quickly recall a certain game, fellow teammates or a great coach.

One great coach that was a part of every boys life at Shoshone was Sam Chianta, a long-time board member and manager of a Reds team for over a decade at least was beloved by Hertel North Park. Until his untimely death in 1992, everyone knew Sam. He always tried to make a boys life happy, even though their team may have just

lost a close game. If a player wanted a hot dog after their game but didn't have enough money, Sam would know the cook, grilling the dogs in the Park's old concession stand.

Another great coach that left Shoshone way to soon to the baseball diamond "in the sky" was Mike Murphy or Murph, as he was often called. While baseball is still considered a game of numbers, Murph helped the league understand that it's a game of relationships. Some teams win and some lose, but talent is what decides a game and those that played for Murph or even against found a personality that lasted long after the last game. Both Chainta and Murphy are

dearly missed.

There are close to 40 boys and over a dozen girls teams all set to go starting this Saturday afternoon. Later this month, by Memorial Day, ten more teams of older boys and girls will get started, bringing a total of 61 teams to root for, all playing at Shoshone Park. Then you add the various travel boys (Blaze) and girls (Wildcats) teams in most age levels and the figure approaches 75. That's a lot of baseball and softball fun in North Buffalo.

Everyone who coaches in Shoshone Park is volunteering their time outside of a regular job, raising a family or making trips to a grocery store. A schedule of games is planned beforehand but what happens out on the diamond is a sight more precious than money. Baseball has certainly had its problems in the last 30 years, but the game is still pure here in North Buffalo.

of bicyclists - along with a now-standard Buffalo Police Department motorcade - will lead participants onto the Scajaquada Expressway and continue to the Humboldt Parkway.

In standard Slow Roll fashion, the entire ride will run approximately 10 miles at a leisurely pace of around 8-10 miles per hour, rolling round-trip back to the Marcy Casino for an after party with food, drinks and live music. Beginning Monday, May 16th, Slow Roll Buffalo will return to Monday nights, rolling weekly through October 31st.

The New York State Department of Transportation has announced that a highway closure is sched-

uled to occur on a portion of the Scajaguada Corridor (NY Route 198) in the City of Buffalo, Erie County, for this event.

Route 198 eastbound, between Grant Street and Parkside Avenue, will be closed to motor vehicle traffic at approximately 11:30 am. The closure is expected to last for several hours. Motorists should seek alternate routes and allow for additional travel time.

"From its birthplace in Detroit to here in Buffalo and beyond, Slow Roll had an amazing 2015, and we're excited to pick up where we left off," said Slow Roll Buffalo co-founder Tony Caferro. "The Parkway Revival Ride is only our first statement - while we'll

continue to keep Slow Roll free and fun for all, we're pushing this social event to take on social causes, with many more to come."





Jacobs Urges Governor to Block Diversion of Great Lakes Water

Chris Jacobs, Candidate for New York State Senate and current Erie County Clerk, urged Governor Cuomo in a letter recently, to reject the proposal from a Wisconsin city to divert millions of gallons daily of Great Lakes water.

In 2008, the historic Great Lakes Compact was signed between the Governors of the US States and Premiers of Canadian Provinces in the Great Lakes Basin. The Compact was created to protect the Great Lakes as the vital economic and cultural re-

source it is to all the communities located with the basin.

The City of Waukesha, Wisconsin has requested 16 million gallons of Great Lakes water be diverted daily for the City's use. This is the first diversion request made since the 2008 Great Lakes Compact was signed.

"I write you [Governor Cuomo] to urge you to vote against this diversion proposal....This decision is not solely about one diversion but sets a precedent for future diversion requests from

communities throughout the Great Lakes Basin," said Jacobs.

Jacobs voiced his concern on this issue because of the 60th Senate Districts unique connection to the Great Lakes. The District spans from Grand Island to Evans/Brant. "Nearly every city and town within the 60th Senate District adjoins the Niagara River or Lake Erie," wrote Jacobs.

"If elected to the 60th District I will always fight to preserve our waterways for future generations," said Jacobs.

REAP Program to Help Combat Opioid Abuse Epidemic

Erie County Executive Mark C. Poloncarz was joined today by Erie County Commissioner of Health Dr. Gale R. Burstein, United States Attorney for the Western District of Western New York William J. Hochul and police chiefs representing law enforcement agencies from across Western New York to unveil details of a new program designed to address the region's ongoing opioid abuse crisis.

"The REAP Program is something that has developed as a result of our creation of the Erie County Opioid Epidemic Task Force," said Poloncarz. "This initiative will be a revolutionary policing program that is focused on helping those who are addicted to opioids such as heroin get the help that they need. By working closely with our many community partners and the volunteers who serve on the county's Opioid Epidemic Task Force, we believe we will have a unified effort in place to help people be a part of the solution to this growing problem."

The REAP Program
– which stands for Rapid
Evaluation, Appropriate
Placement – is modeled
after a concept used in
Gloucester, Massachusetts
that helped to see that community's property crime

rate decrease 31 percent after it was implemented.

One of the unique aspects of the REAP initiative is the use of volunteer "angels" who will monitor and stay with addicts who are seeking treatment and want to enter into the rehabilitation process, following the philosophy of helping opioid abusers identify ways to seek treatment that doesn't necessarily involve in them being placed under arrest.

"Addiction is a disease of the brain and we typically don't incarcerate other individuals that have other diseases that require medication," said Burstein. "This approach using the REAP program will allow a user who may have drugs or drug paraphernalia in their possession to safely dispose of them without being arrested, charged with a crime or placed in jail."

With approximately 12 police agencies located in Erie and Niagara counties showing interest in participating in the program, the hope is to have the REAP program up and running within the next two months.
