## Put Food Safety First on the Menu

No matter where you find yourself on the Fourth of July, you will probably see lots of food, beverages and grass-stained sneakers. Whether you're enjoying a barbecue in the great outdoors, traveling to see family or friends, or spending time at home, the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Food Safety Service is urging everyone to take extra food safety precautions when planning their

Keep food out of the Danger Zone. The Danger Zone is the temperature range between 40°F and 140°F in which foodborne bacteria can grow rapidly to dangerous levels that can cause illness. Leaving perishables out too long in the Danger

Zone is one of the most common mistakes people make, especially during warmer months. Without refrigeration or a heat source, perishables should not be left out more than two hours if the temperature is at or above 90° F.

If you are not sure how long food has been sitting out, throw it out immedi-

Always keep cold food COLD, at or below 40°F, in coolers or in containers with a cold source such as ice or frozen gel packs.

Keep hot food HOT, at or above 140°F, on the grill or in insulated containers. If food needs to be reheated, reheat it to 165°F.

Divide large amounts of food into shallow containers for fast chilling and easier use.

Packing drinks in a separate cooler is strongly recommended, so the food cooler isn't opened frequently.

To ensure safety, leftovers must be put in shallow containers for quick cooling and refrigerated to 40°F or below within two hours.

Please remember the four easy food safety steps of Clean, Separate, Cook and Chill and have a food safe Fourth of July!







reunite pet with owner. Please keep the following tips in mind this holiday:

Even if the animal has microchip identification, place a collar with an ID tag on your pet. If a neighbor finds your animal, an ID collar that includes your phone number can lead to a faster reunion.

Don't take animals to fireworks displays...a startled animal may not only break free and run away, but may also bite. An animal confined to

a closed vehicle during these displays can experience an overwhelming stress level that can cause physical harm to the pet. Have someone at home with nervous pets during fireworks...if the animal is with someone he or she knows, the pet's stress level will be greatly reduced. Keep the volume on a television or radio turned up to block some of the noise.

If a pet manages to escape, visit the SPCA's Strav Animal Information page, which includes effective ways to find a lost pet, at YourSPCA.org.

Home is the safest place for pets, especially on extremely hot days, during festivals, and other crowded outdoor events. Your pet's body is closer to the asphalt and can heat up quickly. The hot payement can also burn unprotected, sensitive paw pads.

If you bring your dog to these events and realize it's becoming too overwhelming for him or her, DON'T KEEP YOUR DOG IN A TURNED-OFF CAR WITH NO CONDITIONING AIR FOR ANY AMOUNT OF **TIME!** The effects of heatstroke on even slightly warm days begin within mere minutes.
