Route 198 Travel Advisory

The New York State Department of Transportation announced that the demolition of the second half of the Elmwood Avenue Bridge over NY Route 198, in the city of Buffalo, is scheduled to begin. As a result, several travel restrictions will occur on NY

Route 198. On Friday, May 20th, NY Route 198 westbound will be reduced to one lane in the vicinity of Elmwood Avenue from 6:00 pm until 10:00 pm, and will be closed to all traffic from 10:00 pm until 6:00 am on Saturday, May 21st. Traffic will exit

and re-enter NY Route 198 at Elmwood Avenue using the existing exit and entrance ramps and will be directed by flaggers.

On Monday, May 23rd, NY Route 198 eastbound, from Grant Street to Delaware Avenue, will be closed to all traffic from approximately 10:00 pm until 6:00 am. Traffic will exit at Grant Street and follow a posted detour along Forest Avenue to Delaware Avenue.

This work is weather-sensitive and could be delayed in the event of inclement weather.

Take a Swing at the Home-Run Derby

Do you think you can hit a home-run in Shoshone Park this season? North Buffalo Baseball and Softball Leagues think you can too. This season, Hertel North Park is participating in the Major League Baseball Junior Home-run Derby. It's an opportunity for both boys and girls ages 12 and 14 and under to compete against one another at swinging a bat and watching a baseball travel over a fence.

This Saturday night, May 21st at 6 pm, coaches will meet you on Diamond #1 and the Mike Murphy Diamond to help you try to swing for the fences. One Champion will be crowned in each age group. There is no cost to participate. Shoshone Park winners will then compete in Regional finals held sometime in mid-June. National Finals will be held during the week of the MLB All-Star game in San Diego. Each player will be given three warm-up pitches and then seven more to try to hit a ball at least 170 feet for 12 year olds and at least 200 feet for 14 year olds. Each batter will need to bring their own pitcher for the competition.

Out on the diamonds of Shoshone Park, the best news during the first week of the season is a New York Yankees team in the First Minor division won their first game after an almost two year drought. If Yankee broadcaster John Sterling was in the Park on May 9th, you'd hear him exclaim afterward: "The Yankees win! The Yankees win!" Colin France went two for three at the plate and had the big hit for a resilient

"Bronx Bomber" team over the Tigers, 13-7. For team manager Tom Garippo, it was a lesson in patience for a group of nine and ten year olds who have never given up. The victory evened the Yankee record at 1-1 with a new, better season ahead.

Rookie Girls got their season underway the same night. The Shamrocks defeated the Rebels 10-5 and then watched the Angels defeat the Lil Devils, 6-4 two nights later. Karrington Mann doubled, knocking in three runs to rally the Angels to victory after being down 3-2 in the last inning. In rookie boys, the Rays defeated the Red Sox, 4-1, scoring all four runs in the bottom of the fifth led by Riley Wales, Stephen Kyser, Shaun McCleary and Dominic DePinto. The Royals won two games over the Athletics and Indians and the Orioles shut out the Yanks, 4-0.

In Major Girls, McKenna Horne helped lead

the Rockies to their second win of the season over the Cardinals, 13-7 and the Dodgers won their second in a row over the Athletics. In Major Boys, Joe Persico hit a huge, two run homerun over the fence to lead the Mets to a big win over the Dodgers. Matt Cambria was a thief on the basepaths and two pitchers, Persico and Steve Purpora combined to allow just four runs over five innings.

In other games, the Nationals used the solid pitching of Quinn Mahoney and Ethan McClain and were helped out by Owen McKendry for a 2-1 victory over the Reds. Damien Smith, DeKari Jackson and Amir Baker helped lead the Giants to an 11-6 win over the Cubs.

In other First Minor games, the Athletics won their second game in a row over the Twins 8-2. Xaviar Mann scored four runs and had four RBI's to lead the Blue Jays to a win over the Angels and the White Sox won their first game of the season over the Orioles on the strength of two home-runs by John Judge.

The cold and rainy weather Saturday cancelled as many as 19 games in the Park. Not to worry, still early in a 60th season.

since expanded into a long weekend that kicks off the start of summer.

Here's a list things to do in and around Buffalo for the 2016 Memorial Day weekend.

The Kenmore Memorial Day Parade is one of the largest Memorial Day parades in Western New York, the parade begins at 11:00 am on Delaware Avenue, and goes through the Village of Kenmore, ending on Elmwood Avenue. Even though Memorial Day typically honors those who are no longer with us, the parade also offers special recognition to veterans and active military members to thank them for their service.

If you're looking for a family-friendly picnic spot with a view of Lake Erie, visit Buffalo Harbor State Park, the newest in the New York State park system. With picnic tables, a marina, places to catch some rays, and an onsite restaurant, the Buffalo Harbor State Park promises to keep improving their facilities in the years to

come. Water sports, such as canoeing, kayaking, stand-up paddle boarding, and windsurfing are permitted here.

For those with an interest in history, it's a great weekend to visit Old Fort Niagara. Built in 1726, there are original buildings still standing from the fort's inception. While the events that took place here span hundreds of years, today you can see special exhibits and demonstrations that give visitors a chance to experience a soldier's life as it existed in the past. On May 28th and May 29th between 9:00 am and 5:00 pm, you can see re-enactments from wars through the 20th century; there are also displays featuring tents, rations, weapons, and equipment.

The Buffalo Marathon will take place on May 29th at 6:30 pm, the Buffalo Marathon is designed to provide runners with views of Lake Erie and Buffalo city landmarks during its 26.2 mile route. For more information on the marathon go to www.buffalomarathon.com.
