



The weather isn't the only thing getting hot out on the diamonds of Shoshone Park for the Hertel North Park Youth Baseball League. They defeated the Orioles 13-6 on homeruns by Luke Applebaum and Rowan Root with help from Mateo Chimera and Cohen Springer. Then Saturday, Evan Brown got the winning hit, knocking in the go ahead

run in the bottom of the sixth for a come from behind victory over the A's, 8-7. In other games, Joe Cheman hit a grand slam homerun for the Tigers in the bottom of the sixth for a 14-13 victory over the Orioles.

In Second Minors, the Brewers are turning their season around with victories in three of their four games. Billy LaPorta, Nathan Mulligan and Gabe Koerner help lead the team to wins over the Pirates and Braves. Tommy Sheehan leads the Padres attack, however, and they won't go down without a fight. All four teams are very competitive.

Over on the softball side, the Reds are the class of Minor girls. Recently, they defeated the Orioles, Yankees and A's to remain undefeated. Olivia Foglia-Leffler tripled in the winning run in the bottom of the sixth with the bases loaded for a 4-3 victory over the A's. Kailin Lyle and Izzy Gardner lead the Yankees and first year player D'Aria Tyner got her first hit ever for the Orioles in a win over the Giants.

In Rookie girls, Madasyn Fonzi got her first hit of the season and came around to score for the Lil Devils and six year old Shamrock Peyton Gallivan made an unassisted triple play at shortstop in victories for both teams in two separate games.




dependable renewable energy through the biological process of anaerobic digestion at its farm-based digester in Pavilion, NY.






Joe Ryan, Former Rocket Columnist



Joseph E. Ryan, March 30, 1943 - June 11, 2016

Joseph E. Ryan, a former Buffalo city planning chief and veterans advocate who made an inspirational comeback from an accident that left him paralyzed, died June 11 in Hospice Buffalo Wells House, Beechwood Campus, Getzville. He was 73. Born in Buffalo, the eldest of 10 children, he was a 1961 graduate of St. Joseph's Collegiate Institute, where he was president of his graduating class and

an all-Catholic and all-Western New York football player. At Cornell University, where he earned a degree in industrial and labor relations, he captured all-Ivy League honors as a center and linebacker.

He served in the Navy from 1965 to 1969 and spent 17 months in Vietnam as a diving team commander, mainly in the Mekong Delta area. He earned the Bronze Star and rose to the rank of lieutenant.

Returning from service, Mr. Ryan was co-owner of Ryan's New Federal Pub at Elmwood Avenue and Cary Street and was working as an engineering consultant in 1971 when Mayor Frank Sedita named him executive director of his Citizens Advisory Committee. He held the post until 1975, helping to set up the community development block grant program and fostering the growth of nonprofit neighborhood groups.

Then, in August 1985,

while bicycling to train for a triathlon, he crashed into a barricade along the Buffalo waterfront and fractured his spine. He was paralyzed from the waist down.He spent nearly a year in rehabilitation.

He was a contributing political columnist for the Buffalo Rocket in the late 1970's and early 1980's.

Mayor Anthony Masiello appointed him as community development commissioner in 1998. During his 4½ years as the city's planning chief, he worked to develop a comprehensive plan to revitalize neighborhoods and create a citywide strategy to encourage business.

Mr. Ryan received numerous awards. Named a Buffalo News Citizen of the Year in 1986, He received the D'Youville College Community Service Award in 1986 and was given the Clarkson Center's Courage to Come Back Award in 1995.
