# Bridge to Broderick Park Opens

The West Ferry Street Lift Bridge will be operational this Friday, June 3rd, at the end of the day, at approximately 5pm.

The bridge will be fully open to vehicular traffic, however, there will be limited access to sidewalks as the final stages of work wraps up. An official re-opening ceremony will take place later this summer.

Originally built in 1913, the Ferry Street Bridge is a bascule bridge crossing the Black Rock Channel.

Work on the bridge has been going on since 2014. The \$7.92 million reconstruction project includes \$5.56 million in federal transportation funding, \$1.31 million in funding from the City of Buffalo and \$1.05 million from the State.

The Ferry Street Bridge project complements a number of other improvement projects in the area surrounding the bridge including Broderick Park.

# Get Rid of Hazardous Household Waste

The City of Buffalo and 34 and More are teaming up and holding a Household Hazardous Waste Drop-Off Day on Saturday, June 11th from 9 am to 2 pm at Riverside Park. Items which can be dropped off include pesticides fertilizers, pool and household chemicals/cleaners; oil-based paints, spray cans; paint thinner, stripper, and solvents; batteries; oil, gasoline, kerosene and antifreeze; -Mercury (thermometers, thermostats, metal); propane tanks and cylinders; tires without rims; electronic waste (computers, printers, scanners); and fluorescent light bulbs.



"The Komen WNY Board of Directors saw a need to keep the Race for the Cure festivities and route fresh and exciting, and we believe the move to RiverWorks does just that," said Kincaid. "With our changing city and all of the excitement for downtown, we feel that to grow our race and, therefore, our mission of saving lives, we needed to make some changes."

The move is also an answer to the changing Elmwood Village neighborhood, said Komen Executive Director Liz Kahn. "The Elmwood Village is much different than it was 15 years ago when the Race for the Cure was started. The combination of bustling businesses, thousands of residences, and

Saturday morning traffic was making it difficult to ensure the safety of our participants, which is a top priority," Kahn said.
