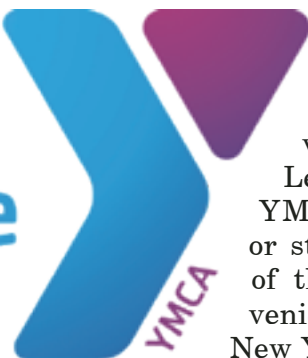

Just before 9:30 last Saturday morning in Shoshone Park, as teams were getting ready to play their games, players were interrupted by a man's voice over a microphone. The voice asked them to remove their caps for a moment and stand at attention. Then music came on, familiar to all, and suddenly, another familiar voice filled the morning sky just like in the First Niagara Center.

This was the first Saturday in the Park since Opening Day and the Hertel North Park Youth Baseball League was getting its season off right with its customary version of paying tribute to these United States. Doug Allen wasn't in the Park, but his voice was and those that have heard his rich, baritone voice downtown before a Sabres home game, knows that North Buffalo Baseball and Softball will stop at nothing to help give children a chance to feel good playing in Shoshone Park.

Quinn Langdon helped lead the Nationals to an 8-1 victory over the Dodgers while the Mets had to battle back to defeat the Giants 10-9 in 10 innings on the strength of a inside the park home-run by Sal Genco. The Reds kept pace with two wins this past week. Saturday, Jeremiah Navarro tripled to score three runs in the fourth inning as the Reds battled back to defeat the Cubs, 6-5. Last Wednesday, Lorenzo LoTempio and Dakari Sawyers led the Reds at the plate as the team won over the Dodgers, 10-7. Spencer DiLeo was solid on the mound in relief.

In First Minors, the Yankees won two in a row with a 14-3 victory over the

Orioles. Logan Garippo homers in two consecutive games and teammate Eric Hagood catches a pop fly to end the third inning when the Orioles were threatening to rally. Isa Drayton hit a bases loaded triple to lead the Blue Jays to an 8-4 win over the White Sox. Four Angels pitching help lead them to a 10-6 win over the Royals. They are Rowan Root, Casey Glynn, Cohen Springer and Luke Applebaum. Nathan Bradshaw homered to lead the Tigers over the Athletics, 9-6.

Senior Girls Division teams got under way Saturday. There are four teams: Angels, Athletics, Pirates and Yankees. Mia Trietley hit two homeruns, including a grand slam to lead the Pirates over the A's. Gabby McDuffie also homered while pitcher Alyssa Kilonsky struck out 11 on the mound. The Yankees defeated the An-


gels, 16-9 on three big hits by Cionage (C.C.) White.

In Major girls, the Rockies needed an extra seventh inning to defeat the Athletics under the lights, 5-3 and the Cardinals gave the Dodgers their second loss in a row, with a 5-4 victory.

This past Friday was a make-up night for the league as four games were re-scheduled. The Orioles defeated the Giants 9-5 led by Sophia Perigyi's three RBI's and teammate Genevieve Mucitelli had two hits and an RBI. The Reds defeated the Yankees 5-2. Nick Purdie, Will O'Rourke and John Judge each had two hits to lead the White Sox over the Yanks and the Twins shut out the Royals.

In Rookie Girls, Molly Kilianski, Alea Totaro and Bianca Ficorilli helped lead the Rebels to a 7-3 win over the Lil Devils, 7-3 and the Angels gave the Shamrocks their first loss with a 2-1 decision.

Don't look for any games this Saturday in the Park. Just like the National Anthem, it's customary for the League to take the weekend off for Memorial Day. Games will resume on Tuesday, May 31st.



Peak Time for Grilling Fires

As Memorial Day week-end approaches, home chefs everywhere are reaching for their grills, eager to usher in the long-awaited barbecue season. The National Fire Protection Association recommends that grillers pay particular attention to safety in the spring and summer months when home fires involving grilling incidents occur most often.

Three out of five households own a gas grill, which translates to a lot of tasty meals. But it also means there's an increased risk of home fires.

"As friends and families

prepare for a fun grilling season together, be sure the grill is working properly and review safety tips," said Lorraine Carli, vice president of Outreach and Advocacy for National Fire Protection Association. "Failing to properly clean the grill or having the grill too close to something that could burn are the leading causes of fires. It's good practice to check for damage before using the grill for the first time each year, and to check the entire grill regularly."

When grilling, National Fire Protection Association suggests the follow-

ing:

Propane and charcoal BBQ grills should only be used outdoors.

The grill should be placed well away from the home, deck railings and out from under eaves and overhanging branches.

Keep children and pets at least three feet away from the grill area.

Keep your grill clean by removing grease or fat buildup from the grates and in the trays below.

Never leave your grill unattended.

NY, the "birthplace" of Memorial Day. There, a ceremony on May 5th, 1866, honored local veterans who had fought in the Civil War. Businesses closed and residents flew flags at half-staff. Supporters of Waterloo's claim say earlier observances in other places were either informal, not community-wide or one-time events.

By the end of the 19th century, Memorial Day ceremonies were being held on May 30th throughout the nation. State legislatures passed proclamations designating the day, and the Army and Navy adopted regulations for proper observance at their facilities.

It was not until after World War I, however, that the day was expanded to honor those who have died in all American wars. In 1971, Memorial Day was declared a national holiday by an act of Congress, though it is still often called Decoration Day. It was then also placed on the last Monday in May, as were some other federal holidays.

To ensure the sacrifices of America's fallen heroes are never forgotten, in December 2000, the U.S. Congress passed and the

president signed into law "The National Moment of Remembrance Act," P.L. 106-579, creating the White House Commission on the National Moment of Remembrance. The commission's charter is to "encourage the people of the United States to give something back to their country, which provides them so much freedom and



opportunity" by encouraging and coordinating commemorations in the United States of Memorial Day and the National Moment of Remembrance.

The National Moment of Remembrance encourages all Americans to pause wherever they are at 3 pm local time on Memorial Day for a minute of silence to remember and honor those who have died in service to the nation. As Moment of Remembrance founder Carmella LaSpada states: "It's a way we can all help put the memorial back in Memorial Day."
