Jacobs Alerts Motorists of Defective Airbags

Erie County Clerk Chris Jacobs is notifying motorists that four automakers are continuing to sell new vehicles with defective Takata airbags, according to a recent report by a Senate Commerce Committee who is overseeing the agency handling the largest-ever auto safety recall these airbags.

Toyota, Volkswagen, Mitsubishi Motor Corp and Fiat Chrysler confirmed that vehicles with ammonium-nitrate inflators without a chemical drying agent, which make the airbags faulty and extremely dangerous, are still being sold to the public. Ford recently announced they are also expected to expand its Takata air bag recall by

nearly 1.9 million vehicles.

"It's very troublesome that these manufacturers would sell new cars with the same defective Takata airbags that have harmed so many people and that will shortly have to be recalled and replaced. When a customer buys a new car there is a reasonable expectation that there is no knowingly defective components within it ...I think these manufacturers should reconsider this practice or lose the trust of the consumer," said Jacobs.

According to NHTSA these vehicles are legal to sell but must be recalled by 2018 to have their airbags replaced. Some of the affected vehicles include the 2016-2017

Mitsubishi i-MiEV, 2016 Volkswagen CC, 2016 Audi TT and 2017 Audi R8. In the short-term, the agency says, the vehicles are safe to drive and are much safer than the older models. The reports also said Toyota, one of two automakers that did not provide specific models to Senate investigators, expects to produce approximately 175,000 vehicles with the defective Takata inflators by July 2017.

In light of this recent report, Jacobs urges motorists who are in the market for a new vehicle to ask their sales representative if the auto they are looking to purchase is equipped with inflators without drying agents or any such inflator. Jacobs also recommends current owners visit the Federal Government's website, www.safercar.gov, to see if their vehicle is now subject to recall and to subscribe to the website's Recall Notification e-mail system in order to be notified on the most up to date recall alerts as exact car models have not been identified.

In Rookie boys, the Royals kept rolling with wins over the Rays and Indians. Stewart Calderon got his first hit in the game against the Rays. Nick Martin, Isiah Smith, Thomas Bonaro and Reese Graham helped the Indians beat the Yankees, 2-1. The Red Sox defeated the Orioles, 5-3 led by Ben Kuwik, Nick Felice, Charlie Stewart and Angel Lynch. The Blue Jays won two including a win over the Sox led by Michael Burke, Kaius Mattoon, Joe Bueme and John Palamara.

Over on the girls side, the Dodgers won two games in a row, including a 7-6 win over the previously unbeaten Rockies,

7-6 in a make up game Friday night. Saturday, they topped the Cardinals by that same score 7-6 and it’s anybody’s ballgame in Major girls.

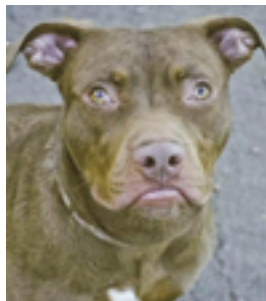

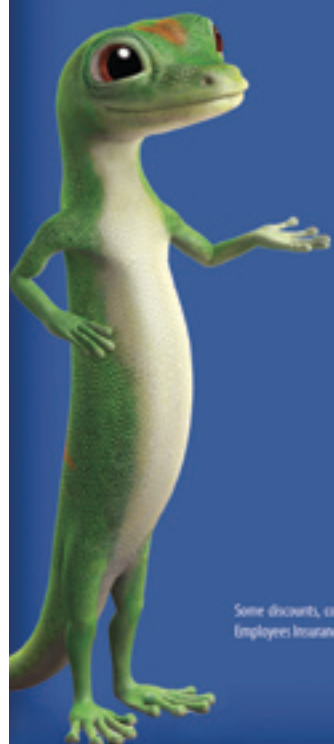

The Grapevine

The 15th annual Mayor Byron W. Brown's Reading Rules! Kids Summer Reading Challenge is underway.

"Reading Rules!" began in 2001, when Mayor Brown served in the New York State Senate, as a way to address the literacy problem in New York State, specifically in Buffalo and Western New York. Mayor Brown started the literacy effort to encourage school-children to read books throughout the summer, and submit written summaries of each book they had read. Mayor Brown remarked that, "Reading Rules! is one of our hallmark initiatives and it gets better and better as the years go on. Since 2001, approximately 11,211 champion readers have completed the program.

LOST STREAM MAP

The STREAM & LAKE MAP OF NEW YORK resembles another map--known to Pennsylvania anglers as the "Lost Stream Map."

It was completed in 1965 after a 30 year effort by Howard Higbee, a former Penn State Professor.

Professor Higbee painstakingly plotted by hand, the location of 45,000 miles of streams onto the map. It sold extremely well - until the printer declared bankruptcy and hauled Higbee's work to the landfill.

But reprints were impossible because the maps were printed in non-photographic blue. Higbee was even offered \$400 for one of his last maps. And state agencies were forced to keep their copies under lock and key.

Then, at the age of 91, Howard Higbee's dream came true. Computers made it possible to reprint the map.

Then the STREAM & LAKE MAP OF NEW YORK was created.




